Health Care Climate Leadership Roundtable (HCWH), 3 December 2015, Paris

Health Care Without Harm (HCWH) is convening top health system officials from the US, Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America in a private, closed door small meeting to discuss strategies to accelerate carbon footprint reduction in the health care sector, scale up climate leadership and build collective impact.

Low-Carbon Health Care Conference, 4 December 2015, Paris

An all day event organized by Health Care Without Harm with the French Hospital Federation that will focus on examples of hospitals and health systems working to reduce their carbon footprint. We will also announce a set of climate commitments by participants in the 2020 Health Care Climate Challenge.

Health professionals in action for Healthy Energy and Climate (HEAL), 9:30 to 12:30, Friday 4 December 2015, Paris

To be held at the Conseil National de l'Ordre des Médecins (French Medical Association, CNOM). This event is being organised in cooperation with the CNOM, the World Medical Association (WMA) and the International Federation of Medical Students' Associations (IFMSA).

Global Health and Climate Summit (GHCA), Saturday 5 December 2015, Paris

A high-profile all day summit in the heart of Paris during COP21. Organized by the Global Climate and Health Alliance in conjunction with WHO. This builds on the Global Climate and Health Alliance's previous successes having regularly hosted summits parallel to the climate negotiations in Durban, Lima and Warsaw and a series of other events. Speakers have included Ministers of Health, the US Surgeon General, the Editor-In-Chief of the Lancet, leading WHO officials, the Vice President of the World Bank and the Chief of Staff of the UNFCCC. CAHA is a founding member of the Global Climate and Health Alliance.

Present WHO Climate and Health Declaration at the Paris Climate Talks

The WHO launched an urgent call for action to protect health from climate change. The declaration aims to mobilize the health community to call for a strong and effective climate agreement that will protect health and save lives.
