How do I apply for the Defence Force?

You can apply online or ring 13 19 01. Visit the <u>Defence Recruitment Centre website</u> to find out if you are eligible to join and to access the six steps in the recruitment process. Each step has a video that explains what happens during the step. The six steps are:

- 1. Apply online
- 2. YOU Session
- 3. Assessment Session
- 4. Officer Selection
- 5. Fitness Test
- 6. Enlistment and Appointment.

Queensland University of Technology (QUT) information

2018 course booklets – These publications are now available on the <u>QUT website</u>. They include booklets for Business, Creative Industries, Education, Health, Law and Justice, and Science and Engineering. Other publications on the site include: Entry Pathways, Opportunities for International Baccalaureate students, Scholarships, A Quick Guide for Year 7-10 students, and the QUT Open Day program.

Assumed Knowledge – Most courses at QUT have <u>assumed knowledge</u> rather than subject prerequisites (B Education courses have prerequisite subjects). Students who do not meet the assumed knowledge requirements can gain entry to a course (if they also have a competitive OP or rank) but may find the course very difficult. Students in this situation are strongly encouraged to undertake <u>bridging courses</u> in the relevant subjects before they commence their studies at QUT.

QUT Entry Bonus Scheme – Under <u>this scheme</u> you can receive bonus ranks (not OPs) for successfully completing specific subjects. The specific subjects are Maths C, Languages other than English (LOTE), Engineering Technology (for entry to B Engineering) and university units.

QUT's OP Guarantee – Under <u>this scheme</u>, if you get an OP 1 – 5 (or a rank of 93 or better), you are guaranteed a place in courses where this scheme applies. To find out if your preferred course is included in the OP Guarantee, check the entry requirements in the course information section on the <u>QUT website</u>. Guaranteed entry is also offered to domestic students who complete an International Baccalaureate Diploma with a score of 33 or better. Bonus ranks you receive through the Entry Bonus Scheme count towards the OP/IB Guarantee. The OP Guarantee is only offered during the major QTAC offer round. You don't need to apply separately for the OP Guarantee, just complete your QTAC application on time.

Languages at QUT - You can incorporate language studies into many of the degrees at QUT as a minor (four subjects), second major (six subjects) or individual electives. Find out more about language courses at QUT.

Open Day updates – On the day, you will be able to talk to QUT graduates about their studies at QUT and what they are doing now in their careers. Download a full program and register to win a MacBook on the <u>Open Day website</u>.

QUT at career expos – Representatives from QUT will be at the <u>Brisbane Careers and Employment Expo</u> this Friday 2 and Saturday 3 June 2017. Employment

Accounting/Commerce/IT cadetships

Some organisations offer cadetships or traineeships for Year 12 students interested in accounting, commerce and information technology. Cadetships and traineeships usually involve work and study, so you can be earning an income and gaining practical experience while you complete your university course. Year 12 students interested in cadetships in 2018 should start looking for them early in the year. A useful resource is the Chis Guide lists organisations in each Australia and New Zealand Employment Guide 2017. This Guide lists organisations in each Australian state and the type of positions they may have (e.g. 'c' indicates the organisation may offer cadetships). You could also investigate the cadetship/trainee programs offered by organisations such as:

- Pricewaterhouse Coopers
- Prosperity Advisers Group
- Ernst and Young.

Other useful strategies to find cadetships include doing an Internet search for cadetships and traineeships and regularly reading the 'Careers' section in the *Courier Mail* on Saturdays.

Places to search for jobs

There are many places to look for a job. It is important to include many sources as part of your job search plan. The following are some of the sources you could use.

Job board websites – These feature jobs advertised by employers and employment agencies. They usually allow you to search for jobs by keyword, occupation, location or employment type (e.g. full-time, part-time, casual). On some of the sites you can create a profile and upload your resume so employers can contact you if they have a job that suits you. Some examples of job board websites are: <u>Job Active</u>, <u>Seek</u>, <u>Adzuna</u>, <u>Apprenticeship Central</u>, <u>Indeed</u>, and <u>Spot Jobs.com</u>.

Company and organisation websites - Companies, organisations and government departments often advertise vacancies on their websites. Look for the 'Careers' or 'About us" section on the homepage. A helpful website that lists large employers in Australia is <u>Job Adviser</u>.

LinkedIn - This has emerged as an important platform for finding job vacancies. Companies, organisations and government departments all advertise jobs on LinkedIn. If you create a career profile, <u>LinkedIn</u> will use information from your profile to show you jobs you may be interested in.

Networking – Have you heard the saying 'It's not what you know, it's who you know'? That's what networking is all about. There are formal networking events (e.g. Career and Employment expos) but you can also use your local and personal networks formed through school, community involvement, sport or hobbies. Let people in your network know you are looking for a job. They may know an employer who is looking for a worker. Visit the <u>Youth Central website</u> for more tips on networking.

Group Training Organisations - These employ apprentices and trainees and place them with 'host employers'. Visit the <u>Group Training Australia</u> website for more information about these organisations.

Newspapers - Daily, weekly, local, state and national newspapers usually have job advertisements on some days. The jobs are usually grouped by profession and industry but it pays to look through all sections as the job you want may be in a different section from the one you expect. The Saturday Courier Mail has a Jobs and Careers section.

Noticeboards - Noticeboards can be a source for local jobs, often based on a casual or part-time work arrangement. Keep an eye out for job vacancy notices in places like shop windows, shop counters, community noticeboards (often found at supermarkets, libraries and shopping centres), outside factory gates.

Should I get a part-time job while I'm still at school?

The <u>Grow Careers website</u> lists the advantages and disadvantages of having a part-time job while you are still at school. Basically, the advantages are earning money, experiencing the world of work, gaining work skills and learning about your work-related interests. The disadvantages are mostly about having less time for study and other activities. The site has tips for managing a part-time job and for getting a part-time job. It also has a list of employers who provide part-time work to students. This is a useful site for anyone who eventually wants to get a job, part-time or full-time.

Each year up to two Australian students are selected to complete a four-year undergraduate degree at Duke University or the University of North Carolina in the United States. The scholarship provides for full tuition fees, accommodation expenses and other costs associated with undertaking a degree abroad. Australian selections are organised through the University of New South Wales (UNSW). Applications for the 2018 scholarship are now open and will close on 1 December 2017. University of New South Wales (UNSW) Co-op Scholarship Program

The <u>UNSW Co-op Program</u> is more than a scholarship. It is a scholarship that incorporates industry experience, leadership and professional development, networking and mentoring. It is available for high achieving students studying in the fields of business, technology, engineering and science, and building and construction. The scholarship is worth \$18,200 per year for up to four or five years (depending on the course being studied). Applications for the 2018 program are now open and will close on 30 September 2017.

University of Queensland (UQ) Law LEAD Scholarship for disadvantaged students

Students from disadvantaged backgrounds or who have experienced disrupted schooling can apply for the <u>UQ TC Beirne School of Law Leadership</u>, <u>Excellence and Diversity (LEAD) Scholarship</u>. The scholarship is valued at \$7,000 per year for up to five years. In addition, recipients will be eligible for a support network through non-residential membership of a UQ College, a dedicated academic mentor, and priority access to internships and career planning assistance. They can also apply for the <u>UQ Special Admissions Scheme (SAS) for undergraduate law programs</u>. Applications open online on 3 August and will close on 8 September 2017.

YEAR 10 STUDENTS

TAFE Queensland SkillsTech Year 10 Trade Taster Program 2017

Students who are currently in Year 10 who enjoy practical work and using their hands? Are you considering a career in the trades?

Students can now apply for the Year 10 Trade Taster Program!

Cost:	This program is fully funded by the Queensland Government and is offered to students at no cost. This program <u>does not</u> use a students VETiS funding entitlement.
When:	The program will run one day per week for 9 weeks, in Term 3 2017.
Where:	Acacia Ridge Training Centre, 247 Bradman Street, Acacia Ridge Bracken Ridge Training Centre, 157 Norris Road, Bracken Ridge Alexandra Hills Training Centre, Windemere Road, Alexandra Hills

Who is eligible to undertake this program?

Students must be in Year 10 and be undertaking Maths and English at a Year 10 level.

How does it work?

• Students will attend one day per week.

- Students who do not yet hold a Construction Safety White Card will undertake this as part of the program. The cost of the White Card is also subsidised by the Queensland Government so is offered at no cost to students.
- Students who already hold a Construction Safety White Card will not be required to attend the White Card day. Students will be asked if they hold a White Card when enrolment offers are made.
- Students undertake training in occupational health and safety and 3 different trade areas.
- Students will complete individual competencies from various programs but **will not complete a full certificate** or obtain any QCE credits.
- It is a condition of enrolment into this program that students commit to attending all classes.

What trades are available to try?

Full details of the proposed programs available at each location, can be found by clicking on the hyperlinks below. Please note that these may change but are indicative of the trades available.

Places are limited so it is recommended that students have multiple preferences to avoid disappointment. When enrolment offers are made, if the student's first preference is unavailable, they will be contacted to request their other preferences. **There is no need for students to submit multiple applications with multiple preferences.**

Each group contains a maximum number of 14 students and minimum student numbers are required for groups to run.
