



2018 Tuition and Non-tuition (Boarding) Fees International Students

Application Fee:	\$300 per student (non-refundable) when Application for Enrolment is submitted.
Enrolment Deposit:	\$400 per student - paid on acceptance of enrolment as per PLC Standard Agreement

Semester Fees are issued twice per year and due dates for payments are:

Semester One 2018 due	Wednesday 30 November 2017
Semester Two 2018 due	Wednesday 31 May 2018

- Failure to pay semester fees by the above due dates will be in breach of the Enrolment Contract and Written Agreement.
- The tuition and non-tuition fees currently listed are reviewed annually and are subject to change.

Additional Non-Tuition for all Students – Day and Boarding

Student Overseas Health Cover OSHC

It is an Australian Government requirement that all students studying on a student visa are covered by Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). Day Students are required to organise their own OSHC. Boarding students are given the option of the College organising their OSHC through Bupa (www.bupa.com.au/students), or families can provide details to the College of their own private health cover.

Special Activities Courses and Excursions

Other charges may apply throughout the year for special activities, courses and excursions, although the College endeavours to keep these charges to a minimum.

Bus Transportation to and from School (Day students only)

If the student is a day student and elects to use the Bus Service for transportation to and from school, the following will be charged:

Per Child	\$355 per term, OR \$710 per semester
Per Family	\$540 per term OR \$1,080 per semester

Medical Expenses

Student health cover may not cover the full cost of doctors or specialist visits and does not cover medications and pharmaceutical costs. Minor medication expenses are added to the school accounts as required. However, families must pay major medical expenses direct to the health providers.

Personal Belongings

Vacation Transportation

All beginning and end of term transportation (including transportation to and from the College) is the responsibility of the parent outside of the school's designated **drop off** time to the International Airport at the end of each term.

Pocket Money \$30 per week

Parents are responsible to ensure that their child has enough pocket money for the term. Parents are encouraged, if possible, to open an Australian bank account, and provide their child with a debit card. It is recommended that students boarding allow approximately \$30 per week for extra expenses for personal items and activities.
