OUR PROJECT

We want to help demonstrate how to restore a wetland on Coromandel Peninsula by returning Waitekuri Wetlands/ Whangapoua to a healthy state!
Our aim is to demonstrate how to successfully turn wet areas of unproductive farmland into beautiful, functioning wetlands.

GOALS

We want to re-establish 13,600 square-metres of native wetland and riparian vegetation.

We want to provide a healthy habitat for native birds, fish, and insects.

We want to inspire other landowners to undertake similar work and restore the land to a rich and diverse native landscape.

WHY WETLANDS?

Wetlands serve a great function in a steep, high rainfall area like the Coromandel Peninsula.

These wetlands will be able to absorb water during high rainfall events, acting as a buffer that protects the surrounding land and harbour.

They will also hold back sediment from filling up the harbour, helping to keep kai moana, such as scallop beds, healthy.
