

DOC/NZMCA CAMPSITE PASS

Thank you for purchasing the Campsite Pass. Please read the following pages carefully – they explain how to use your pass correctly. These **Terms and Conditions** are valid between 1 July 2020 and 30 June 2021.

Where can I stay?

You can find a list of all the conservation campsites that are accessible by motor caravan in the NZMCA members' Travel Directory and Travel App. If you need more information, you can find it in DOC's *Conservation campsites* brochures or at www.doc.govt.nz/camping.

A list of excluded campsites (overleaf) shows campsites where the NZMCA pass is excluded between 20 December and the end of Waitangi weekend. If you stay in excluded campsites during this period, you'll have to pay the normal campsite fee. The list also includes campsites where the pass is excluded all year round.

What does my pass cover?

- ▶ The pass covers the number of people your motor caravan is designed to sleep. Anyone over that number will not be covered by the pass and will have to pay normal campsite fees.
- ▶ The longest you can stay at an individual campground is 14 days, followed by a minimum 7-day break before returning. If you want to stay for more than a fortnight continuously at a single campground, you'll have to pay normal rates from the 15th day onwards.
- ▶ The pass is only valid where the motor caravan is being used for sleeping accommodation.
- ▶ You can only use the pass for the motor caravan with the registration number that corresponds to your pass. You can't use a single pass on several different caravans.
- ▶ If you sell your motor home and purchase another, you can return your campsite pass to the NZMCA National Office. You'll be given a replacement pass at no extra cost.

Are there any extra fees I need to pay?

- ▶ The pass covers your normal campsite fees – you won't have to pay anything. Extra fees are charged by some campsites for additional services that are not included in your annual pass fee and you will have to pay them.
- ▶ A small number of campsites may charge a nominal fee for services such as rubbish removal.
- ▶ Powered campsites charge an additional fee for the use of power.
- ▶ There may be a nominal fee for the use of dump and water refilling stations.

What else do I need to know?

- ▶ The pass doesn't guarantee all-weather access to campsites.
- ▶ The pass isn't valid until it has been signed.
- ▶ You can't transfer the pass to anyone else and it's not refundable. If you lose the pass, contact the NZMCA National Office.
- ▶ NZMCA members can only receive a pass if they are the registered owner of the motor caravan for which the pass is issued.
- ▶ Most DOC campsites don't allow animals (eg pet dogs). Check the *Conservation campsites* brochure or the DOC website at www.doc.govt.nz/camping to find out information about individual campsites.

What do I need to do at the campsite?

- ▶ Arrive at the campsite with full water tanks and empty waste tanks.
- ▶ Have your DOC/NZMCA Campsite Pass with you – you'll need to show it if asked by a staff member.
- ▶ Register at each campsite. If there's no campsite warden/manager, fill in a DOC/NZMCA Campsite Pass self-registration form and drop it into the collection box.
- ▶ Follow all campsite rules, bylaws and regulations. Any complaints may result in your DOC/NZMCA Campsite Pass being terminated without a refund. If your pass is terminated, you won't be able to buy one in future years.
- ▶ Keep your waste in your tank. You can't dump waste at DOC campsites. The toilets are environmentally based and any cassette or tank waste (with or without chemicals) will disrupt the decomposing process and make the toilets smell.
- ▶ Ask permission if you're thinking of filling your freshwater tanks. Fresh water is either limited or metred at campgrounds, so it's important to only fill tanks with the approval of the warden/manager.
- ▶ Be considerate of others when using your generator. Unless otherwise stated, you can only use your generator between 8 am and 8 pm. The campsite warden/manager has the authority to limit generator use at any time.
- ▶ If you leave a booked campsite before the end of your booking, let the campsite warden/manager know.
- ▶ Passholders must comply with instructions from DOC staff and Conservation Campsite staff.

Excluded campsites

The DOC/NZMCA pass does not allow motor caravan access to any campsite that is classified by DOC as not suitable for motor caravans, for example, accessed by boat or on foot, or on roads that are unsuitable for motor caravans. These campsites are not shown in the listing below. See the DOC website at www.doc.govt.nz or *Conservation campsites* brochures.

These DOC campsites are excluded from the Pass all year.

** These DOC campsites are excluded from the Pass between 20 December 2020 and 8 February 2021.*

*** This campground is under private management. For the 2020/2021 season, campsite pass holders may stay for 28 days. The 14-consecutive-day limit applies (see Terms and Conditions). Availability is at the discretion of campground management – access for pass holders is not guaranteed. The campsite pass cannot be used between 20 December 2020 and 8 February 2021.*
