

## **COURSE IN RESTRICTED ELECTRICAL**

# **The completion of this course fulfils the qualification requirement for a restricted electrical work licence**

The course includes the following Nationally Recognised Units of Competency:

Apply Occupational Health and Safety regulations, codes and practices in the workplace  
(UEENEEE101A)

Disconnect - reconnect equipment connected to low voltage installation wiring  
(UEENEEP010A, UEENEEP012A, UEENEEP013A, UEENEEP014A, UEENEEP015A)

Locate and rectify faults in low voltage equipment using set procedures (UEENEEP016A,  
UEENEEP017A, UEENEEP018A, UEENEEP019A, UEENEEP020A)

Attach cords and plugs to electrical equipment for connection to a single phase 230 Volt  
supply (UEENEEP024A)

Attach cords, cables and plugs to electrical equipment for connection to 1000 Va.c. or  
1500 Vd.c. supply (UEENEEP025A)

**To be eligible for this course you need to hold a restricted electrical work training permit from the  
Electrical Safety Office.**

### **THE COURSE CONSISTS OF THREE PARTS:**

**PART 1 - CLASSROOM DELIVERY** - consists of in class training with a mixture of theory and practical exams. This varies depending on competencies required.

**PART 2 – ON-THE-JOB EXPERIENCE AND ASSESSMENT** - consists of on-the-job workplace experience. This includes demonstrating the competencies learned in class, while being observed by a qualified electrician or restricted electrical licence holder.

**PART 3 – FINAL ASSESSMENT** - Final Assessment – This involves you producing a video demonstrating your ability under supervision to carry out the competencies learned in class, as well as finalise all completion paperwork for licensing.

**COST: Dependent upon competencies required. See enrolment form for cost of each unit of competency.**

To complete this course, you need to apply to the Electrical Safety Office (ESO) for a “Restricted Electrical Work Licence/Permit (Other Than Apprentice)” (Form 21).
