Community Building Partnership Program
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>The program awards grants for community infrastructure projects that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes</li><li>• Promote community participation, inclusion and cohesion</li></ul>
<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Local councils (required to match funding in the form of cash)</li><li>• Incorporated not-for-profit organisations (not required to match funding but will be looked upon favourably)</li></ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>\$300,000 available to fund projects in each state electorate of NSW. (Whilst there is no upper grant limit, the average is usually around \$20,000)</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applications Open: 9am Monday 7 May 2018</li><li>• Applications Close: <b>5pm Friday 15 June 2018</b></li><li>• To be advised: Announcement of successful projects and advice to all applicants</li><li>• Projects to be completed by 31 March 2020</li></ul>

ClubGRANTS Category 3 Fund – Infrastructure Grants
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>To support the building, renovation and fit out of infrastructure to communities across NSW. Funding is available for sport and recreation, arts and cultural and emergency preparedness projects. Funding can be used toward the costs of construction, alteration, renovation, fit out of infrastructure and the purchase of mobile infrastructure in the across: Indoor organised sports centres, Leisure centres, Outdoor organised sport facilities, Recreation spaces, Large-scale purpose-built facilities and Water sports.</p>
<p><b>Who can apply? / Eligibility</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Location – built infrastructure based in NSW</li> <li>• Applicant – organisation with an ABN that is responsible for operating / maintaining the infrastructure</li> <li>• Benefit – accessible and available to the general public the majority of the time</li> <li>• Purpose – Infrastructure related to Arts &amp; Culture, Emergency Preparedness or Sport &amp; Recreation</li> <li>• Development status – works with Development Approval or written exemption</li> <li>• Financial contribution – local government applicants are required to match funding amount requested</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>Sport &amp; Recreation Projects - \$100,000 to \$300,000</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• February Round: 1 February – 19 February 2018</li> <li>• May Round: 1 May – 21 May 2018</li> <li>• <b>July Round: 2 July – 23 July 2018</b></li> <li>• <b>September Round: 3 September – 24 September 2018</b></li> <li>• <b>October Round: 2 October – 22 October 2018</b></li> </ul>

<b>Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund</b>
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>To ensure funding is allocated to those sporting facilities that deliver the best outcomes for the communities they support.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Increase the number and type of sport facilities</li><li>• Improve the standard of existing sport facilities</li><li>• Increase participation in sport</li></ul>
<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <p>Funding is available for projects in all Greater Sydney local government areas, from eligible applicants:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 33 local government authorities in Greater Sydney</li><li>• NSW state sporting organisations or the National sporting organisation where the state body is part of a unitary governance model</li><li>• Incorporated, community-based, not-for-profit sporting organisations and organisations providing sport and recreation programs that benefit the community, such as PCYCs, YMCA and YWCA</li><li>• Educational organisations (such as schools, TAFEs and universities) in conjunction with local councils and local or state sporting entities</li><li>• Private enterprises.</li></ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>An allocation of \$100 million is available over three years for sport facility projects. Funding for individual projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• up to \$5 million for sport facility projects.</li><li>• For projects more than \$1 million a 25 % co-contribution of the grant amount requested will be required.</li></ul>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The first round of the fund will open 1 June 2018.</li><li>• The Expressions of Interest can be submitted over a three month period.</li><li>• Expressions of Interest for the first round will close on 31 August 2018.</li></ul>

Stronger Country Communities Fund
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>To invest in infrastructure projects in regional NSW communities to improve the lives of residents and enhance the attractiveness of these areas as vibrant places to live and work.</p>
<p><b>Who can apply</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applications can only be submitted by Councils in regional NSW.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>A total of \$200 million available for community amenity and local sports projects, with \$100 million specifically allocated to sporting infrastructure. There is a minimum grant amount of \$50,000. For those over \$1 million the applicant must include a minimum financial co-contribution of at least 25 per cent.</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applications close 4 May 2018</li> </ul>

Regional Sports Infrastructure Fund
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Increase number / type of regional sporting facilities</li> <li>Improve standard of existing regional sporting facilities</li> <li>Increase participation opportunities in sport</li> </ul>
<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local government authorities</li> <li>State Sporting Organisations</li> <li>Incorporated, community based and not-for-profit sporting organisations (clubs or district associations)</li> <li>Educational organisations (ie schools, TAFEs and universities) in conjunction with local councils and local or state sporting entities</li> <li>Private enterprises</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>Targets investment between \$1 million and \$10 million for regional sports hubs or regionally significant sport facilities.</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applications open 15 March 2018</li> <li>Applications close 4 May 2018</li> </ul>

<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>To increase tourist visitation by investing in regional environment and tourism infrastructure, particularly focusing on assets that will grow and further diversify NSW regional economies.</p>
<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Local and state government agencies</li> <li>• Aboriginal Land Councils and other Aboriginal groups</li> <li>• Community groups registered as incorporated associations</li> <li>• Non-government organisations.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>\$500,000+ (with a pool of \$100 million available)</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <p><b>No dates available for 2018.</b> However, as a guide, EOI closed on 20 April in 2017.</p>

Stronger Communities Programme
<p><b>Purpose</b></p> <p>To fund small capital projects that deliver social benefits across Australia</p>
<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <p>Applicants need to be invited to apply by their local Federal Member of Parliament, have an ABN and be one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Local government agency or body</li> <li>• A not-for-profit organisation that is a legal entity</li> <li>• A trustee on behalf of a property trust with responsibility for a community asset</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>\$2,000 to \$20,000 (with \$150,000 allocated per electorate in Australia and up to 50% of eligible project costs).</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <p><b>No dates available for 2018.</b> However, as a guide, applications opened 7 August and closed 12 October in 2017.</p>

<b>Community Development Grants Programme</b>
<b>Purpose</b> To support needed infrastructure that promotes stable, secure and viable local and regional economies.
<b>Who can apply?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The Community Development Grants Programme is not a competitive grants programme. Only projects identified by the Australian Government will be considered for funding under the Community Development Grants Programme. ie. Australian Government selects projects to be invited to submit a request for information.</li><li>• General applications by organisations for projects not identified by the Australian Government will not be accepted by the Department.</li><li>• Funding proponents must be a legal entity and have an Australian Business Number (ABN) or an Australian Company Number (ACN) to receive funding under the programme.</li></ul>
<b>How much?</b> \$2,000 to \$35 million (includes multiple year projects – must be scheduled for completion before 30 June 2020).
<b>When is it open?</b> Ongoing

<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Incorporated, not-for-profit grassroots sports clubs in NSW</li> <li>• Applications from licenced clubs may be considered providing the project benefits the sport and not the licenced premises</li> <li>• Sports clubs associated with a school, church or university providing they are an incorporated not for profit club in their own right</li> </ul>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• \$50,000 allocated for projects within each NSW electorate, with set limits for each project type;</li> <li>• Sport development \$2,000</li> <li>• Community Sports Events \$5,000</li> <li>• Sport Access \$5,000</li> <li>• Facility Development \$20,000</li> </ul>

<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <p>NSW state sporting organisations (SSOs) and state sporting organisations with a disability (SSOD)</p>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>\$5,000 - \$50,000. Applicant must also contribute to the project ie. financial, voluntary labour, donated material / equipment etc</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <p><b>No dates available for 2018.</b> However, as a guide, applications opened 4 September and closed 6 October in 2017.</p>

<p><b>Who can apply?</b></p> <p>Community development and support projects not specifically listed under Category 1 (ie. Community Welfare / Social Services, Community Development, Community Health Services, Employment assistance)</p> <p>For activities that relate to a club's core activities eg. Junior / grassroots sport</p>
<p><b>How much?</b></p> <p>There is no standard limit on the amounts that clubs may provide. It is advised that applicants contact their local clubs and consider the amount of funding available in their area.</p>
<p><b>When is it open?</b></p> <p><b>Ongoing</b></p>

<p><b>Who can apply? / Eligibility</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Young people turning 12 to 18 years of age in the same calendar year as the nominated sporting championship</li> <li>• An Australian citizen or have been granted permanent resident status, residing in Australia</li> <li>• Be participating as an athlete, coach, umpire or referee in:</li> <li>• An official state championships endorsed by the relevant Australian Sports Commission (ASC) recognised national sporting organisation (NSO), or</li> <li>• An official state school sport championship endorsed by a School Sport Australia member body, or</li> <li>• An official national championships endorsed by the relevant ASC recognised NSO, or</li> <li>• A national school sport championships endorsed by School Sport Australia, or</li> <li>• An international competition as a member of an official Australian team, endorsed by an ASC recognised NSO or School Sport Australia</li> <li>• Be living more than 125km from the championship venue, and travelling greater than 250km</li> </ul>
