

A MESSAGE FROM OUR STAGE 4 CO-ORDINATOR

Have you ever been in a hopeless situation? Maybe you've had a severe injury or illness, a real struggle with friends or even the loss of a loved one?

What did you do in this hopeless situation? Who did you turn to for help?

Ruth from the Old Testament was in a seemingly hopeless situation. Her husband had died, she was left to care for her mother-in-law, and even meeting the basic necessities of life meant a daily struggle. However, in this seemingly hopeless situation Ruth didn't run away. She trusted God for provision and committed herself to care for her mother-in-law, Naomi.

One of the main difficulties for the two women was their lack of food. One day Ruth went into the fields of a man named Boaz in search for food. Boaz took compassion on Ruth, and he left some grain for her so that she could feed herself and her mother-in-law.

In Ruth 2:11-12, Boaz says these words to Ruth: "I've been told all about what you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband—how you left your father and mother and your homeland and came to live with a people you did not know before. May the Lord repay you for what you have done. May you be richly rewarded by the Lord, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge."

Not only did God save Naomi and Ruth from what seemed like a hopeless situation by providing a regular food source for them, but he also provided a future blessing through them. God used their tragic situation and turned it into something good... Ruth eventually married Boaz, and she bore a son. This son was named Obed, and he was to be the grandfather of King David. From the line of Ruth came Israel's great king, David, and also Jesus.

While this story is centred on the lives of Ruth, Naomi and Boaz, it is an excellent illustration of God's love for us. Boaz demonstrated compassion towards Ruth, and then by marrying her he redeems her honour, livelihood and life. This is just like Jesus redeeming us from our very hopeless situations.

The story of Ruth and Boaz offers many wonderful insights for us today. Among them is the idea that God works through those who have endured tragic situations so that the lives of many others might be changed and God's sovereign power might be seen. God is in control of everything that happens, even when we do not understand the situation.

How well are you doing with trusting in God and his sovereign power during difficult times? Do you turn to God for help? Do you take refuge in God? Or do you rely upon yourself?

ASANTE SANA (THANK YOU)-DRCONGO FUNDRAISER

This week students and teachers from Prep to Year 12 have prayed for the people of the Democratic Republic of Congo particularly in the eastern region of this vast country.

They have learnt a little more about the beauty of God's creation in this central area of Africa, along with the many long-term sufferings of the Congolese population.

What many people don't realise is that the global economy, particularly the world's electronic industry (including mobile phones ϑ laptops), drives the great demand for certain minerals, and this demand comes at the great sacrifice of the people in Eastern DRCongo.

Eastern Congo has many minerals used in the world's electronic goods.

However, instead of benefiting from this natural wealth, most of the 80 million Congolese people are very, very poor.

The enormous demand for these minerals has resulted in many corrupt practices, and an unimaginable amount of violence. Large numbers of Congolese (around 3.7 million people) have been displaced; many of these displaced people are hosted by already poor families.

Alongside these terrible statistics is another one. There are over 4 million orphans in DRCongo.

On Wednesday this week, well over \$2,000 was raised through a mufti day and a lunchtime sausage sizzle. (Some donations are still coming in.)

This money will be sent to Anglican Bishop Isesomo in Butembo to help with school fees for orphans and displaced children in the very troubled diocese of North Kivu.

Thank you so much to everyone who has contributed to this day. There are far too many to be named!
