The FIRST LEGO League

The FIRST LEGO League (FLL) is an international science and robotics competition for young people, designed to inspire a love of learning and thinking. Teams of children aged 9-16 will be challenged to build autonomous robots from LEGO MINDSTORMS technology, invent solutions to real-world problems, and learn to work in a team - and have a lot of fun in the process! Each year, the competition culminates in a series of tournaments where teams and their robots go head-to-head in a celebration of everything achieved during the season. The best teams are selected to proceed to National and International levels of competition.

The 2015 task will be given in August, with a Regional Tournament being held in Wollongong in November. The Australia National Tournament will be held in December at Macquarie University in Sydney. You can find out more about the FLL at www. firstlegoleague.org.
