President's Report

It is with much pleasure that I present my sixth Annual Report for Wanda's 67th year of lifesaving service to the community. The members of Wanda should feel very proud of our achievements both in lifesaving and competition; it has been a very successful twelve months.

Wanda can also proudly boast NO LIVES LOST during our patrol hours as defined by our Club Patrol Agreements. This season our first day on patrol was on the 22nd of September 2012 and we finished on the 28th of April 2013. Our active members carried out a total of 8,133.25 voluntary hours on the beach with 521 preventative actions, 45 rescues, 22 first aid cases and our beach was closed on 11 occasions. Our members can be very proud of their Vigilance and Service they provide for the beach going public.

Our Club Captain Ben Harris again has done a wonderful job steering our lifesaving in the right direction and improving our standards. Unfortunately the elected Director of Lifesaving Luke Ashford had to step down from this role part way through the season because of work commitments. In the second part of the season Ben was very ably helped by our new Director of Lifesaving, Matt Waugh. It is very pleasing to see some of our younger members taking up the important Director roles; it will ensure that our Club is in good hands for many years to come. It was excellent to see the return of the competition for the best Patrol of the Season; this was an initiative of Matt's. This season's winner was Patrol 1 with Graham Hill as Captain.

My thanks also to Sam Axiotis, our IRB Captain, Steve Stavrou and Bob "Smokey" Cane who are Sam's right hand men. The IRB section is incredibly important, our Patrols cannot take place without them, and our competitors cannot compete without them. It is a massive job fulfilling these obligations,

keeping the equipment operational as well and ensuring that we are continually training more drivers and crew people. The members of this section have done a remarkable job.

Thank you to the Patrol Captains and Vice – Captains for your vigilance and service this season ensuring our beach is in safe hands.

I wish to express my gratitude to the Directors, for the countless hours that you spend on your sections ensuring the best outcomes and achievements for our members and Club. Some of the Directors did not have the benefit of the support of sub-committees, as these positions were vacant. I encourage you all to give some thought to getting on board and filling these positions for the coming season.

The C.V. Forshaw Trophy, which is presented to the "Most Consistent Member", is voted by secret ballot over the last twelve months by the Directors at the monthly meetings. This year's recipient is Mark "Sarge" Sargeant. This is Sarge's third year on the Board of Directors and it is the second time he has received this highly regarded award. Receiving this award is a reflection of the high esteem that Sarge is held by the Board of the Directors for his innumerable hours he has given in his role as the Director of facilities. Thank you Sarge!

With the Club house roof coming off in a major storm that hit Sydney on the 23rd of February 2013, the decision was made with the endorsement of our members at a special general meeting to proceed with the Stage 2 building works. The Building committee will be led by Sarge with the following members ably assisting, David Gittus, Trevor Elliot, Gary Bradshaw, Brett Furniss, Mitchell Pryke, Dean McMahon and Sean O'Donoghue. There is a lot of hard work to be done, but it is an exciting future for our members with these works to upgrade the Clubhouse and facilities.

Brett Furniss continues to do a wonderful job as the Director of Education; this is one of the most important areas of our Club. His work means that our active members are proficient

in their awards, new members are able to take their place on the beach in patrols and there are award pathways for our members to have the opportunity to undertake.

I would like to congratulate Life Members Greg Allum OAM for receiving his Award of Grand Knight from the International Lifesaving Federation, this is the highest award that can be bestowed on a member, and Ernest "Solly" Stephens OAM for receiving the "Citation of Merit" from the International Lifesaving Federation.

My gratitude also to the Director of Competition, Chris Fox and a very hard working committee and coaches. Again they have had an outstanding year of results, 7 members chosen for the Sydney Branch Team, 7 members chosen for the NSW High Performance Squad, 4 members chosen for the NSW Representative Team, 2 members chosen to Represent two other States and 3 members chosen for the Australian High Performance Team.

At the NSW Pool Championships held at Woy Woy, Wanda placed 2nd with 23 gold medals, 17 silver medals and 15 bronze medals. The Australian Pool Championships were held in Adelaide, Wanda placed 3rd with 8 gold medals, 10 silver medals and 14 bronze medals.

The major win for the season was Wanda's Under 20 year team that competed in Adelaide last November. This team won the pool rescue competition, and then went on to win the beach competition, taking out the overall point score. Such a fantastic result with every member of the team coming home with a

World medal! This team have been recognised by winning this year's Sydney Branch Awards of Excellence for Best Team and their part in helping the Club to win the Best Club in the Leader Sports Star of the Year, this award also included our win at the State Titles last year and winning the Australian Pool Rescue Championships last year.

The State titles were held at Ocean Beach – Umina, Wanda finished a close 4th Place with our competitors winning 8 gold medals, 4 silver medals and 18 bronze medals. This was followed up by the Australian titles being held at North Kirra Beach in Queensland, where Wanda finished in 10th place. Our gold medal winners were the

Wanda also won 7 Silver medals and 2 Bronze medals.

Like high-tide will surely follow low-tide our seasons at Wanda follow a similar pattern year-to-year which has an inevitability that is undeterred. So here we are looking at the season that was and at the season that will be.

From a personal perspective this season was without doubt the most challenging season I have ever experienced within the Surf Lifesaving movement. This was largely due to various unforeseen issues that arose throughout the year. It felt as though we struggled to gain traction and meet the potential we exhibited at the end of season 2011 / 2012. This aside we did manage to finish fourth in the NSW Open Surf Lifesaving Championships, fifth in the NSW Age Championships and tenth at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships which are very solid results from the competition section of our Club. Our patrolling members showed unwavering dedication to our week to week duties on the beach. All of these positive results however were eclipsed by a groundswell of optimism that has been generated by the younger members who are moving through the ranks of our Surf Club. I like to think of them as "Generation Next".

We have had another good year on the beach made possible by the skills and leadership of our Patrol Captains, backed up by unwavering support from our patrol members. Over the latter half of the season, I had the pleasure of getting to know you all better through the patrol competition, and I was pleased to see so many patrols up to a high standard.

The Champion Patrol for the '12-'13 season is Patrol 1. During their scenario, they showed good organisation and an ability to make quick decisions. Time is another huge factor in any rescue, and they showed a real sense of urgency to get the job done.

We did not have too many issues getting numbers down onto patrols this season,

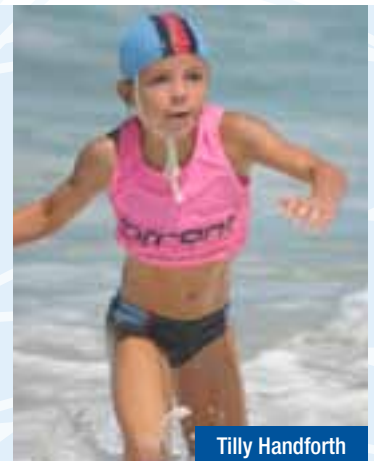

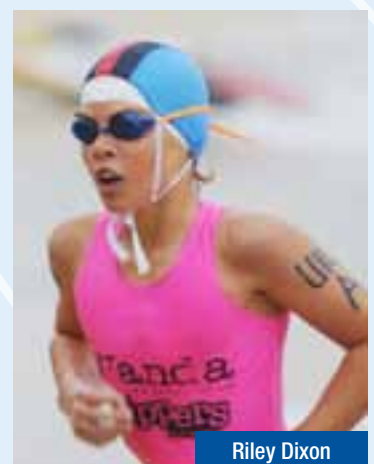

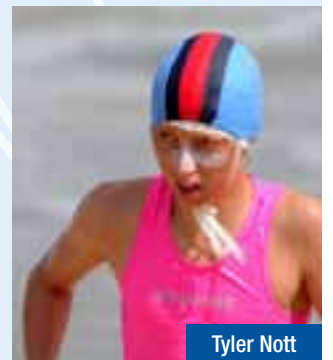

Beach Captain's Report

With only a small squad of fully committed beachies, we definitely punched above our weight in most carnivals and have laid a solid platform in which to build upon in the coming years. This was none more evident than at the State Titles during the 2km races. Wanda had an army of competitors and supporters and was by far the most represented Club that day. Results included 3 girls in the top 6 in the 17's (Emily Rohr 2nd, Beth Mayo 5th, Laine Palmer 6th), Gold and Bronze in the 19's Mens (Ali Najem and Matt Peterie), Bronze in the 19's Womens (Tahlia Patterson), 6th in the 15's Boys (Josh Fernandes – still 13) as well as 3 competitors in the top 10 of the Open Mens (Ali Najem 1st, Mitch Palmer 4th, Matt Peterie 7th). Even more pleasing were the number of supporters who drove up a day early to watch as well as the water competitors who all stuck around after their events. Special mention to Dearne Cooper (3rd at world titles this season) who would have been a favourite to win her event but couldn't compete due to a technicality - and still came to support her team mates.

Although Aussies was much later this season, this duly rewarded those competitors who were consistent in their training all season. Peter Axiotis found it hard at the early carnivals against U17 competitors who were fully grown men. To his credit, Peter showed up at every session, as the only runner in his age group, did the little things right and peaked right at Aussies making the semis of the sprint. Next year in the same age group, training with some new recruits and increasing his weight from 43kg, I am sure Peter will make the transition from Young Pup to Big Dog a permanent move!

Mateship Trek 2013

Black Cat Track -Wau to Salamau

The Mateship Trek was the “brain child” of Politicians, Scott Morrison (Member for Cook) and Jason Clare (Member for Blaxland) and began in 2009 when they picked young Australians from their Electorates to walk the Kokoda Track (including one of our own Matty Read).



Since 2009, Scott and Jason have retraced the path taken by P.O.W's along the Sandakan Death March and this year Emma Cullen, myself and several other young Aussies were given the rare opportunity to walk the Black Cat Track with them, in Papua New Guinea. It was great being able to walk this track with Emma, who I've known for many years. Emma was one of my first Patrol Captain and was a great ambassador of the Shire and Surf Club. On the track she lead from the front (while I dawdled at the back), and was forever talking about her “gorgeous” patrol. This particular track is situated on the eastern side of the island. Beginning at Wau we walked a track that at times was indiscernible, obscured by jungle, that snaked along ridge lines, rose over mountains and ducked into valleys before finally reaching our destination of Salamau on the east coast, eight days later. The terrain was constantly changing from open rises along hills of Kunai grass to passages of track. Some of the fiercest fighting against

the Japanese took place around and along the Black Cat Track with over seven hundred Australian Soldiers losing their lives, even more than at Kokoda.

This year marked the 70th anniversary of the battles that took place on the Black Cat Track and Scott and Jason were eager to raise awareness about the untold stories of sacrifice that took place along this dangerous track, bringing together “Aussies” from different backgrounds and beliefs. The “motley crew” consisted of four students from the Shire, six students from the Blaxland Electorate, two Australian Soldiers and an Army Officer based in PNG, a School Principal, Politicians Scott Morrison and Jason Clare as well as his secretary, Deborah (who kept me from wandering at the Airports), the grandson of a campaigner who fought on the track, and finally our Army Medic, Alex. Learning about some of the different cultures, beliefs and experiences of those on the Trek was an awesome and eye

opening experience. It was also amusing to hear some of the perceptions the trekkers from the Blaxland had of us “hobbits” from the Shire. I found myself saying things like:

“No, we don't all wear board shorts wherever we go” (I might be an exception)

“Yes, we do say yiewwwww in every sentence” (maybe a slight exaggeration)

We were also incredibly privileged to be accompanied by two remarkable men, Australian Soldiers who have toured Afghanistan multiple times who continue to carry on the legacy of Diggers past. They were generous enough to share some of their experiences from war and it gave me an even greater appreciation for those who fight overseas.

Nineteen Australians walking through the jungles of Papua New Guinea sounded to me like a massive liability and an accident waiting to happen, particularly as I struggle

to navigate through the coastal track in the Royal National Park (and that one is clearly marked out). So we were accompanied by a large number of amazing local men and women known as the “Fuzzy Wuzzy Angels” or ‘Legends’. Most walked the track barefoot or in thongs while carrying our food and camping supplies. These “Legends” along with the two Aussies Soldiers, were the only reasons many of us made it to the end of the



track. In my case they also made sure that I stuck with the group and didn't wander off to check out that "bird" or "thing" that was out in the dense jungle surrounding our path.

Many of the engagements and conflicts that took place in the areas surrounding Wau and Salamau found our Australian Soldiers constantly outnumbered. This campaign gave rise to many Soldiers who exhibited great courage and leadership in the face of overwhelming and often superior Japanese numbers. Each member of the group was assigned a Soldier who had fought along the Black Cat Track and as we revisited battles sites we read out the biography of our assigned Digger. My Soldier went by the name of Leslie Allen "Bull", he fought in the Middle East and Ceylon (now known as Sri Lanka) before fighting in Papua New Guinea. Allen was awarded several medals for outstanding acts of bravery including carrying 12 American Soldiers to safety under heavy enemy fire at a place called Mount Tambu. However, he returned to Australia a different man and suffered psychologically.

The Soldier On Foundation was established to help Soldiers like Leslie Allen, who return from the war physically or psychologically injured. This was one of the foundations

that we raised money for prior to the commencement of our walk.

Our final day in Papua New Guinea began with the Dawn Service at the Commonwealth War Cemetery in Lae, which was an incredibly emotional experience. For eight days we had walked the Black Cat Track and had been given a glimpse into what our Diggers experienced fighting in the wild jungles of Papua New Guinea. We had seen the remnants of battles fought 70 years ago and it was an incredibly humbling experience to have a little more understanding about the Soldiers who sacrificed, of the terrain and condition they fought and died in. Their lives were cut short and so after learning about the battles, about the Soldier who lost their lives, we each made a promise to live a life worthy of their sacrifice.

This Trek was an amazing experience and I would like to thank Wanda Surf Lifesaving Club for giving me this amazing opportunity, to all the people who supported me financially or with an encouraging word.



I was given an insight into the conditions our Soldiers fought in and an opportunity to learn more about people from an eclectic group of cultures with different religions, values and struggles. I have come home with a bunch of new mates, a greater appreciation of my local bakery and the confectionary aisle, and also a deeper understanding of the sacrifice our Soldiers made. ANZAC day for me, will never be the same again as we remember past and present Diggers and what they do for this amazing Country.

Lest We Forget

The Mateship Trek- the Black Cat Trail 2013 was attended by Mitch Palmer and Emma Cullen.

On the 15th of April 11 young Aussies along with 2 Politicians, 3 Active Soldiers, a Photographer and a team of 3 Reporters, met at Sydney Airport before boarding a flight to Port Moresby. We were planning to walk the Black Cat Track together- a historically significant trail along which the bloodiest campaigns of Papua New Guinea in WW2 were fought by Australian Soldiers.

Mitch Palmer and myself were among the selected young Australians, with 2 others also from the Sutherland Shire, 6 others

from the Blaxland Electorate and 1 other from Brisbane.

Our Trek began in what we became familiar with as a typical new guinean fashion- a 3 hour ride in our open air truck style transport turned into a 7 hour ride- a road that was once sealed was no longer. We did arrive at the Village near the beginning of the trail in one piece, ready for our next big adjustment: pit toilets and going bush.

Over the following seven days we walked- typically being woken up at 5:45 each morning (if you managed to sleep through the morning rooster routine) for the morning scramble of getting ready, packing up your gear and eating breakfast.

The terrain changed everyday which is one

defining factor that separates the Black Cat Trail from Kokoda. The first day we walked up and down hills on a wide track with little cover- lurching under the only tree we could find. The third and most difficult day saw us navigating multiple land slips under the jungle canopy on a track about the width of 1 foot- with a serious drop off on one side of the track and the other side covered in stinging nettles. Ropes were rigged up by the Legends (Papua New Guinean Nationals accompanying us) when the track was too difficult on its own, and several times tree trunks and branches were used as a kind of bridge, held up by Legends, to cross land slips where only vertical shale remained. The final days saw us walking along rocky river beds and beaches- we got used to walking in wet boots and socks.

Each night consolidated the mateship between us all- with set discussion sessions or free time we spent with each other. One of the purposes of the Mateship Trek was to overcome differences between culturally different communities- with many misconceptions dispelled and curiosities satisfied during these sessions. Pat and Andy, the two Soldiers sent to accompany us by the Soldier On Organisation, shared their own personal stories with us in what was one of the most emotional parts of the trip, where

the significance of what those who have fought for our Country took on a whole new meaning for all of us.

Each night we stayed in a Village, with hospitality extended to us each night second to none. Ceremonies were performed, gifts of woven bags or fruit were given, and hours were spent playing with the Village children.

Mitch was in his element- with the most unbelievable engagement with the kids- bridging language barriers, and resulting

in hoards of children following him around during the evenings.

The Trek had an overwhelming finish, when we visited Lae War Cemetery where the Soldiers who passed on the Black Cat Trail were buried. We pledged to live a life worthy of their sacrifice, and spent some time in the cemetery to let the journey sink in.

We returned on Anzac Day for an especially significant Dawn Service, where Jason Clare and Scott Morrison both gave heart felt speeches.

Having come home and reflected on the whole trip I feel particularly privileged to have participated in this event. It was positively a life changing experience and the most physically and emotionally draining task I have ever put myself to. The Mateship Trek has given me a new appreciation of Anzac Day and the significance of what has been sacrificed to allow Australia to be the Nation it is today. I also have 10 new friends- with different backgrounds that I otherwise would never have bonded with and had something so significant to share with.

Jamie Walker was a larger than life character for almost 45 years around his beloved Wanda Surf Club.

Born in England, he came to Australia as a boy aged 4 and grew up in Arncliffe. He became involved in rugby league, going on to become a selector for the Cronulla Sharks junior representative team and junior Club, Cronulla Caringbah.

Jamie joined Wanda SLSC from Garie SLSC in 1968 and quickly showed his interest in members of all ages. He returned to England and spent time with other Surf Club mates there in the early 1970's before returning to row surf boats and became a valued crew member.

Finance Director's Report

The following Report details the consolidated financial activities of the Wanda Surf Life Saving Club, Junior Activities Group and Ladies Auxiliary.

The Club is reporting a surplus of \$429,000 for the year, representing the financial position of the Surf Club, Junior Activities Group and the Ladies Auxiliary. The significant income contributors to this result were rent received and the Brooks Caltex Sutherland to Surf Fun Run.

The Sutherland to Surf was again the flagship event for our Club, both for the community and financially. This is achieved through the volunteer efforts of the organisers, Mick Brannock, Anne Caterson, Sue Brannock and of course the work carried out by our members and the generous support from sponsors. It must be said that

with little opportunity to increase entry fees and running costs up by 29%, this event must grow to maintain its success.

Lifesaving, membership costs, equipment, presentations and carnivals were supported as core activities. The successful World Team separately raised substantial money and sponsorship towards costs of the team and tour.

The grant from the NSW Government of \$78,220 allowed the Club to refurbish and upgrade equipment storage, toilets and the kitchen to improve the Clubhouse.

The roof blowing off the Clubhouse was a major setback, rectified by the Council with a replacement roof and restoration of damage within their responsibility. The Club is pursuing insurance claims for damage and loss of income.

Thanks to our Auditor, Frank Larosa CA, for being able to meet the deadline for the

printing of the Annual Report, as well as his advice during the year.

With a reported Income of \$1,109,484 and the responsibilities of complying with Accounting Standards in Australia, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, and the Associations Incorporation Act NSW, the Club needs to maintain and implement strong internal control to satisfy these requirements.

Financially, Wanda will need to remain vigilant in the priority and nature of its expenditure and the continuing examination of our operations.

Thanks to Bob Dews for putting his hand up as Deputy and of course to Anne-Marie Berry (JAG) and Judy Hunter (Ladies Aux) as Treasurers of their respective sections.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Wanda Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated. is not a reporting entity because the Board of Directors is of the opinion that there are unlikely to exist users who are able to command the preparation of financial reports tailored to satisfy all of their information needs. Therefore this financial report is a "Special Purpose Financial Report" that has been prepared solely to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Board, the requirements of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and Associations Incorporation Act NSW 2009.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following accounting standards and significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous year unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Accounting Policies

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Costs are allocated on either a first-in-first-out (FIFO) or average cost basis.

Buildings, Plant, Furniture & Equipment

With the exception of any major additions to the building and to Club Wanda Plant Furniture & Fittings, all Surf Rescue and Competition Equipment, which can be classified as being of a capital nature, is written off as replacements in the year in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

The depreciation to the building is being depreciated on a straight line basis over a 40 year period. Any further additions will be adjusted in accordance with the base year which is 1 May 2007. Plant, Furniture & Equipment is written off on a straight line basis over 8 years.

Trade And Other Receivables

Recognition

Amounts owed are recognised and carried at original invoice amount less any allowance for uncollectable amounts.

An allowance for doubtful debts is made when there is objective evidence that the Association will not be able to collect the debts. Bad debts are written off when identified.

Trade And Other Payables

Recognition

Amounts owing are carried at their invoiced cost and represent a Liability for goods and services provided to the Association prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Association becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services.

Income Tax

No Income Tax is payable by the Association as Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 exempts Charitable Institutions from Income Tax.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and short-term deposits in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less.

Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured. The following specification criteria must also be met before revenue is recognised:

Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised when control has passed to the buyer.

Membership Fees

Revenue is recognised when a member is entitled to the benefits of belonging to the Association

Sponsorship & Grants

Unconditional sponsorship & grants are recorded as income when received. Grants received for specific projects are recognised as revenue upon receipt regardless of whether the expenditure has been incurred as long as there is no contractual right to return the monies received to the grantor.

Rendering of Services

Revenue from the providing of a service is recognised when the member or customer receives the service.

Interest & Rents

Control of the right to receive the payment.

Financial Liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities are recognised at amortised cost, comprising original debt less principal payments and amortisation.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and service tax, except:

- (i) where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. It is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of the expense.
- (ii) receivables and payables are shown inclusive of GST.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

In preparing this financial report, the committee was required to make estimates and assumptions. These estimates and assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis.


