I believe our standard of patrols again rose partly due to the hard work at the top, by our Club Captain Ken Smith & Lifesaving Director, John De Cean. I also deliberately spent time wherever possible with every patrol during this season, just sitting and watching the vibe in the tent or on our new patrol trailer (thanks Lloyds SUPA IGA Cronulla) was great. We were regularly inspected throughout the year and we encountered no major problems.

Remember, if you go for a surf you are still on patrol, enjoy patrol, have fun with your mates!!

Please consider gaining extra awards to spread the load within the patrols. It is imperative that our members continue to gain extra awards and learn new skills. We have to replace the older ones each year who retire, move etc. Why not do an award with one or two of your friends? It makes it more fun and you will push yourself to get there. It is often a thankless task, but through your efforts you are really shaping the future of our club. We all realise that we not only need to oversee the day to day operations of the club and its members and all its associated businesses, leases and sponsorships but we have to think ahead to secure the future of our club.

I will simply say thank you so much for all your efforts. It's a Board that is all working together for the betterment of the club. We sometimes disagree, but it is always positive!! So again thank you, I really enjoy working with you all.

I would like to thank Sutherland Shire Council, in particular Brett Richardson, Carl Vanzino and Bede Elphick and all the lifeguards for their support and their professionalism. Working together certainly makes our job easier.

It's not only the numbers but the enthusiasm and dedication of the coaches, trainers and competitors from Nippers through to our Masters. I have been told by several people high up in Branch and State that we, at Wanda, have one of the best training and coaching systems in place. I'm sure they are right - just look at one great statistic:

Wanda was the <u>only club</u> <u>in NSW</u> to be placed in the top 5 placegetters in Nippers, Seniors and Masters at the State Championships.

It says it all. Congratulations to Greg, all coaches, parents, competitors and supporters. A real team effort.

Whilst I applaud all our champions at Branch, State, National and World Championship level, all competitors whether they be Nippers, Youth, Seniors or Masters, all should be congratulated for their efforts. Next season we need to continue to grow and develop, so please put up your hand and help where required.

This year we instigated our first "One Club" carnival (see separate report). The idea was to have all the club



competing together from Nippers to Masters at the same time. This was a resounding success with over 30 clubs, nearly 1,000 competitors entered. This was the biggest carnival in Sydney Branch in years. Unfortunately the surf didn't help but again it was a real success, in very difficult conditions.

Thank you to our carnival committee. The result and numbers speaks for itself. To top it off we won the carnival! Thanks again to the sponsors of our carnival – Tradies, TJM Southside and Taper Logistics.

Another big occasion was our 70th Reunion (see separate report). Lots of time and effort went into it and it was a great success. It was fantastic to see so many people young and old turn up. Some of the stories of the old times were excellent. Some went a bit over time telling stories, but they were great memories. Thank you so much to the organising committee. You did us proud.

In April this year we had a Special General Meeting about the future use of our Founders Room. The decision to try and find someone to come and take over the running of this area of our club was one which was not taken lightly. Our Board of Directors believe that we are not utilizing the full potential of this amazing space. Further, that running this area detracts or prevents us concentrating on our core objective - to protect the beach.

As you know we received an overwhelming majority to proceed with the negotiations to lease out the operations for this section of the club. I am fully aware that change and this

decision is difficult and confronting to many people, but it is the Board of Directors' opinion that we have to change to secure the future of our club. The majority agree but we are very aware that change is difficult and we fully respect your opinions.

Thank you again to this committee spear headed by our Facilities Director, Paul Auglys. This has taken an enormous amount of effort and time and I honestly believe without Paul's experience, knowledge, connections and drive this would not have reached where we are at, so thank you. The committee comprises of Paul Auglys, Nathan Spinner, Sam Axiotis, Anne Caterson and myself. Also thank you to Brian Mayoh and Tracy Lenton for their valuable support. We still have a way to go. At the time of writing this report we are still negotiating with several parties. You will all be kept informed of the progress of this.

Thank you to Sutherland Shire
Council and staff, in particular the
Mayor, Carmelo Pesce, and General
Manager, Scott Phillips for their
contribution to the urgent and
unexpected replacement of the upper
level windows which was required to
the southern end of our clubhouse.
Without their help this work could not
have been done.

These repairs have highlighted the ongoing expenditure which is required to be spent on our clubhouse. Because of its location, the maintenance required to all areas, new and old is becoming urgent. These works are extremely expensive.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The club membership dropped from 585 to 557 this season but the JAG was healthy with 423 nippers and 238 Parent General members.

The Patrol roster showed 182 active, 20 cadet, 4 reserve active, 2 long service and a life member being asked to provide 9,912 hours of work on the beach. The season was a long 7 months from September to April with 70 days patrol including 8 public holidays.

The statistics show over 41,000 beach goers, 84 rescues, 102 first aids, 712 preventions and NO LIVES LOST.

We welcomed 24 new SRC members who obtained their award in their last year of nippers.

A big thank you to all patrolling members who spent 8,910 hours on the beach volunteering their valuable time to keep beach goers safe at our beach.

On a sour note NO SHOWS continue to be over 30% of all hours which puts undue stress on our patrol captains when they don't know how many members are going to show up. Make up patrol hours provided 1,802 hours well below the 3,142 hours of NO SHOWS.

Thanks again to all of our patrol captains, IRB drivers/crew and ARTC holders who are critical to each patrol meeting NSWSLS requirements. There were 8 members who gained 100% attendance and 9 members who patrolled over 75 hours, including 4 members who broke 100 hours.

On a personal note a big thanks to all of my nipper parents who made patrol 12 a success for the the second year running.

I appeal again to all patrolling members to seek training in advanced awards to give our patrols a greater depth of lifesaving skills. The key roles in which we are lacking are Silver Medallion Beach Management, IRB driver/crew, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and First Aid.

Congratulations to all competitors across all age groups who competed at all levels and particularly to our new State, Australian and World champions.

Thanks to the Board of Directors for their support and to Elizabeth Sargeant who again helped with her knowledge of all things SLS during the season.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

My first season as Director of Finance has been busy and although we are a surf lifesaving club we are a business. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the Directors, my Deputy Director Matt Peterie and members who have supported and assisted me during the season, in particular John Douglas, Ken Davidson and Brian Mayoh.

This season has been a busy season and work in progress to secure the future for our club. The Board made two important decisions to secure the future of our club. The first to investigate the leasing out of The Founders Room, this was taken to a Special General Meeting of the Members and the Members approved the Board to continue investigation. The second decision was to set up a sinking fund for future maintenance and repairs.

The Club is responsible for maintaining all tenanted areas of the building including The Founders Room, the importance of this fund became evident with two major items of maintenance during the year.

The first item being the replacement of the windows on the southern side of Fitness First – the total cost was \$80,000. We were very fortunate that Sutherland Council contributed 50% for this work and I will take this opportunity to thank the Council for their contribution to this work.



In April we were faced with a \$15,000 repair bill after water damage in the caretakers premises, we are investigating an insurance claim.

The Board continues to work on the budgets of all sections and I thank all the Directors for their assistance. I worked very closely with the Director of Surf Sports, Greg Pierce, and the surf sports expenses were well under budget due to Greg's hard work. A competition levy of \$80 was introduced this year, this assisted with funding the entries for carnivals – entries for The Aussies now cost \$95 a competitor.

Our tenants are paying rent in line with the current leases and our ANZ loan for the building works has reduced by \$204,396.43 to \$928,927.19.

The PAYCE Sutherland to Surf is still our major fundraiser and an iconic event for the Sutherland Shire. The entries were down a little for 2016 but we managed to hold our profit and there is continued expressions of interest from potential sponsors.

The Ladies Committee for their financial contribution to the Club

as well as their assistance at Club activities:

Gay Curtis who does a great job managing all of our sponsors. We are very appreciative of our sponsors' contribution to lifesaving;

Sharon Collier and Cara Woods who assist with the admin of the accounts for the Club and The Founders Room respectively;

Samantha Sharp (our bookkeeper) who has worked tirelessly to keep our MYOB accounts up to date and end of month reports ready for meetings; and Frank Larosa for his advice and work on the audit throughout the year.

Lastly I would like to thank my family, Dale, James and Emily for their continued support at home which allows me the time to volunteer at Wanda.

I would like to thank the entire Board of Directors as well as Sam Axiotis, Tracey Lentell and Brian Mayoh for their input, effort and ideas during this process and I looking forward to sharing the outcome with you soon.

Despite this distraction, bookings for functions and Sunday trade grew over the year and we will once again post a good profit. I would like to thank Cara Woods and the entire bar staff team for their ongoing hard work. The feedback we receive from our customers after each event on the quality of service, the venue and their overall experiences is fantastic and you should all be proud of your efforts.

Finally, with stage 2 building works now firmly behind us, our attention has turned to completing much needed essential repairs and maintenance to the Club. In January, with the kind support of Sutherland Council, we replaced the leaking windows of the Fitness First facade and also commissioned and received a dilapidation report to scope and prioritise the essential repairs and maintenance we need to complete over the next 3 years to ensure the building remains in good shape. Tender documentation for the highest priority work is currently being prepared and we expect works to commence later this year.








Another season has blown past in the blink of an eye. This season allowed me to see things from a different perspective. Having held many different roles on the committee over the years from BBQ Coordinator, Uniforms, Carnival Entries, Admin, Secretary and Team Manager it was with trepidation, following in lan's footsteps, that I agreed to take on the role of Chairperson. I'm sure you'll all agree "what a season it was".

Our achievements have been absolutely fantastic across many areas, including competition, lifesaving, fundraising and community events. This also includes all the voluntary hours that our committee and volunteers put in, from our week to week organisation, coaching, communication, admin, water safety and IRB's, age managers, uniforms, registrations, finance, carnivals, entries, officials, BBQs and fundraising. Thank you for investing your time and efforts; without you all we wouldn't have the solid foundation for our Nippers to achieve what they do.

This was the third year of our three-year plan. I'm pleased to say we achieved what we set out to do across lifesaving, our Sunday program and competition. Lifesaving and education has been a major focus, with us now engaging a sponsor in this area. We again achieved 100% success rate with our U14s gaining their SRC. The Assessor even commented on their level of knowledge. Lifesaving education is a permanent element in our weekly program across all age groups from our U6s to our U14s. Our U11s and U13s now also attend the development camps well prepared in this area. We are already discussing opportunities to further enhance this focus next season.

Our Surf Confidence program continues to be a crucial part of the

Wanda experience. Our Sunday program has undergone a renovation with a move away from the standard swim, board, sprints and flags. This season we have seen Age group programs and plans distributed weekly, as well as the inclusion of team days, mixed gender racing, lifesaving days, handicap races as well as visits to Kurnell. These are all activities that we will be continuing as we ensue we engage all Nippers each week.

Building on our sporting foundations has certainly seen countless achievements this season.

We have competed across many disciplines including pool rescue, surfboard riding, R&R, 1 and 2 km runs as well as beach, flags, swim and board. We were well represented in selective events including Henri's inclusion in the Junior Development Camp, six of our Nippers selected in the winning Sydney Interbranch team, as well as a full contingent of U11s and 13s attending the Branch Camps at Deer Park.

Across the Carnival season we have certainly excelled be it at the Cook Classic, 4 Ways, Branch, State or Aussies Youth Championships just to name a few. In true surf club tradition, these were contested in the extremes of a heat wave at Branch and a cyclone at Aussies. A definite highlight was our results at State. We were all very mindful that our strong competitive girls would not be there having graduated into the U15s this year. These 3 days of competition were a rollercoaster of emotions, wins and PBs, that ended in a succession of golds in the final hours, including the All Age Board Relay. This saw us not only achieve 2nd place, for the third vear a row, but we accumulated 201 points. Our plan set us a target of 200 points three years ago!



There were also achievements off the beach: we were congratulated by Branch for successfully implementing paperless registration, everyone got behind raising funds in our Shave a Coach for Frank, we won the inaugural 'Relay for Life' Nipper Challenge and took out all three Junior Athlete of the Year categories at the Sydney Branch Awards.

I must make mention of our graduating U14s; congratulations to you all, we wish each of you all the best in the U15s and in your future as lifesavers on our beaches. With your years of experience, we also encourage you to come back to assist us at any time.

Thank you to all our Sponsors and the priceless support you give to our nippers; ADA, Purnell, ANSTO, Music Bus, Elliot Tuthill, Jock Athletic, Tempus Wealth, Highland Property and Bailey Personnel.

Reflecting back, there was no need for me to be nervous taking on this new role, everyone has been very supportive. It also gives me the opportunity to be proudly associated to all 400 Wanda nippers. Thank you.

BEACH REPORT





Wanda's beachies had another successful season. In terms of carnival results, we were 3rd in the State and 5th across Australia for beach events. At the World titles held in Amsterdam in September 2016, we gained numerous medals amid some great individual and team performances.

For most surf clubs, choosing the Beach award is a relatively straightforward exercise. However, for Wanda this year, we've had to "overlook" Australian and World champions, such is the depth of talent at the club.

These are some fantastic results at the "big 3" carnivals of the 2016-17 season, Aussies, State and Branch however, as usual, they don't always convey the full picture. Some of the other highlights include:

 The support from other sections of the club to fill gaps (particularly

- beach relays) at all carnivals not just at Aussies, when many water events were cancelled
- The masters runners, who just never stop competing hard (and getting some great results)
- Ex-nippers rising through the ranks of the seniors
- Being able to field 2 very competitive open male beach relay sides (both clearly in the top 10 in the country)
- Our 2 km beach runners, who would have to be among (if not the) best in the country
- The hot field we managed to attract to the Wanda carnival, in particular the open male sprint (won by Dean Scarff from Collaroy)
- Our "Mr Dependable" Dean Reilly coming a very close 5th in the sprint at State and making the semis at Aussies

Our beach athletes' success didn't just happen by chance. They trained hard and had good support from their coaches, the club and families. So thank you one and all!

Over the next few years, we beachies

face a number of challenges. One is just to maintain (if not increase) our numbers. There are many carnival points and medals going begging because we can't field people (especially relay sides) across all events. Attrition rates for young beach competitors also tends to be higher-than-average due to school/education commitments and from other sports. (Unfortunately, the lure of the wave is less strong for runners). So if you have some friends who can run and like the feel of sand between their toes, please bring them on down!

Another (related) challenge is to continue to develop our coaching program(s). This is not to criticize our current coaches' technical or mentoring skills. It just reflects the need to get to some "critical mass" where it then becomes feasible to begin tailoring programs more specific to where athletes currently are at. One such example is our attempts to train with some other local clubs, especially if the added competition can push our own athletes to the next level.

2KM BEACH REPORT

What a great season.
Starting all the way back in May 2016 when our Worlds' team started preparing for the Word Titles in September 2016, all the way through to Aussies in early April 2017 and even some of our masters then carrying on to dominate the World Masters Games in Auckland in late April 2017.

In the 2km squad we don't separate age groups or the club, our masters train with our opens and all the way down to our under 8's in the nippers. Our athletes work exceptionally hard, support each other in training and racing, and have great fun doing it. Support comes in many ways, but when Holly De Young ran in her first ever carnival and had a tough run way back in the pack, Mitch Palmer, Lachy Crawford and World Champ, Mel Campbell, after finishing their race, ran back and ran her into the finish line. That to me sums up our team.

We had excellent growth in our squad with new members Holly, Jesse Phelps, Lauren McMahon, Britney Pierce, with the return of Mitch Brown, and even sprinters Greer Calabro, Meggsey Brannock and Jesse Thus who all had a crack in major competitions (making them automatic members).

So many great results. I just want to make special mention to our Worlds (Rescue 2016) competitors. The tough thing about Worlds is it makes your season run for a full year. The athletes have to train through the winter with limited surf lifesaving races leading in. Our runners Mel Campbell, Donna Cox, Dee McCarthy, Chloe Gentle, Ali Najem and John Woods trained for an uninterrupted 18 weeks after Aussies and were able to deliver when it really counted. For the 2km runners there's no Summer of Surf, Nutri Grain or pathway to an Australian Team. There's Australian Titles and World Titles, so we target those carnivals and want to recognise the great effort of those individuals that committed and succeeded. And from their hard work and dedication they deserved every bit of their success. It's tough to mention everyone, as it's clear we are the strongest 2km team in the country. Our results show this, and it is amazing we have such an abundance of talent in the one club. I enjoyed coaching you all and loved the spirit of the team. I have to mention Emily Rohr after having a poor season for her ability, pulled one out of the fire to again place 4th at Aussies, was a great comeback to form and has assured me she will do better than 4th next year.

I am really proud of our runners, for their commitment in training, racing, fundraising, patrolling and to finding a way. Five stories epitomize our team, and our girls this year really led the way.

- Chloe Gentle. I had been planning with Chloe for two things over the past two years, one to win youth World Title at age 15 (18 and under age group) and 2. To race both 17's and then back up afterwards and race Opens at State and The Aussies. Now unless you have done this race you won't realise how much it takes from you, in the big races you have to push so hard you either go dizzy, feel sick or both and sometimes pass out – ask Ali. So to back up as a 15 year-old girl, 20 minutes after a State or National final is a big question on your character. We trained for this and kept it pretty quiet. At no stage ever did Chloe question this or show any unwillingness. In the state titles she ran a great race to win U17's and then backed up to come 3rd in the Opens. At Aussies she did the same with a win in the U17's and then 7th place in Opens. In English Super league their man of the match is called "The Man of Steele" award, and that's what Chloe wins for this season.
- Mel Campbell at age 40 with 3 kids and a business, having already retired was convinced to come back by her coach and team-mates, and being inspired by Ali's open Gold at Aussies, Mel came back for World Titles. Having the best lead-in of uninterrupted training in her career and not missing a training session for 18 weeks straight she was able to win 2 golds in the masters and then back it up with the big one, the open World Title. Starting her career at age 30, having 3 babies along the way and finishing at age 40 with an Open competition career of 3 Branch Titles, 1 State title, 1 World title and an Aussie Silver medal in only 3 full seasons of competition. I'm biased, but that's a good career.
- The team member of the year is Dee McCarthy. She comes to every carnival, made the food at most of the fundraising events, did massive patrol hours, provides protein balls after training, is at every training session

and at over 50 continues to do PB's each year. Dee won her first ever World medal and first ever Australian medal with a brilliant, come from 4th place fight back, to get a great 3rd. Dee has even booked accommodation with Donna for Worlds in Adelaide and Aussies next year. Already Dee is asking to work on improving her soft sand running technique over the winter, now there's an attitude worth catching.

- Mitch Palmer's dedication, six days a week training towards the 2km this year really showed what is capable of. Gaining his first Aussie medal in running and so nearly running over the top of the 2nd place runner was a thrill, not only for me, but the entire club cheering him on, showed awesome team spirit and was one of the highlights of the year.
- Donna Cox and Greer Calabro, my Masters Trojans, enter every race, come to every training session and are as dedicated as any of my athletes. Greer's consistent swag of medals all season, including four golds at the World Masters Games and Donna's hanging on through injury to win her 18th Aussie Gold Medal (16 water ski Aussie titles) at Nationals makes these girls so inspiring.

Thanks to our team for such a great year, we had amazing results. We have some exciting new appointments for next year, after having a break after World's this season, Ali Najem is back and will be our 2km team Captain. And with the numbers getting pretty big and Don Hammond not offering much else we thought we'd make him Team manager, either that or most improved. Part of his role will be to check the sand consistency at each beach with a rating of grains per KG. Training has begun for next year, look out, the "big dogs" are coming.

The world's finest surf lifesavers competed in ocean and pool lifesaving events at the 2016 Lifesaving World Championships (LWC) held in Eindhoven and picturesque Noordwijk in The Netherlands. Wanda's team returned with a club record Seven World Champions.

With eight kids in tow the Masters competed first at the championships and set the tone for Wanda's success throughout the championships. Tait won the first medals with two bronze' in the 40-44 200m obstacle and 50m manikin tow smashing the Australian record along the way. From the pool to the beach the medals kept coming, gold in the 110 beach relay Greer, Mel and Lauren (Lauren now officially the best runner in her house with husband Zane Campbell on child minding duties). Silver went to Greer in the 30-34 sprint where she dominated the early rounds and had a very close finish behind Egyptian Open National team member. A late inclusion in the flags Greer wound back the years to claim Silver. Silver also went to Lauren in a solid 35-39 sprint with Meg hot on her heels to claim bronze. Meg later won silver in the Flags behind Coledale's Davina Strauss both coached in flags by Wanda champion Tyron Courtney. Donna added silver in the 50-54 2km with Dee claiming 4th. Meg combined with Dee and Donna to win a bronze in the 130 beach relay topping off a huge medal haul on day 1 of the beach events.

Jock was physically and mentally cooked from preparing for his own race, spending massive days on the beach for all the athletes over this period, his reward to years of dedication was gold in the 45-49 2km battling it out to the end. Jock wouldn't have it any other way "in life you don't get what you want, you get what you deserve, and that's what our athletes got".

As Jock finished his gold medal performance, Mel crossed the line to take her second gold 40-44 female 2km. Mel was a class above the rest in her race smashing the field to bits, only a few minutes later Tait crossed the line and claimed gold in the 40-44 male 2km to take Wanda's tally to five gold medals. Our lone water competitor also rounded off the medals with a silver in the 40-44 surf race.

Our masters are some of the most committed athletes you will find, from the food they eat, injury rehab, body maintenance, their commitment to racing and training, these masters are great role models for the younger club members and prove with kids, businesses, being older, there is no excuse for missing training and obtaining your goals.

Matt finished best from Wanda at 5th in the A final with Peter 7th. These boys combined in the open beach relay,

Jesse' blistering leg put us in front with the rest of the team clearing out to claim Gold, Wanda's first open beach relay gold at a World or Australian Championships. Matt's explosive changes were enormous and a feature of the team's success, he attacks the changes better than anyone we have seen. Adam and Clayton represented Wanda in the flags, swim final for Woodsy for the second successive Worlds and he later teamed with Matt to qualify for the board rescue final.

Youth - The youth division is for athletes 18 and younger and we had one brave soul in the end that committed to this journey at 14 years of age. I say brave because it's a big effort to go all the way to the Netherlands for a 6-8minute race to take on international athletes four years older whose ability you have no idea about. Well Chloe Gentle, who beats most adults in surf lifesaving, didn't disappoint, at the half way point of the race Chloe had decimated the field and despite another nose bleed with 500m to go was able to power home and win well. Chloe was fortunate to have the support of her coaches Jock and Mel, her training partners Ali, Luca,

Tara and Tom, her family, fan club of Cori and Roy Campbell, and of course Club Patron Solly Stephens. A magical performance from Chloe who has an extremely bright future ahead of her at Wanda SLSC.

The Wanda team worked hard to raise funds exploring new events with mixed success. The Beer, Wine & Pizza night was held with support from Crust, Moa Beer, DeBortoli Wine and Jock Athletic. "The Debrief" was another new event aimed at the younger members and attracted lifesavers from northside of the harbour and south as far as Wollongong.



















SUNDAY SURF RACE REPORT

DEVELOPMENT NETWORK PROGRAM AND BEACH TO BUSH PROGRAM

During late November last year, I was fortunate enough to be selected to participate on the Development Networking program and the Beach to Bush program run by Surf Life Saving New South Wales.

The DNP program is designed to bring young lifesavers from around the state together to discuss and resolve issues that our organisation faces going into the future. The weekend started off with lots of ice-breaker games as the 'networking' component of the weekend. We quickly became a tight knit group, sharing all our experiences and stories from our individual clubs. We were lucky enough to be have guest presentations from John Restuccia who spoke about the coastal drowning report for 2016, Suzanne Young (recognised in the top 100 of women of influence in Australia) who gave a motivational talk about how if you work hard, you can achieve anything and from Kane Hughes the North Cronulla member who recently achieved the monumental award of Australian Lifesaver of the year from which he gave advice about how to be a better patrol captain and how to make change within the organisation. Throughout the weekend, we were in groups which we were assigned a key issue that Surf lifesaving in general faces. Some of the issues included retaining members, encouraging the up skill of younger members and bridging the divide between competitors and no competitors within a club. On the final day we had the opportunity to present our issues and resolutions to the SLSNSW board of directors (David Murray - President,

Gilbert Olzomer and Phillipa Butt - Director of Finance) to share our opinions to hopefully bring change. This was an amazing experience being able to discuss key issues with leaders of our organisation. On the final day, we visited North Bondi SLSC to learn about how one of the busiest beaches in Australia functions effectively. This was an eye-opening experience for all, particularly those from country clubs. Overall, the DNP program was such an amazing experience getting to meet people from all around the state, learning about how they do things at their club and how I can improve myself as a person and Surf Lifesaver as a result.

Directly after the DNP program, I participated in the Beach to Bush program. The Beach to Bush program is run for 5 days a year across all country areas of NSW and uses volunteers like myself to go around to schools and teach kids about beach safety. My group of 3 (Kim Rayner – Director of Education North Coast Branch/Port Macquarie SLSC and Luke Blunn – Evans Head SLSC) were tasked to the Gloucester country region of NSW. We visited 7 public schools in Scone, Murrurundi, Tamworth, Barrington, Wallabadah and Gloucester reaching over 1000 school kids in under 5 days. Travelling 100's of kilometres every day between schools was certainly tiring but seeing the smiles on the young kids faces when they would dress up in the patrol uniform and pretend to paddle on the surf rescue board was well worth it. It was an amazing opportunity to see country NSW and learn about water safety for the local creeks and dams. This program, run every year, is extremely important to saving lives, as over 70% of people that drown on beaches in NSW travel over 50km to get to the beach. Most of these

kids have never heard of the red and yellow flags so these educational talks are extremely important in preventing further drownings along our beaches. The 5 days spent on Beach to Bush taught me a lot about how lucky we are here in Sydney having so many patrolled beaches and safe areas to swim

To conclude, these two programs that I have participated on have been influential to not only changing me as a surf life saver but also as a person. The experience I have been lucky enough to gain from these programs will be cherished forever. I am deeply thankful to SLSNSW and Wanda for always providing ongoing support. I encourage all members of Wanda to keep an eye out for programs run by Branch and State as they are all life changing experiences.

SURF RESCUES AND RECOGNITION

RESCUE 14/12/16 - FROM FACEBOOK POST FROM JOCK CAMPBELL OF JOCK ATHLETIC

Lifesaver Chris Iredale - a professional lifeguard who saved two kids' lives last week.

We were at the beach running training on Monday afternoon last week and the surf was quite rough. Two parents came running over asking if the lifeguards were still on late afternoon as there were two girls holding their hands up - stuck in a rip, getting pummelled.

Immediately I looked around, couldn't see any lifeguards as they had finished for the day and thought we'd have to attempt a rescue as we've done a few times at training. Thankfully, Chris came tearing down to the beach, calmly got his board out through the rip and to the fast going under girls.

Surf Sports was developed as a way to keep lifesavers fit enough to make rescues and test their skills under pressure. Chris just so happens to be an ex AUSTRALIAN Board Champ and has honed his skills from nippers all the way through to a senior citizen lifeguard. So, when I saw who it was paddling out I thought how thankful that those girls should be that Chris was still there and that honing his skills over the years in racing and training made such a rescue very comfortable for him.

Yes, it's his job, but such deeds need to be recognized. Our group gave him a round of applause afterwards. So, this is why I love surf sports so much, because those girls are healthy and happy today because of my sport,

because of Chris's skills and courage and I'm so proud to say he's from my Club. How many people can say that sport and athletes directly save lives. Well done Chris!

Kelly is not a strong swimmer so we realised fairly quickly we weren't making it straight back in to shore. We then made the decision to start heading out with the rip and back around.

While this was happening, your Lifesavers had noticed our situation and one of them, Jake, made his way out on a board. He brought Kelly back in to shore quickly and safely and turned what had the potential to be something serious into something minor.

I just wanted to say thanks on behalf of Kelly and myself for Jake's help, the other crew there on the day that noticed our situation and to the Wanda SLSC as a whole for keeping us and others safe in the water.





During 1942, Fred as an Apprentice, was transported into Combat Zone after only 6 weeks training with the Small Ships Section with many other Surf Club Members. During 1944 a Sydney Newspaper article referred to Fred as follows; 'youngest surfer in the State on active Service, was recently chased by sharks". At the time Fred was a member of North Cronulla Club and had met with other club members in the combat areas; Stan Payten, Norm Myers and Wally Poulton.

After the war these men & boys received no recognition for their Service. The Australian Government

finally granted Official Recognition during 2009. Since that time Fred has also been issued U.S. Army Awards & Decorations.

Small Ships Section were Inducted into the U.S. Army Transportation Corps Hall of Fame by BG Brian Layer, which is a highly distinguished Honour. Fred has also been awarded the Military Order of St Christopher in the Ancient division, by Transportation Corps Regimental Association.

2017 marked the 75th Anniversary of Small Ships Section and surviving Veterans' were enthusiastic about commemorating their Service and participating in the Sydney ANZAC Day Commemorative March. Fred was accompanied by descendants of other Veterans and the Banner Party which

consisted of Venturer's from Seaforth Sea Scouts.

It was Fred's wish that the Banner Party be complemented by a Member of Wanda Surf Club. Our Club Patron Ernest "Solly" Stephens, OAM was delighted to march alongside Fred proudly wearing Club Colours.

Fred was very proud of his association with Wanda Surf Club and was disappointed that circumstances prevented him from attending the 70th Reunion last year. Fred was pleased to come to the club after Anzac Day and meet the President and have a look at the club one last time. He also talked about how much he enjoyed his march on Anzac Day with Solly.
