From the Principal and Head of Marymount

Dear members of the Sacred Heart College community,

Year 6 & 7 meetings at SHC Middle

In recent weeks, Marymount families with learners in Years 6 and 7 received an invitation from Sacred Heart Middle School to attend an enrolment meeting on Wednesday 14 June as part of the transition process within the amalgamation. This invitation was extended to allow Marymount families to connect with staff and provide a forum for questions individual families may have.

One of the motivations behind these meetings has been the positive feedback in recent years from Marymount families regarding the Year 9 into Year 10 meetings at Sacred Heart Senior that commenced in 2015. These meetings initiate the transition process by way of conversation and familiarisation. Sacred Heart is a large College and has utilised these meetings to 'welcome' families from Marymount and to 'touch base' about the learning needs and dreams of each student entering the Senior School.

As enrolment from Marymount to SHC will automatically transfer at the end of 2017, these meetings are not compulsory and are not formal enrolment interviews. We remind families that it is not a requirement to attend a meeting, but an invitation to connect should you have questions or queries. These conversations will also assist the preparation for the Parent Forum detailed adjacent.

Leaders from both Marymount and Sacred Heart Middle will be involved in the various interviews being conducted – this is one of the many ways our colleges are “coming together” as we head towards amalgamation.

The next Parent Forum regarding the amalgamation is 7pm on Tuesday 6 June at Sacred Heart College Middle School. This will be an exciting opportunity to see some of the building plans for the new campus and you will hear about some of the “next steps” being taken as we journey to 2019. Joint College Board/Council and Leadership Meetings

Last term we commenced joint leadership team meetings across Sacred Heart Senior, Sacred Heart Middle and Marymount. Marymount is now represented on the Sacred Heart College Executive by the both of us. This week we have yet another poignant moment in time as the Marymount Board and Sacred Heart Council meet to discuss their hopes and concerns in regard to the amalgamation. These discussions will further enhance the amalgamation process and will better engage the generous and capable members of our community who volunteer their time and expertise to serve on such important entities.

Opening and Blessing of Brother Joseph McAteer Centre & Marist Mission March

Wednesday 17 May 2017 was a big day for Sacred Heart College. For the first time, the whole school gathered together on school grounds for the Opening and Blessing of the Br Joseph McAteer Centre. The Mass was celebrated by Most Reverend Archbishop Philip Wilson and Con-celebrated by Emeritus Archbishop Leonard Faulkner, Monsignor Ian Dempsey, Monsignor Rob Egar and Fr Peter Sheedy.

As well as the opening and blessing of our wonderful new learning and conference space, the inaugural inductees of the Sacred Heart College Hall of Honour were presented to our community. The Hall of Honour recognises the wide-range of achievements of our old collegians through multiple disciplines such as Religion; Academia; Law; Entertainment; Medicine; Business and Commerce; Politics; Armed Services; Sport and Contribution to community, and particularly outstanding service to the Sacred Heart community. The inaugural inductees, for the most part, reflect the achievements of old collegians in the first 80 years of the College’ history. Future inductions in the Hall of Honour will reflect the achievements of our more recent alumni, as the school transitioned into a co-educational College in the 1970’s.

Br Peter Carroll, Provincial of the Marist Province of Australia, spoke about Br Joseph's contribution to the College as Principal between 1916 and 1924 before Brother Jordan Redden unveiled the plaque that was blessed by His Grace, Archbishop Wilson.

It was the first time that all students from both campuses had gathered together on school grounds. They were joined by a number of distinguished guests and friends of the College. Following Mass, all students took part in the annual Marist Mission March from Sacred Heart Senior to Angus Neil Reserve at Seacliff. Each year we walk in solidarity with those in our global Marist community and raise funds which directly supports those who are marginalised through our Marist Immersion programs in India, Fiji and The Philippines.

The event also recognised 50 years of 'Marist' at our Mitchell Park campus, which was opened in 1967, and 120 years of Sacred Heart College.

Hall of Honour Inductees

Graham Spurling attended Sacred Heart from 1949-1953. Graham was recognised as a member of the Order of Australia through his contribution to the manufacturing industry, having held a number of Executive and non-executive postings, both locally and abroad, including CEO of Mitsubishi Motors Australia.

The late **Bart Cummings** attended Sacred Heart from 1941-1942. The inaugural member of the Australian Racing Hall of Fame, Bart is the undisputed icon of the Australian Racing industry, the "Cup King" claiming 12 Melbourne Cups.

Matthew Pavlich attended Sacred Heart from 1997-1999. Widely renowned as one of the best forwards and captains in modern Australian Rules Football, Matthew represented Fremantle in 353 games over 17 years, being named All Australian on 6 occasions.

Rob Kerin attended Sacred Heart from 1966-1971. He served as Deputy Premier of South Australia from 1998-2001 and as our 43rd Premier from October 2001 to March 2002. Actively involved in the areas of industry and sport, Rob is currently the Executive Chairman of Primary Producers South Australia and Regional SA.

Leonard Faulkner attended Sacred Heart College from 1940-1941. He was ordained a priest in Rome on the first day of 1950. He was later appointed as the 17th Archbishop of Adelaide in 1985. Archbishop Faulkner was renowned for his work with migrant and refugee communities and his support of children and adults with disabilities. He retired in 2011 and is currently Archbishop Emeritus of Adelaide.

Jim Whiting attended Sacred Heart College from 1966-1974. He is currently the managing-director of Badge Constructions – the state's leading commercial builder, and one of our nation's largest privately owned commercial construction companies. It is also the company which constructed the Br Joseph McAteer Centre. Jim is a long standing member of the Sacred Heart College Foundation, alongside several other voluntary positions and committees.

David Sincok attended Sacred Heart from 1951-1960 and played cricket for Australia at test-match level between 1964 and 1966. David played 46 first-class matches for South Australia and was credited by the great Sir Garry Sobers as being the biggest turner of the ball he ever faced.

The late **Dr Lawrie Smart** attended Sacred Heart from 1941-1946. An innovator, Dr Smart was made a member of the Order of Australia for significant service to orthodontics. Dr Smart also pioneered the treatment of cleft palate patients in South Australia. An early student of Aquinas College, Dr Smart was the inaugural student president.

Bill Denny attended Sacred Heart from 1958-1965. Upon leaving school, Bill joined the Army and over 21 years, served in South Vietnam and PNG, as ADC (Aide de Camp) to the Governor General and on exchange duty with the British Army in Germany. Leaving the Army in 1990 with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, Bill was made a member of the Order of Australia in 2006 for service to the community, particularly veterans and their families.

Shaun Micallef attended Sacred Heart from 1972-1979. He is an Australian comedian, writer, producer, actor and TV presenter. A former College Captain of Sacred Heart, Shaun completed a Law Degree at the University of Adelaide before pursuing a career in entertainment, later being awarded a Logie in 1989, 2000, 2010 and 2016.

Bernard Wadsworth attended Sacred Heart College from 1947-1951 and was the leading physicist in his field for decades. In 1961 he joined the Laboratory of Nuclear Science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he was later promoted to Principal Research Engineer. He retired from the Laboratory for Nuclear Science at MIT in 2003 after 41 years of distinguished service.

Dr Leon Simon attended Sacred Heart from 1955-1963. Receiving a PhD from the University of Adelaide, he held positions at several distinguished universities both domestically and abroad, and later became Professor of Mathematics at Stanford University before serving as Chair of Mathematics in 1998. In 1994 Dr Simon was awarded the Bocher memorial prize, which is only awarded every 5 years to a ground breaking author in analysis.

Dean Wills attended Sacred Heart from 1947 – 1949. His outstanding business career spanned 46 years and included roles as Chairman and Chief Executive of Coca-Cola Amatil. He was awarded businessman of the year in 1990 by the Australian Business Magazine and credited his wonderful career to resilience, persistence and determination.

Rob Chapman attended Sacred Heart from 1976-1980. Rob is a former Managing Director of Bank SA and Chief Executive of St. George Bank, and is considered one of the state's most influential business leaders. He currently serves as the Chairman of the Adelaide Football Club and Chairman of the Adelaide Airport, and is a member of the Premier's Economic Development Cabinet.

The late **Philip Kennedy** attended Sacred Heart from 1944-1948. He was a rear-admiral in the Royal Australian Navy and was later promoted to Commodore. Philip was made an officer of the Order of Australia in 1987 for exceptional service and performance of duty in the Royal Australian Navy, and is the highest ranking Old Collegian in Australia's armed forces.

The late **John Willis** attended Sacred Heart from 1921-1926 and was professed Brother Damian Willis in 1927. He is a former Director and Principal at Randwick and Assumption Colleges, was the first Old Collegian to return as Principal in 1952, and was appointed Provincial in 1956.

The late **James Gleeson** attended Sacred Heart in 1937. After being ordained a priest in 1945, he later became Director of Catholic Education in the Adelaide Archdiocese. In 1961 he became the first South Australian priest to become Archbishop of Adelaide.

The late **Albert Hannan** attended Sacred Heart in 1903 and through a highly distinguished academic and legal career, he became Crown Solicitor of South Australia for 25 years. He was a champion in the commissioning of Aquinas College in Adelaide and has a wing of the College named in honour of his legacy.

The late **Robert Stigwood** attended Sacred Heart from 1945-1950. He was a music entrepreneur and film producer and is known internationally for his contribution to the music industry. He is perhaps best known as Manager of the Bee Gees. In 2015, he was inducted into the South Australia Hall of Fame and established a fellowship program which mentors local musicians.

Sergio Melta attended Sacred Heart from 1972-1975. He is a former Australian soccer player who played more than 500 games across 22 years for Adelaide City, where he won 3 national championships and was crowned National Soccer League Player of the Year in 1986. Sergio represented Australia in 1986 and is one of 3 Australians who have achieved UEFA A accreditation.

John Fitzgerald attended Sacred Heart College from 1976-1977. As a professional tennis player, his greatest highlights came during the 11 years he represented Australia in the Davis Cup. John held a former Number 1 Doubles Ranking, won 7 Grand Slam Doubles Titles, a Career men's Doubles Grand Slam and was Australia's Davis Cup Captain from 2001-2010.

Students are asked to pay attention to their uniform and on this day and in particular, note the following:

- Full College winter uniform is required. Facial/Body piercings are not permitted.
- Students may wear one plain, small pair of gold, silver, pearl or diamond sleepers or studs.
- Students must be clean shaven.
- Hair that is of shoulder length must be tied up in a ponytail and neatly off the face (no “top buns” are permitted).
- Light, barely visible foundation is the only makeup that will be accepted.

If you would like a sibling photo, students can collect a separate order form from the Front Office from 24 May.

This notice is from the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the department), to advise you that the department has requested your child's school provide a statement of addresses, in accordance with section 21 of the Australian Education Regulation 2013 (the Regulation).

A statement of addresses contains the following three pieces of information about students at the school:

- Students' residential address (not student names or other identifying information)
- Students' level of education (i.e. whether the student is receiving primary or secondary education)
- Students' boarding school status (boarders or day students).

Authority for and Purpose of Collection

Consistent with previous practice, and following the 2016 Australian Bureau of Statistics National Census of Population and Housing (Census), it is timely that information held by the department is updated in order to ensure that Australian Government funding calculations for your child's school are accurate.

Under section 21 of the Regulation, a statement of addresses must not explicitly identify an individual student. Accordingly, all information in the statement of addresses provided by your child's school to the department is de-identified.

Use and Disclosure of Information

It is important to ensure the statements of addresses are accurate, and the department may from time to time carry out audits of statements of addresses to verify their accuracy. In the event of an audit, the department's contracted auditors may seek to compare a school's statement of addresses with student enrolment information held by the school for the purpose of verifying the information. The department's contractors will not use the information for any other purpose. Any further use and disclosure of information relating to the statement of addresses will occur in accordance with section 65 of the Regulation.

Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study

The first round of the vaccinations under the Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study was successfully administered on Wednesday 10 May to all students who had registered for the study. In order to accommodate the large number of students taking part in the study, the vaccines will be administered in year level groups over a number of days throughout the year, which started with Year 11 students on Wednesday. Please see below for the dates when the vaccines will be administered:

Round 1 Vaccinations

Year 12 (+ Year 11 Round 1 catch-up): Wednesday 31 May 2017 (Week 5, Term 2) **Please note this the same day as School Photos.*

Year 10: Wednesday 14 June 2017 (Week 7, Term 2)

Round 2 Vaccinations

Year 11: Wednesday 5 July 2017 (Week 10, Term 2)

Year 12: Tuesday 22 August 2017 (Week 5, Term 3)

Year 10: Wednesday 23 August 2017 (Week 5, Term 3).

The Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study will only involve those students who have returned a completed and signed consent form.

The dates of the administration of the vaccine have been chosen to minimise disruption to lessons and the learning of students, however the complexity of administering the vaccine to all students throughout the day may result in some lessons being affected.

Supporting your child's safety online

On Wednesday 10 May, Sonya Ryan from the Carly Ryan Foundation spoke to our Year 10 students during their Pastoral Care lesson, and then to parents at a forum later that evening. Sonya's sessions were very powerful as they explored her personal journey of losing her daughter Carly to an online predator and then the work she has done since to educate and protect young people from suffering a similar fate.

Sonya's sessions provided students with an understanding of the practical steps they can take to protect their privacy and safety. Sonya also explained to parents the risks of some of the most popular apps that young people are using and falling victim to. Sonya provided step by step guides for how parents can support their children (and themselves) to ensure that they have the safe privacy and security settings on their apps.

Sonya provided a number of fact sheets that have been developed by the Australian Federal Police. I have included the first factsheet below.

Melissa Cagney will be representing Camp Counselors USA (CCUSA) at the SHC Careers Expo in July.


