In August 1957 Br Domus (Ron Hogan) coached the First XVIII at Sacred Heart and his brother, Br Calixtus (Kevin Hogan) coached the First XVIII at Assumption. They organised the first Assumption versus Sacred Heart football match when Sacred Heart travelled by train to Melbourne and then by bus to Kilmore. From there the event has grown to what it is today - reflecting the move to co-education in the 1980's and the inclusion of events which incorporate the Performing Arts, Debating and Sport.

The Exchange has also been characterised by 'billeting' the visiting students and many friendships have been forged over the past 58 years! Obviously, this requires an enormous community spirit and 2014 was no different. Each College relies on its staff, families and students to ensure that this rich tradition continues. Our Kilmore Coordinators - Mrs Margie Weller and Mr Luke Hildyard with the key support of Sports Coordinators Mrs Sue Kenneally and Mrs Alex Penhall, and the involvement of many other staff ensured the event ran well.

Typical of the hospitality was the work of the SHCS Parents and Friends who organised afternoon tea on the Sunday for over 500 people! THE MARIST CORNER

Scripture Reflection

Sunday, 31 Aug 2014: Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

The gospel does not say that Jesus will gallantly step forward, take suffering upon himself, and thus demonstrate his power. Instead, his fate will be a demonstration of his vulnerability. He will be taken forcibly and will suffer at the hands of others. He will do this willingly, but not as a volunteer. Jesus will be a victim. This picture of Jesus carries implications for discipleship. Whoever follows him must follow him to the cross. If we participate in his success, we must also share in his shame. Disciples have a choice to follow or not to follow, but if they choose in his favour they must be ready for suffering and humiliation.

Paul exhorts us to reject the standards of the world. This is a very difficult path to follow, especially when it seems that those who conform to this age prosper. Following Christ can place barriers between ourselves and others. If we no longer share their values and their interests, we may feel alienated. Suffering is bound to invade our ministerial lives as well. We must remember that Jesus' message antagonised many people in his day. Those who proclaim the same message in their own contexts must be prepared for a similar reaction.



After witnessing the marvellous feats that Jesus accomplished, we discover that he is going to suffer and be put to death. How can this be? With Peter we protest. With Jeremiah we wonder: Have we been duped? The realisation that we too will have to suffer becomes a crucial test of our faith.

eLEARNING UPDATE #11

This edition of our eLearning Update contains two updates, one for Google Docs and one for Google Sheets as well as two Google Chrome Extensions for reducing the number of windows open at any one time

New updates for Google docs and Google sheets:

Update #1 - Table cell border styling

Anyone working with tables in Google Docs will now be able add styling to the borders of individual cells or groups of cells within the table. New controls will allow the application of color, width, and line styles to cell borders in a selection.

When the cursor is in a table, the border styling toolbar will appear, allowing the editor to select border styles for a selection of cells or the individual cell containing the cursor.

Update #2 - Chart trendlines on Google Sheets

Anyone who wishes to create charts in Google Sheets now have the ability to add trend lines-lines superimposed on charts revealing the overall direction of the data. The trend lines can be styled with different colours and line thicknesses, and can be displayed as an item in the legend. They are available for scatter plot, bar, column, and line charts.

Useful Chrome Extensions:

OneTab - an extension that will help to reduce the number of tabs open at any one time



If you find the you have too many tabs open at once, click the OneTab icon to convert all your tabs into a single list open in only one tab.


When you need to access the tabs again, restore them individually or all at once.



TabCloud - an extension that will allow you to save and restore window sessions

Have you ever had the need to save a number of different windows while researching a topic but don't want to have to bookmark all of them?

Tab Cloud will allow you to save the window sessions and the restore it at a later date or on another computer.



Simply click on the TabCloud icon and you will see all your current windows shown (and previously saved windows) - you can save open window or restore saved ones. You will also be able to delete previously saved ones.

Community Learning is not graded and cannot be used towards the ATAR, but some students may still want recognition of their learning on their SACE Record of Achievement.

Simply bring the original certificate to me to sight, I take a photocopy and the student signs a declaration - it is that easy!

Expressions of Interest: SACE Board Exam Invigilators – Paid Positions

Expressions of interest are sought from members of the College community to supervise Stage 2 (Year 12) SACE Board examinations in November this year. There are a number of SACE Board rules regarding the supervision of students and overseeing special provisions students for exams. For this reason, it is most helpful to have a small team of supervisors who can ensure that all rules are consistently adhered to.

The SACE Board examination period commences on Monday November 3 and concludes on Wednesday November 19. Exams are 2 or 3 hours in length, plus additional time for special provisions students if applicable. There are one or two exams each day during this period, except for November 18 – no exams are scheduled for Sacred Heart students on this day.

The SACE Board stipulates that teachers are not permitted to supervise exams for subjects that they teach. In keeping with this principle, it would be appropriate for applicants not to supervise exams that relatives and/or close family friends are sitting.

All parents/caregivers of students attending SHCS must notify the College absentee line 8350 2594, when a student will be absent from school or is arriving late to school. The absentee line is a recorded message service and is available 24 hours, 7 days a week to take calls regarding your child's absence/late arrival to school. Please call this number before 9.45am on the day of a student absence. For multiple days absent please give dates and the reason.

If your son/daughter will be arriving late to school, please call the absentee line and leave details on the message recording- i.e. name, reason for late arrival and an estimated time of arrival. Students are to then sign in at the Front Office when they arrive.

This service can also be used to advise the College of your daughter/son's early departure for an appointment or family event. Otherwise please write a note of explanation in their diary. **In either case students must sign out at Front Office before leaving College grounds.**

If your son/daughter is unwell at school, we would prefer that they did not contact parents in the first instance. Rather they should attend the Health Care Centre to see the nurse who will contact you if the student needs to go home.

Managing the Physical Health Impact of Computer use on Children Seminar with Greg Campbell B App Sc (Physio)

Recent worldwide research conclusively shows the detrimental health effects of increased screen time and sedentary lifestyles in adults and in school aged children. These include:

- High BMI (increasing obesity rates)
- Increased Diabetes Risk
- Poorer Cardiorespiratory Fitness
- Higher Blood Pressure

Immanuel College and Immanuel Primary School have collaborated with Smart Health to combat these problems. This seminar will go through the evidence based research that clearly shows the long term detrimental effects that increased screen time, sedentary lifestyle and poorly set up computers and tablets can have on the physical health and wellbeing of school aged children. 
