



NAMING RIGHTS POLICY

1. CONTEXT

St Paul's College is a Catholic school in the tradition of Blessed Edmund Rice, under the authority of Edmund Rice Education Australia. It was established by the Christian Brothers in 1959 in conjunction with the local parishes and the Archdiocese of Adelaide. This policy provides a framework under which College buildings and facilities can be named. The policy should ensure that buildings and facilities are named in a manner consistent with the purpose and history of a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition. When the College names a facility after a particular person or family, it confers a significant honour. It also implicitly holds that person up as a suitable role model.

2. PRINCIPLES

Naming of college facilities are based on the following principles:

- 2.1. To enhance the identity of St Paul's College as a Catholic school in the tradition of Edmund Rice;
- 2.2. To honour the contributions of individuals, groups and others in the life of St Paul's College;
- 2.3. To perpetuate to students and the community inspirational examples from the history of the college and its traditions.

3. PROCEDURES (GUIDELINES)

- 3.1. Facilities are named with a recommendation of the College Board through the Principal and approved by the EREA Board, and in the case of being named after a Christian Brother, the Oceania Province Leadership Team;
- 3.2. Major facilities, such as buildings and ovals, are named in perpetuity. If a change of name is desired, the same process as above is employed;
- 3.3. Areas within buildings, e.g. laboratories or rooms, are named only with formal approval from the College Board and EREA. They may be named in perpetuity, or for a limited period;
- 3.4. Major facilities should be named to highlight connections with the history of the college, the Catholic Church, Edmund Rice and the Christian Brothers, and significant persons in the history of the college.
