CHANGE OF TRUSTEE

THIS DEED OF CHANGE OF TRUSTEE is made on 01/11/2022

PARTIES

- Stephen Charles Garth of Unit 602, 168 Queenscliff Road, Queenscliff NSW 2096 ("the Retiring Trustee").
- 2. **Beverley June Morrison** of Unit 505, 168 Queenscliff Road, Queenscliff NSW 2096 ("the Continuing Trustee")
- 3. Mitchell Easton Garth of Unit 3 80 Cabramatta Rd Mosman NSW 2088 ("the New Trustee").

RECITALS

- a) By a Deed dated 08/07/2004 ("the Establishing Deed") the Continuing and Retiring Trustee established a Self-Managed Superannuation Fund that has continuously been known as The Bev Morrison Superannuation Fund ("the Fund).
- b) The original Deed was amended by further Deeds dated 19/06/2009 and 12/11/2014 ("the current Deed").
- c) By Rule 2.4.3 of the current Deed, the Trustee is to retire.
- d) The Continuing Trustee and Retiring Trustee have continuously held such office up to and including the date hereof.
- e) The Retiring Trustee intends to retire as Trustee of the Fund.
- f) By Rule2.4.2 of the current Deed, the Members have the power to appoint trustees.
- g) The Continuing Trustee intends to remain as a Trustee of the Fund and the New Trustee is to be appointed as a Trustee of the Fund.
- h) The New Trustee is not by virtue of the provisions of the Trust Deed or by law precluded from assuming office as Trustee of the Fund.
- The New Trustee has agreed to join in these presents to accept appointment as Trustee of the Fund.

THIS DEED WITNESSES:

The parties confirm the fund's history

- 1. The parties confirm that:
 - The Fund was established on 08/07/2004 by the Establishing Deed.
 - The Retiring Trustee and Continuing Trustees are the fund's trustees.

Removal of Retiring Trustee

- 2. By Rule 2.4.3 of the current Deed, the Members have removes the Retiring Trustee from the execution date of this Deed.
- 3. The Retiring Trustee declares and confirms their removal as Trustee of the Fund which is to take effect as and from the execution of this Deed.
- 4. This Deed shall for all purposes be deemed to have been executed by all parties on the date which it bears.

Release of Retiring Trustee

- 5. It is agreed that subject to the provisions of Clause 2 of this Deed the Retiring Trustee, as and from the execution hereof, is discharged from further performance of their obligations and duties as Trustee of the Fund.
- 6. The Continuing Trustees indemnify the Retiring Trustee against all debts which the Retiring Trustee has incurred and which are unpaid at the time of execution of this Deed by all parties, whilst acting under and in terms of the Trust Deed and undertakes and agrees that the Continuing Trustees will pay and discharge all such debts out of the Assets of the Fund in accordance with the terms of credit or otherwise under which such debts were incurred.

Covenant by Retiring Trustee

7. The Retiring Trustee covenants that they will do all things necessary to transfer legal title to the assets of the Fund to the Continuing Trustees and to sign all documents and do all things reasonably required to enable the Continuing Trustees to continue to carry out their duties as Trustee of the Fund.

Appointment of New Trustee

- 8. By Rule 2.4.2 of the current Deed, the Members have appoint(s) the New Trustee from the execution date of this Deed.
- 9. The New Trustee covenants and agrees that as and from the execution of this Deed they:
 - will be bound by and observe and administer the trust powers, discretions and obligations conferred by the Trust Deed as if they were named as one of the Continuing Trustees.
 - have not received a benefit of any kind whatsoever out of or in connection with the Fund.
- 10. The Continuing Trustees declare and confirm their continuation as Trustees of the Fund.
- 11. This Deed shall for all purposes be deemed to have been executed by all parties on the date which it bears.

Acceptance of appointment of New Trustee

- 12. As and from the execution of this Deed, the New Trustee:
 - Accepts the appointment as an additional Fund Trustee.
 - Agrees to be bound by the current Deed; and
 - Undertakes all the obligations of the Fund as a Trustee

Consents

13. The parties consent to the removal specified in clause 2 of this Deed and the appointment specified in clause 8 of this Deed. The parties have passed a resolution to this effect.

Interpretation

- 14. Unless the context otherwise requires, the words defined in the current Deed have the same meaning wherever they appear in this Deed.
- 15. A reference in the Deed to the singular includes the plural and vice versa.
- 16. If a party consists of more than one person, this Deed binds them jointly and each of them severally.
- 17. In this Deed, unless expressed or implied to the contrary:

Additional Party means an additional person or entity that is a party to the execution of the Deed.

Deed means and includes this Trust Deed containing the governing and operating rules of this Fund and any subsequent Trust Deed varying the Deed.

Establishing Deed means the trust deed that established the The Bev Morrison Superannuation Fund on 08/07/2004.

Fund means this Fund established and maintained as a Complying SMSF under the Fund's Rules.

Governing Rules means the Trust Deed containing the governing and operating rules of the applicable Fund.

Member Meeting is a meeting of the Members as required by the Rules of the Fund and the Superannuation Laws or where matters regarding the Fund are discussed.

Superannuation Laws means the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1900, Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993, the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Regulations 1994, the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936, the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, the Income Tax Regulations, the Corporations Act 2001, the Corporations Regulations, the Treasury Laws Amendment (Fair and Sustainable) Act 2016, the Superannuation (Excess Transfer Balance Tax) Imposition Act 2016, the Social Security Act 1991 (C'th), the Social Security Regulations, the Veterans Entitlement Act 1986 (C'th), the Veterans Entitlement Regulations, the Family Law Act 1975, the Family Law Regulations, the Bankruptcy Act 1966, Superannuation (Departing Australia Superannuation Payments Tax) Act 2006, Superannuation (Excess Concessional Contributions Tax) Act 2006, Superannuation (Excess Non-concessional Contributions Tax) Act 2006, Superannuation (Self-Managed Superannuation Funds) Supervisory Levy Amendment Act 2006 and any other law dealing with an Australian Superannuation Fund as amended from time to time.

Trustee is the Trustee of the Fund and includes a Replacement Trustee appointed for a Member or an Additional Trustee where the Member is the only Member and Trustee of the Fund, according to the Rules of the Fund or pursuant to the Superannuation Laws.

 - I am not disqualified* from acting as a Trustee under the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993;
 - I will notify the Australian Taxation Office in writing if I am for any reason disqualified from continuing to act as a Trustee; and
 - I understand my obligations and responsibilities as Trustee of the Fund.

- * The Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993 provides that the following persons are disqualified from acting as a director of a Corporate Trustee:
- 1 Persons who have prior convictions involving dishonest conduct, wherever or whenever such conviction may have occurred.
- 2. Persons who are insolvent, bankrupt or have entered into arrangements, assignments or compositions with creditors under Part X of the *Bankruptcy Act 1966* (Cth) or a similar foreign law.
- Persons in relation to whom a civil penalty order has been made under the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993.
- 4. Persons expressly declared not to be "fit and proper" persons under sections 126A(3) or 126h(5) of the Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act 1993.

2 Trustee declaration



Self-managed super fund trustee declaration

I understand that as an individual trustee or director of the corporate trustee of

Fund name

The Bev Morrison Superannuation Fund

I am responsible for ensuring that the fund is operated in accordance with the *Superannuation Industry (Supervision) Act* 1993 (SISA) and other relevant legislation. The Commissioner of Taxation (the Commissioner) has the authority and responsibility for administering the legislation and enforcing trustees' compliance with the law.

I must keep myself informed of changes to the legislation relevant to the operation of my fund and ensure the trust deed is kept up to date in accordance with the law and the needs of the members.

If I do not comply with the legislation, the Commissioner may take the following actions:

- ■impose administrative penalties on me
- ■give me a written direction to rectify any contraventions or undertake a course of education
- ■enter into agreements with me to rectify any contraventions of the legislation
- disqualify me from being a trustee or director of a corporate trustee of any superannuation fund in the future
- ■remove the fund's complying status, which may result in significant adverse tax consequences for the fund
- prosecute me under the law, which may result in fines or imprisonment.

Sole purpose

I understand it is my responsibility to ensure the fund is maintained for the purpose of providing benefits to the members upon their retirement (or attainment of a certain age) or their beneficiaries if a member dies. I understand that I should regularly evaluate whether the fund continues to be the appropriate vehicle to meet this purpose.

Trustee duties

I understand that by law I must at all times:

- ■act honestly in all matters concerning the fund
- ■exercise skill, care and diligence in managing the fund
- ■act in the best financial interests of all the members of the fund
- ■keep records of decisions made about the running of the fund, including the appointment of professional advisers and the retirement of members and payment of benefits
- ■ensure that my money and other assets are kept separate from the money and other assets of the fund
- ■take appropriate action to protect the fund's assets (for example, have sufficient evidence of the ownership of fund assets)
- ■refrain from entering into any contract or do anything that would prevent me from, or hinder me in, properly performing or
- exercising my functions or powers as a trustee or director of the corporate trustee of the fund
- ■allow all members of the fund to have access to information and documents as required, including details about
- the financial situation of the fund
- the investments of the fund
- the members' benefit entitlements.

I also understand that by law I must prepare, implement and regularly review an investment strategy having regard to all the circumstances of the fund, which include, but are not limited to:

- ■the risks associated with the fund's investments
- ■the likely return from investments, taking into account the fund's objectives and expected cash flow requirements
- ■investment diversity and the fund's exposure to risk due to inadequate diversification
- ■the liquidity of the fund's investments having regard to the fund's expected cash flow requirements in discharging its existing
- ■and prospective liabilities (including benefit payments)
- whether the trustees of the fund should hold insurance cover for one or more members of the fund.

Accepting contributions and paying benefits

I understand that I can only accept contributions and pay benefits (income streams or lump sums) to members or their beneficiaries when the conditions specified in the law and the fund trust deed have been met.

Investment restrictions

I understand that, as a trustee or director of the corporate trustee of the fund, subject to certain limited exceptions specified in the law, I am prohibited from:

- giving financial assistance using the resources of the fund to a member of the fund or a member's relative (financial assistance means any assistance that improves the financial position of a person directly or indirectly, including the provision of credit)
- acquiring assets (other than business real property, listed securities, certain in-house assets and acquisitions made under mergers, allowed by special determinations or acquisitions from the trustee or investment manager of another regulated super fund as a result of a breakdown of a relationship) for the fund from members or other related parties of the fund

- borrowing money (or maintaining an existing borrowing) on behalf of the fund except in certain limited circumstances (while limited recourse borrowing arrangements are permitted, they can be complex and particular conditions must be met to ensure that legal requirements are not breached)
- acquiring an in-house asset if the fund's in-house assets exceed 5% of the market value of the fund's total assets, or the in-house assets will exceed 5% of the market value of the fund's total assets by acquiring the asset (in-house assets are loans to, or investments in, related parties of the fund including trusts or assets subject to a lease or lease arrangement between the trustee and a member, relative or other related party)
- entering into investments that are not made or maintained on an arm's length (commercial) basis (this ensures the purchase or sale price of the fund's assets and any earnings from those assets reflects their market value).

Administration

I understand that the trustees of the fund must:

- keep and retain for at least 10 years
 - minutes of all trustee meetings at which matters affecting the fund were considered (this includes investment decisions and decisions to appoint members and trustees, the retirement of members and payment of benefits)
 - records of all changes of trustees, including directors of the corporate trustee
 - each trustee's consent to be appointed as a trustee of the fund or a director of the corporate trustee
 - all trustee declarations
 - copies of all reports given to members
 - documented decisions about storage of collectables and personal use assets
- ensure that the following are prepared and retained for at least five years
 - an annual statement of the financial position of the fund
 - an annual operating statement
 - copies of all annual returns lodged
 - accounts and statements that accurately record and explain the transactions and financial position of the fund including asset market valuation
 - copies of Transfer balance account reports lodged
 - copies of any other statements you are required to lodge with us or provide to other super funds
- appoint an approved SMSF auditor each year, no later than 45 days before the due date for lodgment of the fund's annual return and provide documents to the auditor as requested
- lodge the fund's annual return, completed in its entirety, by the due date
- review the independent audit report received from the approved SMSF auditor and take action as required
- notify the ATO within 28 days of any changes to the
 - membership of the fund, or trustees or directors of the corporate trustee
 - name of the fund
 - contact person and their contact details
 - postal address, registered address or address for service of notices for the fund
- notify the ATO in writing within 21 days if the fund becomes an Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) regulated fund.

DECLARATION

By signing this declaration I acknowledge that I understand my duties and responsibilities as a trustee or director of the corporate trustee of the self-managed superannuation fund named on this declaration (or if the fund's name changes, that name). I understand that:

- I must ensure this document is retained for at least 10 years or while I remain a trustee or director of the corporate trustee (whichever is longer) and, if I fail to do this, penalties may apply.
- Administrative penalties can be imposed on me for not complying with the legislation
- I may have to make this document available for inspection by a member of staff of the ATO and, if I fail to do this, penalties may apply.
- I do not have access to the government's financial assistance program that is available to trustees of APRA regulated funds in the case of financial loss due to fraudulent conduct or theft.
