
AFI | AACTA members hold the exclusive privilege of voting in the AACTA Awards.


ADMISSION REGULATIONS

Australia has produced some of the best screen practitioners and productions in the world, and an important part of AACTA's role is to recognise this through the annual AACTA Awards – Australia's highest screen accolades.

CONNECTING THE INDUSTRY

AACTA is a not-for-profit, member organisation. AACTA membership is granted exclusively to film and television professionals, each from a cross-section of the screen industry including production across all screen crafts, distribution, exhibition and television networks.

The Australian Academy is overseen by AACTA President Geoffrey Rush and an Honorary Council - a selection of Australia's most outstanding and highly skilled screen craft specialists, each chosen because of their contribution to the industry, and each representing AACTA's 15 screen craft chapters, from cinematography and costume design, to screenwriting and directing.

Other benefits include complimentary screenings and special member rates at national cinemas, film festivals and for industry magazine subscriptions.



HOW TO CAST YOUR VOTE

AACTA MEMBERS

In line with best-practice international models, the 3rd AACTA Awards will again employ a two-step voting model for Feature Film voting.

Feature Film voting is open to AACTA members – screen professionals who have undergone an accreditation process to become an AACTA member.

In round one of Feature Film voting, each chapter of AACTA votes to determine a short list of nominees in the applicable award category specific to that chapter.

In round two, all members of AACTA can vote on this shortlist of nominees to determine the winner.

This two-step model allows for a more consistent and rigorous approach to voting, and will ensure that practitioners best qualified to recognise excellence in their specific crafts are short listing nominees on which the broader AACTA membership then vote.

Juries of industry professionals have determined nominees for the AACTA Awards for Best Short Fiction Film and Best Short Animation.

All AACTA members vote to determine the winner in these categories.

This year, a jury has determined the nominees and winner for the Best Feature Length Documentary Award.

AFI MEMBERS

Membership of the Australian Film Institute (AFI) is open to all screen enthusiasts. AFI members are provided the opportunity to vote in the categories of Best Short Fiction Film and Best Short Animation in the 3rd AACTA Awards.






