GENERAL INFORMATION

Welcome to the Samsung AFI | AACTA Festival of Film, which is held for the purpose of judging the Samsung AACTA Awards.

SCREENING SCHEDULE

Each film will be screened once in Sydney and Melbourne. Please refer to the Screenings Program at the back of the Judges Handbook.

Every effort will be made to avoid changes to the screening schedule, however in the event that changes must be made, all members will receive direct email communication and changes will also be noted on the AACTA website (aacta.org) and in our dedicated weekly Festival of Film eBulletin.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS

AFI | AACTA members receive complimentary entry to all sessions, upon presentation of their membership cards at the cinema box office.

Members can obtain their complimentary tickets from the box office in advance of each screening.

For the Special Anniversary Screenings, which include Q&A sessions, members have the opportunity to pre-reserve their tickets online. Visit aacta.org/events for more details. All seating is offered on a first come, first serve basis, and is strictly limited by the capacity of each cinema. As most sessions are open to nonmembers, we advise AFI | AACTA members to obtain tickets in advance, or arrive at the box office at least 15 minutes prior to each session.

The AFI cannot guarantee entry to popular sessions.

Persons under the age of 18 are restricted to sessions based on the classifications listed for each film. Films without classification are restricted to persons aged 18 and over – proof of age may be required. Latecomers arriving after the scheduled start of a screening may not be admitted.

NON-MEMBER ACCESS

Non-members (i.e. general public) may purchase individual session tickets directly from the cinemas, for sessions not marked 'AFI | AACTA members only'. Sessions that are restricted to AFI | AACTA members only are denoted by * in the Screenings Program.

PRODUCTION DETAILS

The synopses and production details listed in the Judges Handbook have been supplied and approved by the producer of each entered production.

VOTING

AFI | AACTA members hold the exclusive privilege of voting in the Samsung AACTA Awards.

All votes will be submitted on the AACTA website, via an online voting form. Only one voting form per AFI | AACTA member per round will be accepted.

AFI | AACTA acknowledges that it may not be possible for voting members to view all films in competition. Therefore, individual member votes shall be weighted to reflect the percentage of films each member has seen.

The Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts (AACTA) was launched by the Australian Film Institute (AFI) in August 2011, with the primary role of identifying, awarding, promoting and celebrating Australia's greatest achievements in film and television.

Australia has produced some of the best screen practitioners and productions in the world, and an important part of AACTA's role is to recognise this through the annual AACTA Awards. A continuum of the AFI Awards, an AACTA Award is the highest award for screen excellence in Australia.

AACTA PRESIDENT

Adding international weight to AACTA is the involvement of some of Australia's most celebrated screen professionals, including Geoffrey Rush who has been appointed as AACTA's Founding President.

A NEW STATUETTE

As we celebrate the current line-up of Australian films competing in the Samsung AACTA Awards, this year, in conjunction with the NFSA, we also look back at two modern classics – *Lantana* and *Proof.* Both films reminded us that Australian cinema could tackle intimate urban stories of the city, with style, beauty and subtlety.

LANTANA

10TH ANNIVERSARY

Winner of 7 AFI Awards, Lantana was the long awaited return to filmmakina by Director, Ray Lawrence. The award winning script by playwright Andrew Bovell traced the interweaving stories of men and women arapplina with grief, infidelity and thwarted desires for intimacy. The ensemble cast includes Anthony LaPaalia. Vince Colosimo, Kerry Armstrona and Rachael Blake - all of whom won AFI Awards for their nuanced performances. Taking more than \$12 million at the Australian box office. Lantana revealed an audience hungry for intelligent, arown-up stories told with a local accent.



PROOF

20TH ANNIVERSARY

Winner of 6 AFI Awards, Proof was the deliciously entertaining and blackly comic drama from first time Writer/Director, Jocelyn Moorhouse and Producer, Lynda House, A story about trust, lust and mateship, Proof depicts a triangle of love. hate and betraval. At its three points are a blind photographer (Hugo Weaving), his spiteful but adorina housekeeper (Geneviève Picot) and the friendly kitchenhand who's drawn to both of them (played by the fresh-faced Russell Crowe). Twenty years later, Proof is as smart, funny and elegant as when it was first released.

HOW TO CAST YOUR VOTE

AACTA MEMBERS

In line with best-practice international models, the inaugural Samsung AACTA Awards will include a new two-step voting model for Feature Film voting.

Feature Film voting is open to AACTA members – screen professionals who have undergone an accreditation process to become an AACTA member.

In round one of Feature Film voting, each chapter of AACTA votes to determine a short list of nominees in the applicable award category specific to that chapter.

In round two, all members of AACTA can vote on this shortlist of nominees to determine the winner.

This two-step model allows for a more consistent and rigorous approach to voting, and will ensure that practitioners best qualified to recognise excellence in their specific crafts are shortlisting nominees on which the broader AACTA membership then vote. Juries of industry professionals have determined nominees for the AACTA Awards for Best Short Fiction Film, Best Short Animation and Best Feature Length Documentary. All AACTA members vote to determine the winner in these categories.

AFI MEMBERS

Membership of the Australian Film Institute (AFI) is open to all screen enthusiasts. AFI members are provided the opportunity to vote in the categories of Best Short Fiction Film and Best Short Animation in the inaugural Samsung AACTA Awards. AFI members will also vote to determine the shortlist for the 2011 audience choice award.







THE EYE OF THE STORM

In the Sydney suburb of Centennial Park, two nurses, a housekeeper and a solicitor attend to Elizabeth Hunter as her expatriate son and daughter convene at her deathbed. But, in dying, as in living, Mrs Hunter remains a powerful force on those who surround her. 


