Welcome to City of Launceston's second edition of the Ravenswood Learning Site newsletter. This bi-monthly newsletter is for people who live, work and enjoy the Ravenswood community as a way to keep people informed about City of Launceston's work in the area.

The City of Launceston has recently recruited a Northern Suburbs Project Officer, who is responsible for developing the Northern Suburbs Revitalisation Plan, a key action listed as part of the Smart Cities Plan: Launceston City Deal www.launceston.tas.gov.au/Launceston-City-Deal. The Northern Suburbs Revitalisation Plan is a strategic document signed off by local, state, and federal government and is separate to the asset based community driven work of the Ravenswood Learning Site. There will be an opportunity to provide input into the plan later this year.

The past two months have been busy in Ravenswood with the focus on developing two major community-led projects in the suburb; Pioneer Parade Garden Development and the Ravenswood Sign.

Brett in his role as Community Connector has been supporting these local projects by working with volunteers and residents who are involved in the project's working groups. There have been a number of planning meetings, sourcing of materials, volunteers, and local labour to move these ideas into action!

Community Projects

The last few months have continued to be a time of further development of Learning Site projects with project managers and their teams.

Stage 1 of the Pioneer Parade Community Garden project is expected to begin on 5 May. We have obtained the services of a qualified bricklayer from the suburb to build the BBQ. Alongside the construction young people will be guided through a building workshop to learn skills thanks to Nate and Sarah and young people at the Ravenswood Health Centre. The City of Launceston is kindly donating pavers from the Civic Square for the BBQ area. Obtaining two shipping containers for on-site storage and a public toilet will be the most challenging undertaking but the community will give it a go.

The community project team has sourced materials for the Ravenswood Sign project from the City of Launceston. The community project team is aiming to meet with the Ravenswood Men's Shed and establish their involvement and obtain necessary approvals. Once this is completed, construction can begin to create the sign.

Name the Ravenswood Outdoor Community Space



City of Launceston has started construction on the redevelopment of the Prossers Forest Road Park in Ravenswood. The project will be completed in two stages, as detailed below:

Stage 1 - Work has commenced on the construction of a new Skate Park, featuring a cantilevered ramp, grinding rails, quarter pipes, hips, small bowl and grinding ledges. The Skate Park is expected to take ten weeks to complete and open in July 2018.

The current Skate Park will remain available to use until the new space is completed.

Stage 2 - Construction is expected to commence in early spring 2018 on a new Play Space which includes a fenced toddler space, basketball half-court, nature play elements, landscaping and shade shelters and much more.
