

**Email to Insurance House: APA Group Insurer. 19<sup>th</sup> August 2016**

Hi Amal

I am writing to ask for your advice. We've been advised that our Australian Physiotherapy Association Accreditation will not be renewed as of January 22nd 2017.

The APA has decided not to accredit any Postgraduate courses and has instead opted to run courses themselves.

What I would like to know is whether you will continue to insure APA & Non-APA Physiotherapists who complete our courses if we are not accredited by them. We are however accredited with Osteopathy Australia, Chiropractor's association of Australia, Massage Australia & AAMT.

I can't imagine that you wouldn't insure Physiotherapists who successfully complete our courses but I wanted to confirm this in writing, so I can let Physiotherapists who attend & successfully complete our courses. Our courses that Physiotherapists have attended for the past 3-4 years are the same in content and have been accredited by the APA on two subsequent cycles without hesitation. So the only thing that has changed is that they are not accrediting our courses but the content and delivery is the same.
