There are so many awesome new ways we can do things now we have access to the cloud. Here are what educators are saying about their new ways of working.

Welcome to the Wonderful World with OneDrive

OneDrive has been rolled out across all EQ schools and every EQ staff member now has access to five terabytes of online storage space in the cloud. This means that we can save our files to the cloud rather than the hard drives of our computers or our school network. Your files will then be accessible from any device you can use to log on to the internet to access your OneDrive account. The best thing is anything on OneDrive is backed up centrally by the department so you will never lose your files. You can save, sync and access files on OneDrive in a number of ways.

One popular way to access OneDrive is to login via www.owa.eq.edu.au. Once you type in this URL, you can then login using your EQ username and password. Click on the grid app launcher icon in the corner and select OneDrive. You will then be able to upload and share files. You can also setup a folder on your C4T or install the OneDrive app on your device to upload and sync files to the cloud from your device.



With OneDrive you can sync files to the cloud and access them on any device. Edit your files in the cloud using the online versions of Office applications or share the files with your colleagues or students to create shared documents.

The image below really says it all. We now have access to online versions of our most commonly used Microsoft applications from anywhere using any device that is connected to the web. Login at www.owa.eq.edu.au and use the grid app launcher at the top left to open the online applications.



HOW BIG IS YOUR PART OF THE CLOUD?

Did you know that every DET educator now has 5 terabytes of space in the cloud that they can use to store files and media? This could hold over 1.5 million photos or 2500 hours of video files. This space is the equivalent of five percent of total internet traffic in 1993 or if you think of it in 1GB USB sticks, it's the same as having 5000 of them to save your data to.

Collaborative Brainstorming in Staff Meetings


These new applications also provide us with a range of options to collaboratively create documents and brainstorm with staff and students. We can set up Office 365 documents and share them with our colleagues or students so that they can contribute to them.

Many schools have begun using this functionality as a means of capturing ideas during staff meetings or to work collaboratively during planning days. The organiser of the meeting or planning day creates the document, selects share and enters the email addresses of the staff or students they want to have access to view or edit the document.

The great thing is that those that you have been given access can contribute to the document live during the meeting or at any time asynchronously. When brainstorming ideas within a meeting, you can have the document open on the device connected to the projector. Your team can see the contributions that staff are making as they are added. You can also see initials beside each contribution so you know who has added what. It is an easy and effective way to brainstorm and collaborate and this feature is also being leveraged for learning in our classrooms.



Login at www.owa.eq.edu.au to access your Office 365 applications. Click on the grid in the top left hand corner to open the application launcher and start using your Office 365 apps.



Class Notebook – A Complete Game Changer


Class Notebooks are a new feature of OneNote and are a piece of cake to set up. They allow you to easily add students and create and distribute content, activities and assessment to students. Notebooks feature Content Libraries where teachers add read-only content for students, Collaboration Spaces where students can work collaboratively on projects and Student Notebooks where students can privately complete their work and assessment items. Only the teacher and student can view and edit the student's notebook. Once you've mastered how to use them and set them up, you're armed with a powerful set of tools that you can use to easily differentiate learning, quickly provide multimodal feedback and set up collaborative brainstorming and project spaces for your class.



Learning Tools Unleashed

There are so many things to love about Class Notebook but a standout would have to be the Learning Tools add-in. Once installed, it appears as an extra ribbon at the top of OneNote. The Learning Tools include the Immersive Reader which you can use to listen to text being read back to you and the Dictate tool. The quality and accuracy with both of these tools is fantastic and our students are using them daily to record their ideas and to also hear their own writing being read back to them.
