Where will our changing environment take us to next? How can we best utilise the different technologies to meet societies increasing needs for ongoing education?

Sub themes for the conference include

- Innovations in designs for learning
- Equity, access, openness and flexibility
- Emerging teaching and learning strategies, assessment models
- New technologies and related pedagogies for learning

Conference Aim

We aim to provide a forum in which we can explore the fast, constantly moving environment of modern teaching and learning.

The conference showcases practice and theory in the broad field of open, flexible, distance, blended and mobile learning. We will explore how digital technologies are changing and how emerging tools can be harnessed for learning. We will look at where to next? Massey University, Palmerston North

Keynote Speakers



Professor George Siemens George Siemens is an educator and researcher on learning, networks, analytics and visualization, openness, and organizational effectiveness in digital environments. He is the author of *Knowing Knowledge*, an exploration of how the context and characteristics of knowledge have changed and what it means to organizations today, and the *Handbook of Emerging Technologies for Learning*. *Knowing Knowledge* has been translated into Mandarin, Spanish, Persian, and Hungarian. Siemens is the Associate Director of the Technology Enhanced Knowledge Research Institute at Athabasca University, leading the learning analytics research team.

Previously, he was the Associate Director, Research and Development, with the Learning Technologies Centre at University of Manitoba. His PhD, through University of Aberdeen, was on sensemaking and wayfinding in complex information settings. He is a frequent keynote speaker at conferences detailing the influence of technology and media on education, organizations, and society, having presented at conferences in more than 30 countries.

His work has been profiled in provincial, national, and international newspapers (including NY Times), radio, and television. His research has received numerous national and international awards. He will receive an honorary doctorate from Universidad de San MartÃn de Porres for his pioneering work in learning, technology, and networks in May 2012. Siemens has maintained the elearnspace blog (www.elearnspace.org/blog) for eleven years and www.connectivism.ca for six years.



Professor Sian Bayne is Professor of Digital Education at the University of Edinburgh, based in the Moray House School of Education. She directs the Centre for Research in Digital Education and teaches on the MSc in Digital Education.

Her research is currently focused on critical approaches to teacher automation, open and distance education, and the application of theories of critical posthumanism to digital education. Professor Tim Bell is an Associate Professor in the department of Computer Science and Software Engineering at the University of Canterbury in Christchurch, New Zealand. His current research interests include Computers and Music, Public Understanding of (Computer) Science, and educational applications of podcasting.

He received the Science Communicator Award from the NZ Association of Scientists in 1999, and an inaugural New Zealand Tertiary Teaching Excellence Award in 2002. He has appeared with his "Computer Science Unplugged" show at the Edinburgh International Science Festival, the Dunedin International Science Festival, and the Australian Science Festival.

He is also a qualified musician, and performs regularly on instruments that have black-and-white keyboards. He is co-author of the books "Text Compression" and "Managing Gigabytes"



Keynote Speakers



Sue Suckling drives innovation & transformation in both the education sector and commercial sectors, primarily through her positions as Chair of Callaghan Innovation and Chair of the New Zealand Qualifications Authority. Alongside these positions, Sue has used her strong understanding of governance to Chair the Capability and Capacity Review for the NZ Health System for the Director General of Health and Chair the governance board for the Minister of Health.

In the private sector, Sue has been a Board Director of two top 50 NZX companies and has chaired multiple successful SMEs.



Mark Brown is Ireland's first Professor of Digital Learning and Director of the National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) at Dublin City University (DCU). He originally began his educational career as a primary teacher and now has over 25 years experience of working in Higher Education. Over the last decade he has served in a number of leadership roles and is currently an Executive Committee member of the European Distance and E-learning Network (EDEN) and member of the Supervisory Board of the European Association of Distance Teaching Universities (EADTU).

Mark also serves on the Board of the Irish National Forum for the Enhancement of Teaching and Learning in Higher Education and chairs the Teaching and Learning Committee of the European Consortium of Innovative Universities. Before moving to Ireland he was Director of the National Centre for Teaching and Learning at Massey University, and President of the New Zealand Association for Open, Flexible and Distance Learning (DEANZ).

Mark is a recipient of a National Award for Sustained Excellence in Tertiary Teaching and albeit from a distance remains a member of the New Zealand Academy of Tertiary Teaching Excellence.
