

The Oldest town in the Wollondilly (settlement 1810) and one of the oldest villages in NSW. It boasts historic colonial buildings to admire including the Appin Public School, historic Churches, and the Old Rectory. Surrounded by both rural and quality residential areas in addition to it's assortment of shops and the popular historic pub.





It has come a long way in terms of population growth and many new homes have been built in. Perhaps Appin's biggest drawcard is its location. The development of the Macarthur Area has seen Appin grow as a suburb with residential housing, parks and playing fields. And yet, it is close to thousands of hectares of national

parklands, bushwalking trails and Cataract Dam. Enjoy the rugged beauty of the area on the drive between Appin and Douglas Park, through Broughton Pass and crossing the Cataract River and Cataract Dam.

Appin has easy access to both the Wollongong beaches and the major shopping districts of Campbelltown. Being only 15 minutes from the CBD, it has proximity to the Hospital, Greater Union Movie Theatre and Macarthur Square while 25 minutes drive will see you at Bulli Beach.



It is located at the North Eastern corner of the Wollondilly Region approximately 71 kilometres south west of Sydney.
