TRENCH MAP, 4th ARMY FRONT. MAP G.



CAGNICOURT.

(Reference accompanying 1:50,000 map and 1:25,000 sheet 51 b S.R.).

1.—GENERAL.

CAGNICOURT, a village of 500 houses and several barns, lies between HENDECOURT and CAGNICOURT, lies near the Northern extremity of a small area running North-South. To the North and East the ground falls into the valley in which the HUNDESELLER flows to the SENESSE river, past SAULHEMONT and ECOURT-*ST.* QUENTIN.

The village is surrounded by pastures and orchards which are usually enclosed by walls or hedges.

2.—OBSERVATION.

Being to the high ground South of the village good observation can only be obtained in a Northern direction. An excellent view in this direction can be had from the church, which is built on a rising, and from the *Mairie* (see Plans in V 14), from the high ground in V the village of *LAURY*, HAUCOURT and *YVES*. *ADON* road be observed.

3.—WOODS.

There are 2 woods near CAGNICOURT.

(a) *BOIS de ROUCHE*. Tall oaks and beeches planted close together. Thick undergrowth. The trees through the wood are marked on the 1:50,000 sheet. A spring in the centre of the wood contains a mineral in places.

(b) *BOIS de LOISON* is a small copse and contains only small trees planted widely apart with little undergrowth.

(c) CAGNICOURT WOOD has few trees left, many of them having been cut down previous to the war. The trees are mostly oaks and beeches and the wood contains little undergrowth.

4.—ROADS.

The unmetalled roads are—
(a) CAGNICOURT-*QUENTIN* road past the *Croix*, is only metalled for 2 km. from CAGNICOURT.

(b) CAGNICOURT-*INCHY* road.

(c) CAGNICOURT-*HUBAY* BARILLI road. It is only metalled from CAGNICOURT to the *Mairie* (see Plan).

(d) CAGNICOURT-*VILLERS* on CAGNICOURT road past the cemetery.

(e) CAGNICOURT-*HENDECOURT* road.

(f) CAGNICOURT-*HENDECOURT* road.

(g) CAGNICOURT-*VILLERS*-*ADON* road.

5.—WATER SUPPLY.

Wells.—There are 3 large wells, situated as follows—

(a) Immediately South of the church.

(b) Opposite *MARY* to *GENVILLE* Farm.

(c) Close to the *MARY* Chateau. Very large and deep.

Wells.—There are 40 wells in the village and their depth varies from 50 to 65 ft. Every large farm has a well of its own.

6.—BUILDINGS.

Serial numbers correspond to the numbers in black on the 1:50,000 map.

Most of the houses are built of brick. The principal buildings are—

(1) V 0 = 488. The Church. Built of stone on a large massed. Measures 100 ft. by 65 ft. The spire is about 100 ft. high.

(2) V 0 = 504. *VIEUX* *NOTAIRE*. Stone construction surrounded by a wall.

(3) V 0 = 504. *MARQUILLY* Farm. Large and walled built of brick. The walls are very thick and there are large cellars.

(4) V 10 = 3000. *TAILLANDER* Farm. Old and walled. The farm house is built of stone and brick. There are very large cellars for storing beer.

(5) V 10 = 2066. *TAILLANDER* Chateau. Newly built of brick. Not very large but walled.

(6) V 0 = 1823. *MARY* to *GENVILLE* Farm. Large and walled construction of brick.

(7) V 0 = 4011. *Maison* *HUBAY* *TAILLANDER*. Group of buildings overlooking a courtyard and built of brick. A wall runs round the back but shows on 1:25,000 map.

(8) V 0 = 3000. *MARY* Chateau. Built of brick-stone.

(9) V 0 = 3045. Brewery. Skilfully constructed and possessing large cellars.

7.—UNDERGROUND PASSAGES.

A deep underground passage, containing chambers and stables, starts from a point immediately East of the church and passes beneath the presbytery. The roof of this passage has collapsed in certain places.

8.—SOIL.

The ground round CAGNICOURT is generally loamy. In the valley East of the village, clay, sandy clay and chalk are encountered in small quantities.

9.—QUARRIES.

(a) Sand quarry at V 0 = 3008 in the wood. 50 to 55 ft. deep and offering good cover.

(b) Sand quarry at V 0 = 2113 in the *BOIS de LOISON*. Measures 250 ft. by 100 ft. and is 80 ft. deep.

(c) Shells of the above are marked on the 1:50,000 map.







1st Anzac Corps Situation Map






