

Dear Sir,

I had hoped to return to the unit tonight and report to you but I am sorry to say that I have been ill all day and Major Lawton, O.C. of this boat, has confined me to bed. Since I have been staying here my stomach has refused to work as it should, after its holiday on the way over from Ceebe, and today I have been vomiting rubber violently. If the M.O.'s treatment does not relieve the trouble he is probably going to send me over to the hospital. This may occasion rather a delay before I again see you so for two reasons, I thought I should write you this rather lengthy note.

Firstly, I wanted to acquaint you with as much of the final picture in Ceebe as I could. You have probably seen Gunner Smith by this time and he will have told you much of what happened. Starting from the night outside Canea when we had to turn the guns around on the road, here briefly, is what happened. That night we moved around to meet a guide from the N. G. regiment to which we had to report, but couldn't find him so spent the night on the road. At dawn, we moved on until we found their gun position and they were able to let us have a few rations.

We occupied a position in support of the 15 N.I. Bn. that afternoon and after dusk Captain

Raybourn-Smith took me up to his ship with him and then passed me on to the battalion as H.O.D. That day the enemy attacked incessantly and the ship where I had joined in H.Q. H.O.D., was without communications when the enemy drove the New Zealanders back from where they had another ship established. Through it passed our line. The enemy broke through the 18th. Coy. late that afternoon and I managed to get away back to Captain Raybourn-Smith's ship. From there we retired to the guns and after Major Ball of the H.Q.iers had joined us, we fired with good sights till dusk. One of the bombardiers was wounded and sent back about this time. I think Gopher was his name.

After the Maoris had counter-attacked we were able to withdraw that night and occupied a position west of Kanea. We spent a day there without firing a shot and without being picked up by enemy aircraft. That night orders were given for our withdrawal - the directions to Captain Raybourn-Smith were to take the road to the right about five miles beyond Luda and guides would be posted along the road. When we moved off we left behind a section vehicle which Major Ball required. I believe it subsequently broke down for we did not see it again and some of the personnel on board later passed us on foot. Lt.-Col. Hogg was the senior person on board and the vehicle was an unfortunate loss for all our rations were carried on it. During the night we had a brief chat with

Captain Swan when we met him on the road but we were unable to find any guides. Spalkie had been mentioned to Captain Laybourne. Smith and we continued in that direction till dawn. We hid all that day and at night continued to the end of the road. There were still no guides so Captain Laybourne. Smith took us about six miles back along the road where we again took cover for the day. I have related all this in the belief that you did not see him at this position. If you did, of course he probably made the report himself.

We received your order to report under command of the 4th. N.Z. bde. and in this connection, we brought the guns into action at the bottom of a large basin. Late that afternoon, Colonel Gray, an A.S. Lt. commander, returned to our gun position and directed the fire of one of our guns on to a machine gun post. He seemed satisfied we were on to it and we were busy plastering it when the troop commander returned with orders for immediate retirement. We moved back to a position about eight miles down the road and the guns were brought into action beside the road, level with a line the 7th. bde. was manning. When one of our trucks broke down during the retirement it had to be abandoned and the gun it carried was destroyed on the troop commander's orders.

Next day our tanks withdrew behind us and we could see the Germans moving up. They commenced machine gunning and mortaring us but the pressure was not serious.

We opened fire on the road late in the afternoon and enemy transport no longer came into view. A company commander pointed out a position where he said there was a mortar. We engaged it and the coy. cdr. was confident we had knocked it out and the time of flight of mortar bombs was thereafter much longer. The enemy machine-gunned us when we opened fire but we were able to shelter behind the large shield on the gun.

The following day was quiet until we tried to engage a hut on the far side of the valley which the enemy was using for signalling. We had difficulty in getting the elevation, having no place additional rocks under the wheels. The first shot fell short and the enemy inside the hut scuttled out and back other cover. While putting more rocks under the wheels to get the additional elevation the enemy opened fire on us with what, I should say, was a 2 pdr. gun. He pumped about seven shots through or about the shield, derailing the crew off the gun and wounding Sergeant Breen and Pdr. Blinn. They were able to walk and were sent back to a dressing station. There ensued a "babe" of machine-gunning and mortaring until 2045 hrs., when the order was given to disable our guns and retire at 2100 hrs.

We removed the breech blocks and firing mechanisms, disposing of them down the road, and we moved back with the 7 btn. column. We had five officers and twenty-five o'rs at this stage, Sgt. Robinson, Captain Laybourne, Smith's batman being slightly wounded.

Having been told we were to be evacuated all right every man of us carried a rifle. We marched all night but so frequent were the halts and so fierce was the congestion near the beach, we did not arrive there until 3 AM. It was difficult to keep our formation, for the stragglers near the beach, mainly natives who were supposed to follow us, put on rather a bad show and many were almost hysterical in their conduct. It was a gruelling march and in addition to Sgt. Robinson, Sgt. Smith had to discard his gear and so near was he to exhaustion after our short rations he had to be half-carried. I had been suffering from dysentery and nearly cracked up but Michael Clarke helped me along.

As I related before, we were just too late and before going to sleep on the beach, I heard Maj. Bursdon talking to the brass commander. When I awoke at dawn there was confusion with many men milling about and I was unable to find our party. I joined a party which boarded the MLC, on which we were later to escape, and there I met Smith. He told me that some of our party had gone off to try to find sailing-boats, make crafts etc., and the remainder had gone off into the hills with Maj. Bursdon. Smith had been too weak to accompany them. White flags were flying from the houses around and orders had been issued to destroy arms. Shoot men had moved to the hills to take cover but when

6 we managed to get one motor of our craft going, there were one hundred and forty men who volunteered to join us in an immediate attempt to escape. Many held back because they feared the dive-bombers, which came over soon after our departure. They bombed the beach in spite of the white flags but we were fortunate enough not to be observed by them because, I think, of a heavy heat-haze on the water.

I think you know now how we sheltered for a day on Landofula, then put to sea only to run out of petrol about thirty miles short of Labuan, drifting for eight days. We tried everything including a sailing-raft which Smith, another man and myself constructed. We put off on it but it was insufficiently buoyant and we had to return to the m.c. A sail made of blankets eventually did the trick and got us in but I must admit I hardly hoped to see the 3rd. regt again over the last two days.

Incidentally four m.c.'s have now arrived. John Fitzgarrings was the last to leave and the first to get in. I believe the members of our regiment who escaped on it have since returned to the unit. Smith and I were on the second craft, there were none of our regiment on the third but I do not know about the most recent arrival. It contained six Australians, five of whom are in hospital. That, I think sir, is about all I have to report about the escape. Possibly I have repeated much you already

I know, and possibly, there are further details you may desire which I shall be pleased to let you have as soon as possible.

In case I am sent to hospital and some time elapses before my return, I would like to place on record the conduct of Sergeant P. Parsons. Perhaps this has been done but I doubt it so I felt it my duty to mention the magnificent way he conducted himself while in action outside Melame aerodrome. As you will remember the guns would fire and then the crews take cover on my order if any of the aircraft around us approached the position. This happened many times but Parsons was always reluctant to leave his gun and was always the first to return. On two occasions I spoke to him for having just sheltered behind the shield. His conduct was an inspiration to the remainder of his crew and so well did they work, Parsons' gun fired by far the most rounds on the aerodrome. He was wounded later in the day but has, I believe, since rejoined the regiment. He is a first class M.B.D.

After our return to ~~Amiriga~~ the Major in charge of the staging camp gave us permission to proceed to Cairns for a day or two. General Plant heard that we were in Cairns and sent for me so that I could tell him the general picture of the last day or two in Crete and also of our escape. Lt.-Gen. Blamey then sent for me and asked for the same details. He then suggested that the other construction officer and myself go to the convalescent house - boat until we had recovered and put on a

8 little weight, and he made arrangements accordingly. Subsequently he sent Lt.-Col. Treloar around to see me in connection with a matter which is my second reason for writing what I'm afraid is much too lengthy a letter.

Lt.-Col. Treloar was for many years director of the National War Museum, in Australia, and has recently been linked with the Dept. of Information. He is now in the Middle East organising a department of military history and information. The immediate functions of this department will be to supply plenty of copy and pictures of our troops for the press in Australia, Great Britain and the United States and the ultimate function of the department will be the compilation of military history after the war.

Apparently the G.O.C. had received a telegram asking for an immediate start to be made with the supplying of more personal items about our troops and believing that the contributions I have been making since I ^{gave of that type} ~~gave it~~ the G.O.C. suggested to Lt.-Col. Treloar that he should offer me a position on his staff and get me to write the story of our voyage from Crete, immediately. This I have done, together with interviews with other escaping Australians, and the copy has been despatched.

I wished to seek your advice on the matter and to see if you were willing to release me for the work. Lt.-Col. Treloar suggests that I would be seconded to his department but he also emphasised that I should think

the offer over and discuss it with you. I am eager to accept the appointment for I believe I can write the copy required in the style suggested but after having lost so many of your officers sir, I can understand that you may not wish to let me go.

Lt.-Col. Treloar will be in Palestine in a day or two and that is why I am disappointed that I have been unable to return to seek your advice. I shall send this letter around to him in the morning and ask that he should take it up with him. It was his intention to see you sir after I had sought your advice.

Whatever your decision I shall be happy to accept it sir and look forward to seeing you and other members of the regiment in the near future.

2. TRAFFIC CONTROL AND CONTROL OF AUSTRALIAN MILITARY MOTOR VEHICLES IN MIDDLE EAST.

(1) Use of Australian Military Motor Vehicles.

The use of Australian Military Vehicles for private purposes is prohibited.

(2) Officers driving vehicles.

Officers may drive Australian Military Motor Vehicles only in the following exceptional circumstances:-

- (a) When the driver is incapacitated;
- (b) In an emergency; or
- (c) To afford relief to the driver on long journeys

(3) Front Seat Accommodation.

Only one person and the driver will occupy the front of any Australian Military Motor Vehicle, with the exception of cars and light vans fitted with gear change on the steering column.

(4) Civil Licences.

Civil licences are required to drive private motor vehicles in M.E. Military licences are not valid.

(5) Civilian Transport.

Civilian trucks which are requisitioned by the Army for the transportation of goods are only allowed to carry 12 passengers should the carriage of passengers be necessary.

(6) Speed Limits.

- (a) The following speed limits will be observed by Australian Military Motor Vehicles in Middle East and will not be exceeded by drivers of Mechanical vehicles and motor cycles:-

(b) In blackout areas between sunset and sunrise the speed limit for all vehicles will be 15 m.p.h.

(c) The speed limits for vehicles operating in the desert will be as laid down by the local commander but in no case will the limits laid down in (a) above be exceeded in normal circumstances.

(d) Notwithstanding the speed limits as set out in this paragraph, the driver of an Australian Military Motor Vehicle will not, whilst driving within a Town or Camp, exceed the speed limits set out on Military Notice Boards erected near the boundaries of or within the town or camp, no Australian Military Motor Vehicle will be driven on any road:-

(i) Recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition and use of the road, and the amount of traffic which is actually at the time, or which might reasonably be expected to be, on the road, or;

(ii) Without due care or attention or without reasonable consideration for other persons using the road.

(7) Traffic Patrols and Traffic Police.

Drivers of Australian Military Motor Vehicles will obey all signals of British Military Police, Australian Military Police, Palestine Police or Egypt Police on traffic ~~xxxxxx~~ patrol, post or point duty, or of any sentry or picquet or military policeman in any town or camp, and will stop if requested or signalled to do so, will produce Driving License on demand, and will give any information desired by any member of any such patrol or post or at any such point or by any such sentry, picquet or Military Policeman.

(8) Permitting Offences.

In the case where the driver of an Australian Military Motor Vehicle commits a breach of these orders, and an Officer or soldier senior to the driver is travelling in the vehicle, the Officer or soldier may be charged with 'Permitting' the offence. Should the Officer or soldier senior to the driver be charged with 'permitting' the offence, the driver will not be charged with committing the offence.

(a) The type of dishes, meat, tinned, at present being issued from Ordnance is very similar to dishes baking. The only difference is that dishes baking are a pressing with no seams whilst dishes meat tinned are manufactured in such a manner that a seam extends down the full depth of the dish at each corner.

(b) The use of dishes meat tinned for cooking is very unsatisfactory as heat causes the tinning to run out and adhere to the food.

2. REINFORCEMENTS MEDICAL EXAMINATION.

STROKE - AVOIDANCE OF.

It has recently come to notice that the practice of troops ^{not} wearing headgear when travelling in vehicles, on the march, is on the increase. O.C.s units will in future ensure that headgear is worn by all troops under their command, when travelling in vehicles, in order that stroke may be avoided.

FIELD CENSORSHIP) CORRESPONDENCE WITH ENEMY TERRITORY, ENEMY OCCUPIED TERRITORY, AND NEUTRAL COUNTRIES BORDERING THEREON.

All ranks corresponding with persons in enemy territory, enemy occupied territory, or neutral countries bordering thereon, will NOT place official postal address at the head of their letter, nor will they give indication in the body of the letter that they are serving in or with A.I.F.

The address to be placed at the head of such correspondence is:-

P.O. Box
Cairo
Egypt.

Sufficient space will be left after the word 'Box' to allow number to be inserted. No other address will be used.

Postage will be prepaid in stamps of the country in which the soldier is serving.

Correspondence will be placed open in an outer envelope which be addressed to the Deputy Chief Field Censor, G.H.Q., E.E. A slip be inserted in the outer envelope giving the writer's Army number; rank; squadron, battery, company, or other component part of the unit; unit. Green Envelopes will NOT be used.

Replies will be forwarded by the Deputy Chief Field Censor through the Army Postal Service.

Correspondence will NOT be franked in units but the Unit Censor will be impressed on the OUTER envelope. Neither a unit censor stamp nor any other stamp of a service nature will be impressed on the INNER envelope.

5. FIELD CENSORSHIP - (Contd)

In addition to security requirements, the objects of this measure are:-

- (a) To establish an address to which correspondence can be despatched without immediately focussing the attention of the enemy's censors.
- (b) To prevent suspicion being directed to recipients of letters as a result of their being in communication with members of the A.I.F.
- (c) To prevent any possible retaliatory action on the families and relatives of those serving with the A.I.F.

4. BASE P.O. RECEIPTS FOR RE-DIRECTION OF MAIL.

To obviate subversion by units to Aust Base Post Office of a copy of Casualty Returns, unit post orderlies will secure from unit orderly room, daily, or as frequently as possible, all essential information relating to personnel struck off or taken on strength. Commanding Officers will ensure that the information is regularly made available to unit post orderly. The latter will forward the information to Aust Base Post Office in accordance with technical instructions issued by the postal officer of the formation concerned.

Commanding Officers of units, the R.E. of which makes no provision for the attachment of a member of A.I. Postal C., will arrange for similar action to be taken by orderly room clerk or by the O.R. detailed for post orderly duties.

5. NEXT OF KIN.

Any personnel whose next of kin or address of such has changed and who have not notified R.E.C. are required to do so immediately.

CORRESPONDENCE WITH ENEMY TERRITORY, ENEMY-OCCUPIED TERRITORY, AND NEUTRAL COUNTRIES BORDERING THEREON.

1. All ranks corresponding with persons in enemy territory, enemy occupied territory, or neutral countries bordering thereon, will NOT place the official postal address at the head of their letters, nor will they give any indication in the body of the letter that they are serving in or with the A.I.F.
2. The address to be placed at the head of such correspondence will be:-

P.O. Box,
Cairo.
Egypt.

Sufficient space will be left after the word "Box" to allow a number to be inserted. No other address will be used. Postage will be prepaid in stamps of the country in which the writer is serving.

3. Correspondence will be placed open in an outer envelope which will be addressed to the Deputy Chief Field Censor, G.H.Q.; M.E. A slip will be inserted in the outer envelope giving the writers Army number, rank, name, squadron, battery, company, or other component part of the Unit; and unit.
4. Green envelopes will NOT be used.
5. Replies will be forwarded by the Deputy Chief Field Censor through the Army Postal Service.
6. Correspondence will NOT be franked in Units, but the Unit censor stamp will be impressed on the outer envelope. Neither a Unit censor stamp nor any other stamp of a service nature will be impressed on the INNER envelope.
7. In addition to security requirements, the objects of this measure are:-
 - (a) To establish an address to which the correspondence can be despatched without immediately focussing the attention of the enemy's censors.
 - (b) To prevent any suspicion being directed to recipients of letters as a result of their being in communication with members of the A.I.F.

2. FIELD CENSORSHIP contd.

(c) To prevent any possible retaliatory action on the families and relatives of those serving with the A.I.F.

3. BASE P.O. RECORDS FOR RE-DIRECTION OF MAIL.

To obviate submission by Units to Aust Base Post Office of a copy of casualty returns AF W 3010, W3011, W3012 or W3034, Unit postal orderlys will secure from Unit orderly room, daily, or as frequently as possible, all essential information relating to personnel struck off or taken on strength. Commanding Officers will ensure that the information is regularly made available to Unit Post orderly. The latter will forward the information to Aust Base Post Office in accordance with Technical instructions issued by the Postal Officer of the formation concerned.

Commanding Officers of Units, the W.E. of which makes no provision for the attachment of a member of A.A. Postal C., will arrange for similar action to be taken by Orderly room clerk, or by the O.R. detailed for Postal Orderly duties.

4. RE-DIRECTION OF MAIL BY UNIT POST ORDERLY.

To enable mail for personnel absent from Unit to be forwarded by Unit direct to a known address, a special re-direction card will be on issue shortly to all ranks. On marching out on transfer or to hospital, all ranks should promptly forward a re-direction card to the Unit Post Orderly.

The card at present used for O.C. of Base Post Office, of any change of address, will continue to be used for this purpose.

5. CENSORSHIP.

2. SOLDIERS PAYBOOKS.

A number of cases have recently occurred of civilians offering to purchase from soldiers their pay books, sometimes for considerable sums of money.

Such civilians are unquestionably working on behalf of the enemy's fifth column, which is known to be operating in the Middle East. Any soldier approached by such agents should report the matter to the military police, and also soldiers should be made to realise the fact that lost or stolen pay books may sooner or later find their way into the hands of the enemy for the use of spies or fifth columnists.

The loss of a pay book is a military offence which calls for severe disciplinary action.

3. STERLING BANK OF ENGLAND AND CURRENCY NOTES.

The enemy, having come into possession of large quantities of notes in France and Belgium, is suspected of attempting to smuggle them into the Middle East thereby obtaining services or gold to be used to our detriment.

All ranks are warned that by accepting British notes from any one they may be unconsciously helping the enemy. They should therefore firmly refuse to accept any British notes at all. If anyone should receive any such notes legitimately, e.g., by post from the United Kingdom, he should report the matter to his C.O., who will, if he is satisfied as to the source, arrange for changing them into local currency through the army pay service.

4. WIRELESS INSTALLATIONS.

Officers and Other Ranks who have taken out wireless receiving licences will notify the Post Office of the disposal of any wireless apparatus in their possession in view of the importance of maintaining control of such apparatus in this country.

Notification will be made irrespective of whether the licence has expired or not.

POSTAL.

Many instances have been detected of personnel attaching Air Mail Stamps to letters in an endeavour to defraud the Commonwealth Post.

5. POSTAL (Contd).

All stamps are examined by experienced Postal Authorities and disciplinary action will be taken against anyone indulging in this fraudulent practice.

6. KING SOLOMON HOTEL - TEL AVIV.

On account of the theft of a large number of towels from the above hotel, personnel are requested, in future, to provide their own towels when staying there.

7. BARKES.

This is prevalent in this country and all dog bites must be promptly and properly treated. Any soldier who has been bitten by a dog or jackal must report to his R.M.O. without delay and report the circumstances.

8. DISCIPLINE.

Many kitbags of wounded, etc., have been returned inadequately labelled for delivery at Base Depot. On opening these to identify the owner some have been found to contain enemy hand grenades, mortar bombs, and other arms.

THIS PRACTICE OF PLACING AMMUNITION IN KIT BAGS WILL CEASE FORTHWITH.

Severe disciplinary action will be taken against the owners of any kit bags found to contain such items of arms.

9. URINALS.

Personnel are again reminded that the practice of throwing cigarette butts in Urinals must cease forthwith.

Severe disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

10. BOWLS OF CONDENSED FLUID.

These have been placed in Ablution areas for the benefit of personnel with sore feet, and personnel are advised to use same.

3. DISTRIBUTION OF SUBVERSIVE AND COMMUNISTIC LITERATURE.

It is believed an attempt will be made to distribute Communist subversive literature.

All ranks, guards and pickets will question and if necessary arrest any suspicious character in Camp Area.

4. DRESS - WARRANT OFFICERS AND NON COMMISSIONED OFFICERS.

1. The practice of affixing badges of rank on detachable wrist bands, in the case of warrant officers, and on detachable arm-bands, in the case of non-commissioned officers, will cease.

2. Badges of rank will be permanently affixed in an appropriate place in the approved manner. With summer dress, warrant officers may wear badges above the forearm when shirt sleeves are rolled.

3. White tape stripes may be worn on shirts, K.O., but will be of standard pattern, consisting of white tape stripes 2 in. wide and of same size as stripes normally worn on service dress.

5. AIR MAIL LETTER CARDS.

(a) As from 15th July 41, a reduced rate air-mail letter card service to Australia will be introduced.

5. AIR MAIL LETTER CARDS (Contd).

- (b) The postage rate will be threepence, and Australian stamps only may be used. Although the cost is much less than the ordinary air mail letter, there will be no distinction in speed of despatch and delivery.
- (c) The concession is available to all members of the Imperial Forces in the Middle East.
- (d) On application to any British Army Post Office A.I.P. personnel may avail themselves of the similar British Air Mail letter card service for correspondence with persons in U.K.
- (e) The Letter Card is designed to provide a writing space of one and a half pages, quarto size. Censorship arrangements will apply as in the case of letters. All ranks are specially warned that if anything is enclosed, the card will be sent by ordinary surface mail.
- (f) The available aircraft space and load is limited and it is therefore desirable that letter cards be used instead of Air Mail letters to the maximum possible extent.
- (g) Owing to the acute shortage of suitable paper all ranks are warned that wastage must be avoided. Strict disciplinary action will be taken if necessary, to check improper use of Letter Cards.

6. LATRINE WASH SLABS.

Two latrine wash slabs, consisting of an open cement slab and a stand pipe and tap are provided in each unit area. These are solely for the use of conservancy workers for the purpose of washing latrine buckets.

O.N.'s are reported to be using these taps for ablution purposes. All ranks are warned that this practice must cease.

2. M.T. VEHICLES - DEFECTIVE STUB AXLES.

(a) Breakages of Stub Axles are occurring in load carrying vehicles, mainly owing to the extra strain imposed by the over-sized wheels and tyres fitted to commercial type vehicles for Army purposes.



4. LOOT AND TRAFFIC IN ARMS.

I has been definitely established that members of M.N. Forces have been selling captured arms and ammunition.

From this, it is clear that the existing orders on this subject are not being obeyed. All ranks are reminded that it is forbidden to retain in their possession any public enemy property found on the battlefield. Anyone who disposes of captured arms to other persons is directly assisting the enemy, since such arms find their way to those who work for the enemy. Such action is an offence punishable by a sentence of two years imprisonment.

Any captured war material in the possession of army personnel will be surrendered immediately.

2. AWARDS OF COMPENSATION AGAINST OFFENDERS IN ORDER TO PREVENT FINANCIAL LOSS TO THE A.I.F.

(a) As a result of offences committed by members of the A.I.F., in some cases loss or damage has been caused to property or persons belonging to the A.I.F., and in others the A.I.F. has been put to the expense of paying compensation to private individuals or to local public authorities.

(b) Offenders, as part of their punishment for the offence, will be made to pay for the loss, damage or expense they cause.

Unless he is put under stoppages of pay in the Summary Award of Court Martial sentence, there is ordinarily no way of recovering from an offender, compensation for the loss and expenses caused by his offence. See A.A. Sec 46 (7) and Rules of Procedure R.6 (B)

(c) Attention is drawn to Army Act SS 137 and 138 and to Defence Act S 97, by virtue of which a member of the A.I.F. who commits an offence, can, by means of a Summary Award or Court Martial sentence, be put under stoppages of pay in order to recover from him any of the following counts:-

2. AWARDS OF COMPENSATION AGAINST OFFENDERS IN ORDER TO PREVENT FINANCIAL LOSS TO THE AIF. (Contd)

- (i) The amount of any expenses, loss, damage or destruction caused to any private person or public authority by the commission of the offence.
 - (ii) The amount of any loss of or damage or destruction done by the offender to any buildings or property, whoever the owner may thereof may be.
 - (iii) The amount of any loss of or damage or destruction done by the offender to any arms ammunition, equipment, clothing, instruments or Regimental necessities or Military decoration or to any other article owned by the Commonwealth of Australia or by a Unit of the Military Forces of the Commonwealth.
- (d) C.O.s and superior Military authorities of the A.I.F. will therefore take the following steps to enable compensation for such loss, damage and expense to be recovered from the offenders by Summary Award of Court Martial sentence:-

- (i) In each charge there should be stated the nature and value of any expense, loss, damage or destruction alleged to have been caused by the offence.
If the C.O. has not already obtained adequate information regarding the extent of the losses and expenses caused by the offence, the accused, after being charged, should, if the circumstances of the case are not sufficiently grave to justify his being held in custody, be released pending the receipt of further information, without prejudice to his re-arrest in accordance with A.I.F. C. 404. The C.O. should take all necessary steps to obtain the requisite information as soon as possible thereafter.
- (ii) C.O.s (and also Summary Authorities within the meaning of the Army Act 1907) should, whenever losses or expenses have been caused to any public authority or private person by the offence for which they convict the accused, include in each Summary Award and award of stoppages of pay as compensation in respect of such losses or expenses.
Such an award of compensation can be inflicted conjointly with any other Summary or minor punishment (A.I.F. C. 411 (a)). C.O.s in awarding compensation, will award it as a stoppage of pay and for a specific sum (A.I.F. C. 411 b). Correct forms of sentence are to be found in the Second Appendix to the Rules of Procedure (Manual of Military Law 2 758 (c)), and should always be followed.
- (iii) A C.O., before applying for a Court-Martial against any member of the A.I.F. under his command, will ascertain, and will include in the "particulars" of the charges, as accurate details as possible concerning the amount of losses and expenses caused to the Army or to any private or public person or body as a result of the offence with which the accused is charged (Rules of Procedure, 10 (v) and First Appendix (note (23))).
If the accused's C.O. does not include such details in the "particulars", the convening officer will ascertain such details and ensure that they are included in the "particulars" of the charge before the accused is arraigned and tried.

It is the duty of all Officers and other ranks to report cases of speeding and bad driving immediately, and all such reports are to be investigated most carefully.

7. PHOTOGRAPHS.

The practice of forwarding to Australia personal photographs taken in such a manner as to show the portrait superimposed or inset on facsimile Australian bank notes in the blank oval space reserved for the watermark will cease. The possession of such photographs in Australia constitutes an offence under the Commonwealth Bank Act, and any person within the Commonwealth in possession thereof is liable to prosecution.

2. COLOUR PATCHES.

For Security reasons, the practice of obtaining Unit Colour Patches from any other source than A.A.O.C. will cease immediately.

3. CAMP AREAS. - CONTROL OF HAWKERS.

Fruit sellers and hawkers of goods generally are NOT to be permitted entry to or operate in the vicinity of camp areas. It is the responsibility of area and Camp Commanders to ensure compliance with the above.

4. THROWING OF BOMBS AND GRENADES AND FIRING OF SMALL ARMS FROM TRAINS.

This practice constitutes a serious offence for which, if proved at a Court Martial, a severe sentence of imprisonment may be awarded, and, if fatal injuries result, the offender is guilty of manslaughter and is liable to penal servitude for life.

In view of their seriousness, all such offences are to be regarded as Court Martial offences, and further, they will on no account be disposed of without prior reference to H.Q. A.I.F. (ME).
