R. A. A. F. PILOTS JOIN CIVIL AIRLINE.

Some R.A.A.R. pilots who have become famous for their exploits overseas are to join the flying staff of Australian National Airways.

They are being released by the R.A.A.F., and will be the vanguard of men who have perfemend outstanding work in the war few whom vacancies will be found in Australia's civil airline operations.

The men appointed to A.N.A's flying staff are: -

Squadron Leader E.H. O'Neill, D.S.O, D.F.C., and Pathfinder;
Squadron Leader Frank Fischer, D.F.C., D.F.M; Squadron Leader J.F.P.
Brough, D.F.O: S/Idr. K.W. Kaufmann, D.F.C. and Bar; S/Idr. A.H. Green;
F/Idr. F.M. Griggs, D.F.C., D.F.M. and Pathfinder; F/Idr. M.C. Shiphard,
D.F.C. and Bar; F/Idr. A.W. Wales, D.F.C., D.F.M; F/Idr. S.A. Lindsay;
F/Idr. R.M.D. Thomson; F/O. C.W. Watt, D.F.M., F/O. P.D. Elliott, D.F.M.

The appointment of these pilots from the R.A.A.F. represents the first major move in the postwar development plans of the company.

Most of the men have had considerable experience in flying heavy bombers, and are now undergoing an intensive course of training to get them ready for the change over to civil airline flying.

Most of these men are veterans of the air war over Europe and have many operational sorties behind them.

Squadron Leader Brough took part in a raid on Wilhelmshaven the day after war was declared, when Blenheims and Wellingtons attacked enemy warships entering the harbour. A quarter of the force did not come back.

Squadron Leader Kaufman once commanded Australia's most famous bomber squadron - No. 460, still operating from a base in Britain - and won his second decoration while in command of this unit.

Squadron Leader C Neill was on the first Australian course of Joint Air Training Plan trainees to reach Britain. He arrived in December, 1940 and afterwards flew Wellingtons, Lancasters and Mosquitos over Europe. Throughout his last tour he was closely associated with Flight Lieutenant Griggs, another outstanding bomber pilot. Griggs won the D.F.M. as a sergeant when the Stirling he captained was attacked by five fighters returning from a raid on Bremen. His crew shot down three of them. O'Neill and Griggs have each completed about 70 operational sorties over Europe.

Flying Officer Watt was a Bomber Command pilot who in the first raid on Italy flow his Lancaster over the Alps, and bombed on three engines an exploit which won him the D.F.C. on 9/7/40
