7. It is also an Air Ministry directive that all references to Australian personned in the Form SAI and SAO shall have the prefix AUS against their nemes, and shall include their personal amplews.

8. So that a comprehensive history of your squadron may be written, it is particularly requested that two copies of all combet reports be forwarded monthly with the Operations Record Book.

9. It is hoped to establish personal contact with the squadron in the near future.

NOVEMBER, 1943

NOVEMBER 25th, 1945. FORMATION. 463 Squadron started forming on this day at Waddington under the Command of Wing Commander R. Kingaford-Satth.

'C' Flight of 467 R.A.A.F. Squadron, commanded by Flight Lieutenant H.B. Locks, D.F.C. was transferred in its entirety to 465.

MOYSIGER 26th, 1983. PROT OFRECTION - REALTH, Six aircraft took part in the Squadron's first operation and the target was Serlin, Lancaster captained by ims. 3657 p/8gt, Sunders, A.J. was attacked by a Ja.83, but after many hits registered by the Lancasters gunners, the enemy increaft was seen to explode and dive many out of control. Unfortunately the Squadron lost one aircraft. The crew were: - ama, A16649 78gt, Forlier, J.W. 8gt williams, Jal.9 8gt. Barker, J.W., 8gt. Thomas, J.W., 8gt. Perrier, J.P., Aus. 42766 8gt. DECKMBER, 1943.

DECORDER 2nd, 1945. RAID ON BERLIN. Five crews took off to take part in the raid on Berlin. Four were successful and returned safely. The fifth returned early with engine failure.

DECEMBER Ind, 1945. RAID ON LEDVID. Only one aircraft from the Squadron took part in this raid. The target was successfully attacked and the aircraft returned safely to base.

DECEMBER 16th, 1943. RID ON HERLIN. Another raid on Berlin and this time thirteen aircraft took off. Lancaster captained by Aus. 416418 P/O. D.C. Dunn was shot up by flak and his bombailer wounded in the log, but all aircraft returned safely.

DECOMBER 20th, 1945. RAID ON FRANKFURT. Nine aircraft took off to attack Frankfurt but one returned early owing to the port inner engine catching fire. All aircraft returned seely.

DECLINE 23rd, 1943. RAID OF REGIM. Berlin again and 12 aircraft took part. Ams. ACOLOY P.O. A.R.S. Domman half his port engine but by flak over the target, and one aircraft failed to return. The crew were: - P/O. A.W. Heep, Sgt. Carber, N. 7/O. R.S. Gall, Sgt. McCreadie, D. Sgt. Ryan, led Sgt. Thurshifting P.O. and P/Sgt. Glover, M.R.R.

DECEMBER 25th, 1943. Stand down, and a very good Christmas day was enjoyed by all.

DECEMBER 29th, 1943. RAID ON BERLIN. Nine aircraft took part in another successful attack on Berlin and all returned safely.

JANUARY, 19hh.

January 1st, 15hh. BAID SK REKIM: Prelay aircraft took off to stock Erils and ten were successful. Cloud conditions under estem Kerlin and ten were successful. Cloud conditions under chearvation of results difficult but the glow of fires could be seen. One sircraft returned early, being unable to gain height. One eircraft failed to return. January 2nd, 19sh. BAID OR BELLEY. Eight sirewest took off to estable Bessin, five were successful, sive returned early, with engine and ioing trouble and one failed to return. Innensure ceptained by Aus. 568; 71t. Nortiser, N.J. was attacked by an enery fighter, and damage was sustained, but no casualties. The ensury fighter is claimed as damaged. Aus. 15280 970. Smith and crew also claim a 10.88 damaged. The missing crew ware: - Aur. 410002 F/Sgt. Westbertill, J., 8gt. 0cord. A.E., 970. Gape. J.R., Aus. 42920 Sgt. tocopy, F.H., Ays. 42640 Sgt. January 5th, 1984. BAID OR STRVING. Right sirereft took off and swore concentrated. One sireraft returned early - unable to elimb. Lancaster captained by Aur. 415387 7/0. McMinight claims a Ju.80 damaged. All airreft returned early.

January 13th, 15th. VISIT. The Australian Chief of Mir Staff, Air Vice Marchal Jones, accompanied by Air Vice Marchal Jones, accompanied by Air Vice Marchal Stigley, Air Officer Commanding R.A.A.F. Oversees Readquarters visited the Squadron.

January 14th, 18th. PAID ON RECORDS. Thirteen eigenfit took off to attack brunsfet, tester were exceeded and the glos of firse could be seen through the clouds. Fighters were estive and three sirrerit were stacked. Lancaster captained by Ans. 11236 F/O. G.T. Beker escaped damage the enewy aircraft is claimed as damaged. Lancaster captained by Ans. 11175 F/O. Trimble, V.H. was bedly shot up. The A/B was lit by splinters and the rear gamer became unconscious due to damaged oxygen. The enemy aircraft was destroyed. Lancaster captained by Ans. 101908 S/far. 1018ce also claims a damaged.

January 20th, 194h. PATD ON ERGID: Rieven sircest took off to attack Berlin and all report as successful raid. Each bursts and the glow of fires were seen through the clouds. Sgt. Jurner, the mid-upper gunner of Lancaster captained by Aus. 15075 760.7.1. Merrill, was deed on reaching base, through lack of oxyges.

January 21st, 1984: BAIDS ON MANDEMENS & BENJIN: Thirteen strength took off, eleven to attack Hageburg, end two to ettack Berlin: All returned safely to base. As the Squedron was over Nagdeburg early it was not possible to assess results but fires second to be taking a good hold. Lancaster captained by Aus. 405867 3/0. J. Nancarrow returned early with engine trouble.

January 27th, 198h. B&TD OR BERLIN: Eleven structed took off to stack Berlin and one failed to return. Appeared to be a good raid. Little fighter opposition and flak was negligible. The missing grew wave: - Aus. 49722 F/O. Leslis, A. J.D. 8gt. Jones, F.R. w MO. Flynn, T.V., Sgt. Niggins, A., Aus. A2961 F/O. Chidgey, F.S. Aus. 417275 V/Sgt. Berrett, D.O. and Sct. Fallocer, J. January 28th, 1944. RAID ON RERIIN. Berlin again, and this time fourteen aircraft took off. Eleven attacked the target, one failed to return and two returned early owing to icing and technical trouble. Lerge explosions and concentrated fires were seen in the target area, which could be seen 150 miles away.

January 30th, 1944. RAID ON BEFLIN.
