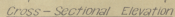
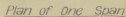
Sectional Elevation on C-D

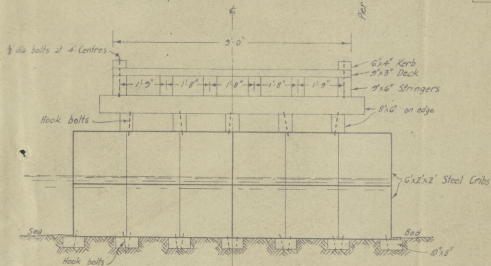
JETTY AT GARDEN ISLAND

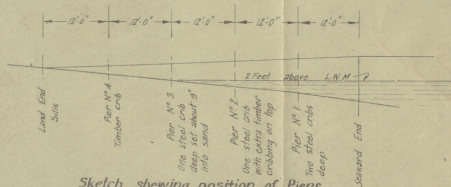
