A582/43 . PUBLIC STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES.

1. Members are forbidden to communicate with the press or to give interviews for broadcasting or to other media of publicity on military matters, whether by correspondence, personal interviews with press representatives or by any other means except in accordance with para. 3 hereof.

2. Members who have been on active service may give interviews on first hand experiences in battle to uniformed accredited war correspondents, provided that every proposed statement of the nature referred to in this paragraph will be submitted before publication for the approval of an officer of the Directorate or Public Relations. The publication of names of members above the rank of lieutenant is prohibited unless specifically authorised.

3. No restriction is placed on members in regard to articles, stories or poems for publication in the press, in periodicals or other publications, provided that these do not deal with military matters and that no indication of the military rank or unit of the contributor is given.

15. 7 AUST DIV ADM CIRCULAR No. A1/45.

1. GOC directs that special attention be given to GRO A489/44, paras 2 and 3, which read:-

"There is in the forces a large percentage of young men whose lives would normally be in the process of being moulded under the influence of their homes and religious institutions. With the temporary loss of these aids and the continual challenge to preconceived ideas which is being made by the new factors associated with army life, it is doubly important that suitable opportunities should be provided for the practice of religion.

The personal qualities which demand a high standard of conduct at all times and which inspire courage and self-sacrifice in a crisis are by nature spiritual, not physical, and these are essential to our nation during the war and in the difficult years which must follow. Hence, attendance at religious services should not be regarded as something interfering with training for war, but as a desirable adjunct thereto."

2. It is felt that the principles here laid down are so essentially true that every possible endeavour should be made to put them into effect. To this end nothing which is non-essential should be allowed to interfere with the normal Sunday Church service.

3. So far as possible training will be arranged with this end in view.

308. TOWN OF MOSSMAN - OUT OF BOUNDS.

1. As from 4 Dec, 44, the town of MOSSMAN is out of bounds to all personnel under comd 1 Aust Corps, except those on duty.
2. Personnel proceeding to or passing through MOSSMAN on duty will be in possession of a duty pass, stating the nature of the duty and signed by an officer of their unit.
3. A Pro Check Post has been established on the COOK HIGHWAY - NORTH of TRINITY BEACH. Personnel will not be allowed to pass this point without a duty pass.

9. EXTRACT FROM 1 AUST CORPS ROUTINE ORDERS of 18 Dec 44.

314. 8. EFFECT ON LWOP WHEN MEMBER IS ADMITTED TO CIVILIAN HOSPITAL.

(a) In the case of a member admitted to a civilian hospital, if the DDMS decides that the illness or injury is attributable to military service, the member's occupational LWOP will be suspended as from the date of his admission to the civilian hospital until the date of his discharge therefrom or his transfer to an Army Medical Unit, or until the date originally fixed for the expiration of the leave without pay (whichever first occurs). The member will be entitled to pay and allowances during the period of such suspension.

(b) If the member is not transferred to an Army Medical Unit, and if his period of LWOP has not sooner expired, his leave without pay will recommence upon his discharge from the civil hospital, and he will cease to be entitled to any pay and allowances until the date when his leave without pay expires.

(c) If the member is transferred to an Army Medical Unit, his leave without pay will be cancelled as from the date of such admission and his pay and allowances will be restored. If, on discharge from the Army Medical Unit, the member desires a further period of occupational LWOP it will be necessary for him to submit a fresh application through the unit on whose holding strength he is then carried to the Hq Comd or L of C Area.

(d) If, in the case of member on occupational LWOP who is admitted to a civilian hospital, the DMS decides that the illness or injury is not attributable to military service, the member's LWOP will continue without interruption until the date originally fixed for its expiration.

318. LETTERCARDS ISSUED BY PHILANTHROPIC ORGANISATIONS.

1. It has been brought under notice that lettercards similar to those issued free to troops on the basis of 2 per man per week, are being made available to troops by Philanthropic organisations.

2. Such lettercards are not accorded transmission by air mail unless the air mail fee of 3d., in addition to the ordinary postage fee of 1d., is prepaid in postage stamps.

3. TOBACCO & CIGARETTES - SPECIAL ORDERS FOR EXPORTS.

Owing to Manpower difficulties, tobacco manufacturers find themselves unable to supply full demands from the Services, including Australian Army Canteens Service and the Australian Comforts Fund, for tobacco in hermetically sealed tins.

This inability affects the total amount of tobacco available for First Aust Army areas and certain areas in AUSTRALIA where rapid deterioration of tobacco occurs if it is not so packed. Investigations with regard to alternative moisture-proof packs have shown that the same manpower difficulties would prevent any increase in the total amount of moisture proof packed tobacco available.

As it is considered undesirable from many points of view to cease free distribution of tobacco and cigarettes by the ASC in forward operational areas and by the ACF in their periodical distribution of parcels and in embarkation kits, the reduction must necessarily be borne by the AACB.

Any necessary alteration by AACS to the basis of weekly sales to personnel of tobacco and cigarettes will be communicated through service channels.

Troops are hereby informed that it is their responsibility to safeguard private property and that any cases of similar vandalism which come to notice will be severely dealt with.

24. ANIMAL MASCOTS AND PETS.

GRO A53/45 is reproduced hereunder :-

- "1. No animal or bird which is not on an authorised WE will be permitted to accompany troops or any member of the AMF.

2. The entry into Australia of animals or birds from places outside Australia is subject to strict regulations under the Quarantine Act, owing to the risk of the introduction of rabies, piroplasmosis and other diseases.

3. Under no circumstances will permission be granted for the conveyance by sea or air from places outside Australia to the C'wealth of Australia proper (including islands adjacent to the coast) of :-

- (i) Animals or birds on the WE of a Unit, whether allocated before or after embarkation from Australia; or
(ii) Living mascots, pets or other animals or birds, whether acquired before or after embarkation from Australia.

4. (a) BSOs and ATOs will take action with local quarantine authorities to have living mascots, pets, animals or birds, which disembark or deplane at a port or an aerodrome in Australia from outside the C'wealth of Australia, destroyed forthwith.

(b) Birds or animals on the WE of a unit proceeding from an overseas port to another overseas port may enter an Australian port en route, providing that such animals or birds are kept securely

on the vessel and are not permitted to land. The ESO will advise the local civil quarantine officer on arrival of the vessel and make necessary arrangements with him for inspection and security of the animals or birds.

5. When a Unit or detachment is moved from one location to another, animals which have been permitted by the CO to be kept in Unit Lines by members during their stay in the locality should not be left to fend for themselves or starve, on departure of the Unit or detachment but suitable action should be taken for their disposal or humane destruction."


