The lay-out was designed by the AFF.CC Lieut CASROLT. It is siright for a short rest but home leave is far more to be desired. All personnel who returned from "Octopus" Exercise were given the day off to-day to compensate for the loss of last week-end. The weekly beer issue to troops was released to-night.
