2. MOTOR TRAFFIC

From 1200 hrs 5 JAN until 1800 hrs 6 JAN 44 all traffic between Kapooka and Wagga will be diverted to what is known as the Burma Road, passing by the back of CDS to Narrandera Road.

3. UNIT CENSORSHIP

Unit censorship will, in future, be applied only to communications from a member of the AMP who is :-

- a. outside the mainland of Australia
- b. within an area of the mainland of Australia which has been "declared under National Security (Emergency) Regulations.
- c. in that part of Western Australia north of 20° south latitude, other than that part of Western Australia included in (b) above.
- d. in that area of Queensland north of the northern boundaries of the shires of Barkly Tableland, Cloncurry, McKinley, Wyangarie, Flinders, Dalrymple and Thuringowa.
- e. writing to an addressee outside Australia
- f. irrespective of his station, under order to move to an operational area from the time of receipt of the warning order or movement order.

A member who is rationed and quartered by the army, irrespective of whether he will be subject to unit censorship or not, he will continue to post his letters through Army channels in order that:-

- (a) unit censorship may be applied to letters, if required
- (b) the member may obtain the Army concession postage rate.

A member who is rationed and quartered by the Army, but is not subject to unit censorship will hand his letters in to unit orderly rooms :-

- (a), unsealed, in the case of letters addressed ~~over~~ over seas, to facilitate franking.
- (b) sealed in other cases, for unit censor stamping, as this entitles the letter to the concessional postage rate.

Green envelopes will be withdrawn from all troops released from unit censorship.

Until a revised field censorship instruction is issued, LMG Field Censorship Instruction No 4 will continue to be observed except to the extent that it is inconsistent with this order.

It is emphasised that the removal of the unit censorship does not release members from their obligation to observe strict security principals in their correspondence.



3. UNIT CENSORSHIP ( Cont)

- (a) That part of the state of Queensland north of 12° south latitude including all Islands forming part of that State which in whole or in part are north of 12° south latitude.
- (b) the Northern Territory of Australia
- (c) the Shire of Barkley Tableland and the districts of Baslingden, Heywood and Mount Isa in the State of Queensland.
- (d) that part of the State of Western Australia northward of a line drawn from Yampi Sound to the intersection of 20° south latitude with the Western boundary of the Northern Territory.

4. SWIMMING NOTICE

The danger from diving in the Murrumbidgee River owing to shallows and snags is brought to the notice of all ranks. Several serious accidents have occurred, one being fatal. The Commander has, therefore, ordered that the practice of diving from the banks or any structure on the river bank will cease forthwith. Any members of the Forces found disobeying this order will be summarily dealt with. This order must be read to all ranks on parade every Friday morning and must be exhibited on Unit Notice Board.







1. REVISED SYSTEM OF DRIVER ROUTINE MAINTENANCE FOR CARRIERS  
(ALL TYPES) AND "B" VEHICLES

1. The system of Driver's Routine Maintenance of carriers of all types and of "B" vehicles, prescribed by GMD G.70/1943 and by Mechanical Vehicle Training Pamphlet No 1- "Drivers Routine Maintenance" -1942" has been revised but will remain in operation until 31 March 1944.
2. The revised system is set out in detail in GMR Technical Instruction No. 319/44 of 25 January 1944 (hereinafter called "the instruction"). The system will be adopted and put into operation on 31 March 1944 in all respects except the use of new vehicle log books AAB 30A, AAB 30B and AAB 30C, which will be put into use later.
3. The present vehicle log book AAB 30 will continue in use until replaced by the new log books.
4. On and after 31st March 1944, and until the new log books come into use, weekly maintenance and all group maintenance will be recorded and certified as completed on a temporary "Record of Drivers Routine Maintenance" to be issued loose and used in conjunction with AAB 30 as under :-  
For carriers (all types) .... Insertion "A" to AAB 30  
For "B" vehicles (excluding motor cycles) ---- Insertion "B" to AAB 30  
For motor cycles .... Insertion "C" to AAB 30  
The temporary forms are identical with pages being provided in the new log books for the same purpose.
5. All completed weekly and group maintenance will be recorded on the appropriate "Record of Driver's Routine Maintenance" as set out in the instruction, Appendices "B" and "C".
6. Units will forthwith obtain through normal channels the appropriate temporary forms on a scale of five per vehicle.
7. Before use, the heading of Insertion "B" to AAB 30 will be amended by deleting "incl" and inserting "excl".
8. As soon as possible, units will commence the training of all personnel concerned with the operation or maintenance of carriers or "B" vehicles (including all spare and reserve drivers) in the operation of the revised system and the correct use of the appropriate forms. For this purpose, two temporary forms of the appropriate type per vehicle may be used - one by drivers and one by the WCO immediately in charge of or responsible for the vehicle.
9. On or shortly before 31st March 1944, units will issue from their holdings fresh forms of the appropriate type as under :-  
To Drivers ----- one per vehicle  
To WCO's immediately responsible - one for each vehicle under their charge, according to type.
10. One form of the appropriate type per vehicle will be retained as a reserve against wastage and urgent replacement requirements.
11. Drivers will keep the appropriate "Record of Drivers" Routine Maintenance" in the pocket of AAB 30 until it goes out of use and will then retain same, all entries prescribed by the instruction

REVISED SYSTEM OF DRIVERS ROUTINE MAINTENANCE FOR CARRIERS (ALL TYPE)  
A & "B" VEHICLES.

12. NCO's immediately in charge of or responsible for vehicles will keep safely one "Record of Drivers Routine Maintenance" of the appropriate type for every such vehicle and will make therein all entries prescribed by the instruction and carry out all prescribed inspections.
13. Formations will ensure -
  - (a) That all necessary unit training is commenced as soon as possible and is continued until all necessary personnel are thoroughly trained in their responsibilities and duties under the revised system.
  - (b) That particular attention is paid to the training of officers, WO's & NCO's in the objects of the system, the chain of responsibility under it, non-technical inspection within the unit, and recording complete routine maintenance and inspections;
  - (c) that the system of extra group maintenance is understood and that necessary extra group maintenance is promptly prescribed in the manner provided for in the instruction.

2. REPORTING OF ACCIDENTS

1. Where the driver of an army vehicle is concerned in an accident, he will forthwith report particulars of the accident to his unit by the most expeditious means available. This report will be made in all cases, irrespective of the amount of damage either to the army vehicle or to the other vehicle, person or property concerned in the accident.
2. The accident, if it involves damage however slight to any civilian vehicle, person or property, will be reported to a member of the police force or, if no member of the police force is at the scene of the accident, to the nearest police station.
3. The report of the accident to the civil police will be in accordance with the following pro forma. :-  
Report of accident to be furnished to the Civil Police

Particulars of accident :

1. Army number, rank, name and unit of driver concerned .....
2. Number of army vehicle concerned.....
3. Date of accident.....
4. Time of accident.....;
5. Place of accident (stating street or other suitable landmark)  
.....
6. Nature of accident.....  
(eg. running down pedestrian, collision etc)
7. Names and addresses, if known of any other person and the registered numbers of any others vehicles involved in the accident.....
8. Names of any witnesses of the accident (including military personnel) if required by state law./.....
- Each I. of C Area HQ. will ensure that a short statement of the motor and traffic laws, applicable to its area and relating to the reporting of accidents by the drivers of motor vehicles is compiled, and will issue copies thereof to all formations in or moving in to its area. Such formations will ensure that the contents of such statements are brought to the notice of all drivers of motor vehicles under their command.
5. The driver or other member of the forces concerned in or witnessing the accident will not give any information other than as particularised above to the police or to any other person or sign any statement unless the law of the state in which the accident occurred requires it. Drivers will make themselves familiar with and comply with the law of the state in which they are stationed, insofar as it relates to the notification of accidents and the giving of information concerning them.

3. MECHANICAL VEHICLES - USE OF GEARS AS BRAKES

The practice of approaching at high speed and then changing down to a lower gear, while still at comparatively high speed, in order to obtain the necessary deceleration when slowing down for any purpose e.g. stopping, entering gateways, negotiating corners etc. is still prevalent.

This practice which is forbidden, produces excessive engine speeds, causes unnecessary strain on the vehicle transmission system and is a contributing factor to rapid tyre wear.

(1) ADVANCES OF OVERDRAWN PAY.

A unit paying officer or pay representative will not make any payment that will cause the overdrawing of a members pay book, except as set out hereunder.

- (a) A member whose pay book is overdrawn may be paid within the limit of the restricted drawing rate which has been endorsed in the pay book by a member of the AAPC.
- (b) A formation paymaster or a depot paymaster may overpay a member to the extent of 75% of any estimated claim for travelling allowance on the written authority of the members CO, and such overpayment will be adjusted by the member on payment of his claim for travelling allowance.
- (c) A member proceeding on leave of more than 72 hours may be paid in advance against his credit earnings calculated to the date of expiration of such leave.
- (d) A member may be paid in advance in special circumstances (for example, prior to embarkation or upon disembarkation) when such payment is authorised by instructions issued by LHO. In exceptional circumstances, an advance against the security of deferred pay may be made where the necessary approval has been obtained in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Finance Officer.

F.111 FIRST VICTORY LOAN (Extract from G.O.C. 24 Mar 44.)

- (1) The first Victory Loan of \$150,000,000 will open for subscription on 28 March, 1944, and close not later than 9 May, 1944.
  - (2) Arrangements have been made to accept applications for Commonwealth Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the Forces serving in Australia or New Guinea who desire to invest their savings in the loan.  
PARTICULARS OF LOAN.-
  - (3) Loan applications may be made for an amount of \$10, or higher amount being a multiple of \$10.
  - (4) Stock will be inscribed at par for amounts of \$100 or multiples of \$10 above \$100 as required.
  - (5) Treasury Bonds are payable to bearer and are issued at par for \$10, \$50, \$100, \$500, and \$1,000.
  - (6) Interest is payable at 3% per annum if invested for sixteen years and at 2½ per annum if invested for five years and will be credited half-yearly to the members savings bank account or current account if desired.
  - (7) Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but will not be subject to any income tax under the law of a State. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the pound on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.
  - (8) Any bank nominated by the member will hold the bonds in safe custody for the member, if such is desired.
- REQUIREMENTS FOR BORROWING APPLICATIONS.
- (9) Application forms will be available from paymasters or may be obtained through unit pay sergeants and are required to be in duplicate. The applicants signature will be witnessed by an officer.
  - (10) Sufficient credit must be available in the members paybook to cover the amount it is desired to invest in the loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the paybook.
  - (11) Paymasters may accept cash in payment of a loan subscriber in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the paybook to establish credit and an official receipt issued and pasted in the paybook.
  - (12) The Commonwealth Bank will forward to members an interim receipt for the amount subscribed.

General.- (13) Both Treasury and Inscribed Stock are readily realisable and may be sold at any time. Any bank will arrange this for the member, if desired.
