ROYAL PARK.	1 MAY: 42		"Regard the war diary and its appendices as a living story, and as a pledge for the units future recognition in the annals of the war effort". Colonel B.J. Andrew, D.A.G., A.I.F. A.I.F. Circular No. 44/1940.	
			This is the first entry in the War Diary of 4 C.W. Coy. R.A.E. O.C. at the time of writing is Lt. G.A. Ham.	
			M.B. S.M. 5689 of 27 Mar. 42, gave the long awaited authority to proceed with the formation of the unit on a 25% nucleus basis. It is regarded as essential however, that at this stage some record be made of the work that led up to the formation of this unit and that helped to a large extent to make a section at least of the A.I.F. and A.M.F. "gas minded".	
			Actually, a certain farsighted group had long been practising methods of chemical warfare, but, they were working without an establishment and, therefore, not being recognized as a unit, they had no "home". The stores they worked with came from many sources. Much was procured by the individuals themselves. Some were borrowed, some procured by other means.	
			Headed by Lt. B.V. Heath, the activities of this group actually commenced in the last month of 1940, when he became C.I. of the S.Comd. A/Gas School, superseding Capt. I. Barnes.	
			As the months went by there were the inevitable changes in the staff of this School, but Lt. B.V. Heath continued to be C.I. joined in Feb. 41 by Sgt. G. A. Ham, by Lt. N. Polglaze in April, and in May by W.O.11 S.G. Horsey, A.I.C.

			Although carrying out efficiently the training of Officers and N.C.O's of S.Comd. in methods of anti-gas training, all members of the staff were anxious to learn more about, and practice more, methods of offensive gas warfare.	
			The first course of "Tactical and Technical use of Chemical Weapons" was No.10.A. conducted at Balcombe between 12 and 24 May, 41.	Syllabus attached, also Gr. order issued for exercise held during course (Nonsens?)
			The formation of a C.W. Coy. in the A.I.F. was eagerly awaited, but it never came.	Appendices I & II.
			In September 41, S/Sgt. P. Kennedy, Sgt. P. Childs, Sgt. W. Findlay, and Sgt. Clarke joined the staff of S.C.A.G.S. Lt. Polglaze had by now superseded Capt. Heath as C.I., Capt. Heath now being C.W.O. S.Comd.	
			Then came the opportunity for this unofficial "Chemical Warfare Group" to operate as a C.W. Sub-unit in a large scale Army exercise - 28 Oct. to 1 Nov. 41. (inclusive)	
			Working with "Darforce" in the Corangamite Exercise, this group practised successfully, methods of chemical warfare, combined with Commando tactics. Working at night and using all the stealth required of this type of work, this sub-section consisting of Capt. B.V. Heath, W.O.11 S.G. Horsey, A.I.C., Sgt. G.A. Ham, Sgt. P. Childs, Sgt. W. Findlay, S/Sgt. D. Fraser, and Sgt. E.L. Clarke, actually located and later raided Divisional H.Q. of the opposing troops (Oceanforce) under command of Major General Rankin. At the time, the location of this H.Q. was fully 20 miles away from the main "Darforce"

			The early issue of authority to proceed with the formation of the 4 C.W. Coy. R.A.E. was anticipated - with Lt. G.A. Ham as Chief Instructor, the elementary training during the first weeks of this course was thorough and comprehensive. Particular attention was paid to physical fitness and methods of unarmed combat, the services of W.O.11 Moore an expert in this work having been obtained.	
			The helpful co-operation of the respective C.O's of men attending the course has been obtained, and now, at the time of writing, these men, whilst continuing to be members of the course, are being absorbed into the nucleus of the 4 C.W. Coy. R.A.E. New men are being carefully selected, and after being taken on strength, then become members of the course.	
			This stage is probably the most difficult for any new unit. As yet, no authority has been given to open an Ordnance account, and consequently members have little more than the bare essentials of clothing, and no equipment, but morale is high and it is the determination of all ranks to overcome all difficulties, and adopt as the motto for 4 C.W. INFORMATION.

Regarding the Enemy.

1. The enemy will be represented by the personnel of S. Comd Course No. 10A. (Tactical and Technical use of Chemical Weapons). There will be two subsections representing sub-sections of C.W. Coy R.A.E. They will use gas in all forms, and will operate in an area to be decided.

Regarding our own troops.

2. Our own troops will be represented by the personnel of S. Comd. Course No. 10 (Anti Gas Tng). It will be assumed in all situations that both flanks are occupied by friendly troops.

INTENTION.

3. The following gas situations will be created at the following approximate times :-

(a)	1000 hrs.	An advance guard encountering a gas obstacle.
(b)	1100. "	Action by personnel on being sprayed from the air with blister gas.
(c)	1200 "	Action of sentries when encountering spray.
(d)	1230 "	Lunch.
(e)	1330 "	Sealing a gas crater.
(f)	1500 "	Action of personnel on being attacked by projectors.
(g)	1530 "	Crossing contaminated ground in the attack.
(h)	1530 "	Attacking through a gas cloud.
(i)	1600 "	Decontamination of rifles.

METHOD.

4. All personnel will assemble at H.Q., S. Comd. Gas School, BALCOMBE at 0900 hrs on 22 May 41.
5. M.T. for 60 persons and stores will be provided by 4 Div. A.A.S.C. at 0900 at H.Q., S. Comd. Gas School, and transport all personnel to point to be decided. M.T. will collect all personnel at 1645 hrs.
6. Further instructions will be issued in Appx I.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

8. Lunch will be arranged by 2nd Inf. Bde. for 64 persons.
9. Q.M.S., S. Comd. Gas. School will be responsible for details of lunch arrangements.
10. Q.M.S., S. Comd. Gas School will be responsible for all stores being placed on M.T. at 0900 hrs., including 5 extra respirators for visitors.
11. Further instructions will be issued in Appx II.

REPORT ON CHEMICAL WARFARE PERSONNEL.

by

CAPT. B. V. HEATH, C.W.O. S.COMD

A number of chemical warfare personnel exist in S.Comd.
who have been trained and can be employed in -

The use of gas (if available)
Tank hunting and destruction
Flame throwing
Use of forest and bushfires as an
offensive weapon.

These personnel are normally carrying out instruction
in Protection against Gas throughout the Comd., but they
can, if required, be quickly collected into one operational
group.

CHEMICAL WARFARE PERSONNEL.

ORGANIZATION - POTENTIAL EMPLOYMENT & TNG.

OBJECT

1. The object of this report is to provide information on the existence of personnel in S.Comd. who have been highly trained in defensive and offensive chemical warfare, tank destruction, flame throwing, and use of forest or bush fires for special tactical operations typically suited to Australian conditions. This small cadre can be rapidly expanded into an effective C.W. unit, and could at present be effectively employed in local operations.

ORGANIZATIONS

2. At the present time, the establishments carrying C.W. personnel are :--

- (a) C.W.O. H.Q. S.Comd.
G.S.O.III C.W. S.Comd. Base H.Q.

Note:- District and Divisional G.S.O.III C.W. have not been included in this tng.

- (b) 4 Chemical Warfare Coy. R.A.E. are authorized to call up for F.T.D. -

PRESENT ACTIVITIES

3. Anti-Gas The Anti-Gas wing of S.C.T.S. is continuously engaged in instructing personnel from units etc. as -

- (a) Instructors to their various units in P.A.G.

- (b) Unit repairers of Anti-Gas equipment.

4 Chemical Warfare Coy. R.A.E. personnel have been attached to various engineer units in S.Comd.

OFFENSIVE C.W. TNG.

4. When not otherwise engaged in RA.G. instruction and at various tactical exercises the personnel carry out tng. and practice in -

- (a) offensive C.W.
- (b) Tank destruction
- (c) Flame throwing
- (d) Control and use of forest and bushfires for special tactical operations suitable to Australian conditions.

5. Owing to the fact that Australian policy does not envisage the general offensive use of gas against an invading force greater attention has been paid to those activities which are practicable and will be useful to the Comd. in an emergency.

OFFENSIVE C.W.

6. The offensive C.W. activities which are practicable are :-

- (a) Contamination of ground with Blister gas, with chemical mines and ground gas bombs.
There is no production of Blister gas in this country at present. There is, however, a small manufacturing potential of about 1 ton per week. C.W. personnel are trained to locate and patrol possible enemy supplies, with the object of capturing and using enemy supplies.
- (b) Use of smoke and Harassing gases.
This has involved the study of wind, weather and other factors, the use of mortars, rifle grenades, generators and candles.
There is no large supply of lachrimatory or irritant gas in Australia but small supplies from time to time become available. There is a small manufacturing potential of toxic smoke (DM)

TANK HUNTING & DESTRUCTION

7. The nature of their constitution and tng. renders C.W. troops particularly adaptable to hunting and destroying tanks at close quarters. Methods which have been studied and practised are :-

- (a) Hand thrown incendiaries.
- (b) S.T. & contact hand thrown H.E.
- (c) H.E. traps, snares and mines.
- (d) Tank graves and delay features
- (e) Tank stalking.

FLAME THROWERS

8. Portable flame throwers used with initiative and daring can be employed in conditions where even armour piercing weapons are ineffective. Standard flame throwers are not available in the Aust. army but substitutes can be extemporised which can be produced quickly and easily. Two men would be required to operate one flame thrower, thus making 4 machines per C.W. subsection or 48 per C.W. Coy. Japanese landing operations include the use of smoke and armoured launches, which increases the difficulty of normal infantry weapons. The flame throwers used for opposing landings by water and on beaches, offer advantages, i.e.
- (a) Floating burning oil reaching a wider area than S.A. fields of fire.
 - (b) Flame and heat on 50-100 enemy per landing launch where they are for the time being confined.
 - (c) Directed flame on the beach delays and assists in disorganizing landings.

CONTROL & USE OF FOREST FIRES

9. Although setting fire to vegetation has certain major disadvantages, i.e. possibility of fire spreading to our own positions etc., there may be certain occasions when the bush fire weapon could be used to advantage provided the operation was carried out by skilled personnel.
- (a) The nature of Australian vegetation is particularly suited for bush fires.
 - (b) Small number of defending troops for large area to be defended may result in attackers gaining cover and spreading in the bush; where S.A. etc. is considerably handicapped. Controlled bush fire can clear temporarily large areas of ground for little expenditure of munitions.
 - (c) Bush fires are typically Australian and possible invaders would meet unfamiliar conditions of war.
 - (d) Factors affecting the control and spread of forest fires i.e. wind weather etc. are those which are studied by C.W. personnel in use of Gas.
 - (e) Under conditions of active war Bush fires may occur as the result of non-deliberate action. Opportunities may arise in certain circumstances to turn these to our advantage.
