The bleaching of articles of web equipment and gaiters, either by excessive washing with scap and sode or by other means, will come immediately.

Items treated in this manner are not only unduly conspicuous in action, but the treatment greatly deteriorates the material and reduces the life of the article.

Any such article will be cleaned only when it is essential and in such case will be washed in lukewarm scapy water and lightly scrubbed.

All franking officers will make thomselves thoroughly familer with the consorchip instructions set out in pen Z below and will explain it to all percentel of theth unit. Funding officers will also make themselves conversant with GRO 477/44 "Socurity and Composinj" which is to be read in conjunction with this instruction

Censorship Instruction:-

- (a) Montion of movement to this area will be restricted to the bare statement that a coldier has moved e.g. "I can now outside of Australia".
 No reference will be made to the name of type of ship or aircraft its armanent, duration of course of journey, escort vessels, number of troops or identity of other units seen or confacted, ships or aircraft sighted on route.
- (b) No reference will be made to port facilities, sirfields, identity of other units and numbers of troops in the area, malitary instellations or chemy action.
- (c) Personnel may describe local conditions such as climate, vegetation, fuane. proximity to the sea, provided that no information is given which discloses the location.
- (d) Personnel may state they are "on a Pacific Island" or a "tropted island" but they will NOT state that the island is butch territory or that they are in the NOTHERIADES RAST INDIES
- (e) Reference will NOT be made to descripe legding of pay nor will butch currency be mentioned or sent out of the area. Japanese investion currency issued for the FHILLIPIES may be sent but NOT the invasion currency issued for the NETHERALDE RAST INDIES.
