4. COs will ensure that only the really deserving cases, involving exceptional circumstances, are forwarded for approval."

835. SECURITY

852. CARRIAGE OF PETROL IN AMMUNITION COMPARTMENTS OF MARMON VEHICLES

1. It has been reported that oil and 4 gallon drums of petrol are being carried in Ammunition compartments of Marmon vehicles.
2. Owing to leakage from drums, petrol has saturated ammunition packages, causing not only a greater fire risk, but a detrimental effect upon the ammunition contained thereon.
3. Petrol will NOT be carried in rear of vehicles containing ammunition.

853. MISSTERS AND A.W.I.s - WARRANTS FOR ABSEES OF

1. First Aust Army Order A284/A2 is repeated :-
  - (a) "First Aust Army Orders Nos 96, 130, and 157 are cancelled.
  - (b) Attention is directed to AMR&O 461 as amended by serial No. 33.
  - (c) In accordance with AMR&O 461 one warrant only will be issued and signed by the C.O.
  - (d) The warrant, together with a descriptive report (AAF A52) will be forwarded by the C.O. direct to the HQ L of C Area in which it is considered the absentee may be.
  - (e) A copy of the descriptive report (AAF A52) will also be sent to :-
    - (i) Formation etc H.Q.
    - (ii) H.Q. of any other L of C Area in which absentee might be."

854. SECURITY

It has been reported that personnel of this formation have, when signing their names in visitors' books, etc., belonging to civilians, shown their unit and location in addition to their name and number.  
The practice of mentioning unit or location is absolutely forbidden. Personnel, when making such an entry, may sign only NUMBER, RANK, and NAME.

855. MOVEMENTS OF OFFICERS

All officers up to and including the rank of major must pass through REDLYNCH Staging Camp when moving from the area. Onward movement will be arranged by REDLYNCH Staging Camp. Under no circumstances are officers to communicate direct with Movement Control CAIRNS.

856. IGNITER SETS - GRENADES No. 36M - SUSCEPTIBILITY TO MOISTURE

1. The .22 R.F. Cartridge Cap, as used in the Igniter Sets for Grenades No. 36M, is highly susceptible to moisture.
2. Personnel handling Igniter containers will observe strictly the following procedure :-
  - (a) Igniter Sets are always issued in soldered cylinders. Should a cylinder be opened and the whole of the contents not expended, the cylinder will be resealed by effective adhesive tape or shellac binding.
  - (b) Detonators which show visible signs of corrosion or verdigris on the caps will be treated as suspect, as these are liable to produce blinds. Units will refer such detonators to an inspecting Ordnance Officer for determination of condition.
3. Units will keep the number of "ready use" Grenades to a minimum consistent with operational needs, and in tropical areas this number will not exceed four days requirements

## 857. WIRE GAUZE - USE ON .303- RIFLE BARRLS

1. All pullthroughs at present being supplied are fitted with wire gauze, the general use of which is approved on active service.
2. By reason of the fact that, under war-time training conditions rifles are subjected to almost continuous use, the use of pull-throughs fitted with wire gauze is now authorised under training as well as active service conditions.
3. The attention of all concerned is directed to SAT Vol.1 Pamphlet No.3 in regard to instructions for the use of wire gauze. These instructions will be strictly observed.

Owing to limited facilities for other ranks in ATHERTON privilege: extended to members of the forces by the AMERICAN RED CROSS CANTEN, are to be available for use by other ranks only.

Several instances have come under notice recently where the imprint of the Censor Stamp on telegrams has partially obliterated the address or text of the message. Censoring Officers must exercise more care in this regard in order that delay may be avoided.

361. DRESS

Winter dress will be taken into use as from 17 May '43 by all units under command 2 Aust Corps.

862. LEAVE WITHOUT PAY

1. In order to remove any misunderstanding by members concerning the effect of a grant of Leave Without Pay, irrespective of the authority under which such leave is granted, attention is directed to the provisions of War Financial (Military Forces) regulations, which provide, in effect, that all pay (including allotments) and pay allowances cease in respect of any period for which a member is granted leave without pay.
2. When Leave Without Pay is granted, the following will not be payable during the period of such leave :-
  - (a) Pay (including deferred pay);
  - (b) Field Allowance;
  - (c) Command Allowance;
  - (d) Special Allowance;
  - (e) Exchange Allowance;
  - (f) Dependants Allowance;
  - (g) Travelling Allowance;
  - (h) Subsistence Allowance;
  - (i) Any allowance payable under regulation 9 of the above-mentioned regulations
3. Leave Without Pay will not be imposed on a member compulsorily and, consequently, will always be covered by a written application by the member, specifying that Leave is desired without pay.

863. TROOPS ATTEMPTING TO TRAVEL IN GUARDS' VANS OR TRAINS

1. Complaints have been received that members of the Forces have endeavoured to travel in guards' vans of trains.
2. This constitutes a breach of the Queensland Government Railways by-laws (to which members of the Forces remain subject) and will cease.
3. Officers and NCOs will report any instances of this nature coming to their knowledge and will take particulars of any personnel involved.
4. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

1. Attention is drawn to FSPB No. 11A (Aust Edition) 1942 which lays down the procedure to be followed for the disposal of deceased soldiers' effects.
2. In Australia, this procedure is varied in that effects are forwarded by the unit or formation HQ to the formation Kit Store instead of to Officer in Charge of Records.
3. Attention is directed to Chapter 4, para 33 of this pamphlet, and examining officers should remove, before effects are forwarded to the Kit Store, any article which might cause distress to next-of-kin.

PETROL RATION TICKETS - ISSUES TO WOUNDED SOLDIERS

1. The Department of Supply and Shipping had advised that the special petrol allowances to members of the forces on leave or on their return from overseas have now been cancelled.
2. The Commonwealth Liquid Fuel Board has decided that State Liquid Fuel Control Boards may, at their discretion, grant, on application, a special ration allowance equivalent to one month's ration for the private user to any member of the forces returning wounded from active service.
3. Army personnel who are entitled to obtain petrol ration tickets, under the concession provided for in para.2 above, should make application direct to the State Liquid Fuel Control Board.

869. GOODS - PURCHASE OF FROM CIVILIAN SOURCES

1. It has been reported that individual soldiers are purchasing quantities of goods from shops in the Tablelands Area of a kind supplied as Ordnance and S&T issues, such as Hurricane Lamps and kerosene.
2. As goods being purchased are in extremely short supply and as stocks available to the shops are barely sufficient to meet necessary civilian requirements, it is obvious that purchases made by units or personnel deprive civilians of the ability to purchase commodities which for civilians are a day to day necessity.
3. It is realized that the above position is brought about by an endeavour to provide amenities and comforts for troops, nevertheless it is requested that it be borne in mind that they may be imposing hardship on the civilian population by making large outside purchases of items known to be in short supply.

1. OBJECT

a. The programme outlined hereunder is designed to provide training, work and duties in a manner most likely to give suitable occupation for a maximum of personnel during the existing trying and uncertain phase of the Regiment's existence.

b. The specialist classes in operating, D & M, gunnery and I, will be retained but attendance will be restricted to personnel who are bona fide interested in the respective subjects. Regtl and Sqn duties, work and fatigues will be carried out by volunteers on a semi-permanent basis. Men not occupied in specialist classes, duties, etc, will be grouped for training in Field Work and Minor Tactics.

2. DETAIL OF PROGRAMME

a. DAILY MARCH:- Sgns less duties and working parties will parade in column of route under Senior Offr or NCO in working dress on Camp Road at 0845 hrs from Monday to Friday for a march of half an hour duration. Starting Point:- RHQ. Q of M:- on 18 May 43 -- HQ, A, B; C, Sgns, Carrier Coy, but will be varied daily.

b. SPECIALIST CLASSES:- Classes given below will assemble under respective instrs at 0930 hrs from Monday to Friday. Period of courses will be indefinite but personnel may be varied from time to time. The syllabus will be at the discretion of the Instructor-in-Charge, subject to RHQ approval. Personnel attending will be exempt from all duties from Monday to Friday. Selection and allotment to classes will be made on 17 May (para 2 sec h).

c. DRAINAGE PARTY:- The camp drainage system will be completed by a permanent party of twelve volunteers, working under the direction of WO Wilshire from Mondays to Fridays and commencing 0830 hrs. This party will be exempt from all duties from Mondays to Fridays.

d. CAMP FATIGUES AND DUTIES:- These less the Guard will be carried out by personnel who have volunteered on a permanent basis.

e. GUARD:- Commencing 17 May, guard will be mounted by Sgns in rotation, in the usual order. Permanent duties are exempt from all guards. Specialist classes and Drainage Party are exempt from Mondays to Fridays.

f. FIELD EXERCISES AND MINOR TACTICS:- All personnel not covered by para 2, secs (b), (c) and (d), will train in the Field from Mondays to Fridays, under the Senior Offr or NCO available. An outline of the work to be carried out will be provided by RHQ. This group will assemble in the Recreation Hut daily at 0930 hrs for organisation and explanation of the day's work.

g. ORGANISATION:-

- (i) Sgns will assemble under Senior Offr or NCO with Nominal Rolls in the rear of the Officers' Mess at 0845 hrs on 17 May to be organised into classes, groups and duties.
- (11) When organised according to (i) above, Sgns, Instrs and RHQ will keep a Nominal Roll or other record of the allotment of their personnel.
- (111) Instruction and work outlined in this memorandum, will commence on completion of the organisation given in this para

On 19 DEC 42 during an attack on an enemy position on the SRINANDIA Pt. rd. at 190267 Spr. HOOKE's Sp. LDR. had been badly wounded and HOOKE went to his assistance. In so doing he was wounded in the right arm but still persisted, although he was again wounded, until he realised his Sp. Ldr. was beyond assistance. In spite of his wounds he remained with his Sp. in action until he received a third wound when bearing a message to his SQN HQ.

Later when a defensive position was formed and the wounded collected therein, Spr. HOOKE displayed great fortitude in carrying on his normal duties as a Soldier for a further 5 days till the wounded could be evacuated.

70. CENSORSHIP - MAIL

- (a) Many instances of breaches of security have occurred recently by personnel including in letters, locations and strength of units in this area.
- (b) Most of these breaches have been discovered by BASE CENSOR in letters enclosed in GREEN ENVELOPES.
- (c) Troops must understand that the issue of green envelopes is a privilege to enable them to write purely personal letters, without censorship at the unit, and such letters must NOT include any information whatsoever of a military nature.
- (d) Breaches of security of this nature will be severely dealt with.

71. NEWSPAPERS - FORWARDING BY POST

- (a) The following will NOT be transmitted by post or any other means:-
  - 1. CAIRNS POST
  - 11. FOLDERS, POSTCARDS or VILWS whether named or unnamed of this or adjoining areas which could disclose the location of the sender.
- (b) TABLE TOPS may be transmitted by post.

72. WELFARE WORK DONE BY THE RED CROSS

- (a) The Red Cross Society's Field Force Unit is now established in and operating from the ROCKY CREEK Area.
- (b) Searchers are attached and their services are available at any time for soldiers, both sick and well, in respect of any welfare enquiries which they wish to make. If a soldier is at all worried regarding the condition of his relatives he is at liberty to contact Red Cross Searchers in this area, either personally, by phone, or through his own Unit Officers or Padres. Sympathetic and confidential investigations will be made by the Society in all bona fide cases.
- (c) The results of these enquiries will be transmitted direct to the enquiring soldier, without any publicity whatever.
- (d) This service, of course, is absolutely without charge and free of obligation of any kind, as it is an integral part of the activities of the Society in the Field.

873. DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

- (a) Complaints have been received from local inhabitants that their land, fences and buildings have been interfered with by army personnel. In many instances, wire has been removed from fences, fence posts used as firewood, doors and roofing material removed from buildings, and in some instances buildings completely removed.
- (b) This practice must cease forthwith. COs have been requested to co-operate by severely punishing any soldier found guilty of damaging or interfering with private or public property.

874. CLOSING OF GATES

Complaints have been received from local inhabitants that gates on their properties have been left open after troops have passed through, thus allowing livestock to escape. This causes great inconvenience to the owners and, in some cases, cattle that have escaped in this manner have not been recovered by the owners. It is the responsibility of the Officer or NCO in charge of the party to ensure that gates are properly closed after use..

875. MALTREATMENT OF CATTLE

- (a) It was recently reported that a number of cattle had been found dead. On investigation, it was found that they had been shot by bullets fired from a .303 service rifle.
- (b) The maximum punishment will be awarded any person found guilty of maltreating or destroying livestock.

876. STRIPPING OF BARK FROM TREES

- (a) The practice of stripping bark from trees in such a way as to ring-bark the tree completely will be discontinued.
- (b) Where bark is required for building purposes etc., it may be taken from those trees which have no market value and no more than half of the circumference will be stripped.


