INFORMATION. (1) "C" instructs, vide L.H.Q. Policy, re-arrangement of Guards of minimum required for reasonable security - conservation of manpower.

INTENTION. (2) Reduce certain guards to a working minimum forthwith.

METHOD. (3) "B" Coy. will reduce guards as follows as from 0900 hrs. Monday 4/1/43.

KITS AND EFFECTS OF ILLEGAL ABSENTEES AND KITS, EFFECTS AND EQUIPMENT FOUND IN RAILWAY CLOAKROOMS, ETC. GR.O. 4,636.

A. Kits and effects of Illegal Absentees :-

1. IMMEDIATELY a member of this Battalion, including A.W.A.S. or A.A.N.S or A.A.M.W.S, has been declared an illegal absentee, the following action will be taken in respect of effects other than those on charge to the member's unit.

2. The effects, after removal of items on charge to the member's unit, will be despatched to the section of Aust. Kit Store servicing the formation to which the member belongs. If there is not such a section the effects will be forwarded to the nearest Sub-H.Q. of Aust. Kit Store. Such effects will be accompanied by A.A.F. K.S.4, in duplicate, such form containing a certificate to the effect that the member concerned is an illegal absentee. The effects will then be stored with other kits and effects of members of the same unit.

3.(a) Such effects will be noted by Aust.Kit Store as those of an illegal absentee and will not be issued to the member concerned except on a request signed by or for the C.O. of the member concerned, either of his then unit or of a unit to which the member may be subsequently posted after being apprehended. If such member claims to have been discharged from the Military Forces and produces to Aust.Kit Store his certificate of discharge, arrangements will be made for the kit to be dissected in accordance with para (b) here of and the personal effects forwarded to the member at an address nominated by him.

(b) If such effects have not been withdrawn after the expiration of six months after deposit, Aust.Kit Store will ascertain, through L.H.Q. Records Office, whether the member concerned is still an illegal absentee. If such member is found to be still illegally absent, then the effects concerned will be dissected and dealt with by Aust.Kit Store as provided in the case of a deceased soldier by G.R.O. Q.178/1942 and Administrative Instructions for Kit Stores, 1942. If such member, upon such inquiry, is found to be no longer an illegal absentee, then the effects will be removed from the illegal absentee list and, if necessary, transferred to another section of Aust. Kit Store. In the latter case, the member concerned will be so notified.

B. Equipment and Effects found on Railway Stations, Cloakrooms, Hotels, etc.

1. Action as set out below will be taken in all cases where arms, equipment, kits and personal effects are recovered from railway stations, railway and other non-military cloakrooms, hotels and other sources. Such action will be taken by the member of Movement Control, Provost Corps, or other unit or person recovering the articles.

(a). Arms and equipment will then be returned to the nearest A.A.O.C. Depot. If the article can be identified, the owner's unit will be so advised by the A.A.O.C. Depot and the article will be struck off the unit's charge.

(b) Kits and personal effects will, if the owner and his unit can be ascertained, be forwarded to the section of Aust. Kit Store which serves the formation to which the member belongs. If there is no such section, such articles will be forwarded to the nearest Sub- H.Q. of Aust. Kit Store. Such Sub- H.Q. will arrange for the Storage of the articles and notify the owner.

(c) If the ownership of the kit and effects cannot be established, the same will be forwarded to the nearest Sub-H.Q. of Aust. Kit Store, by whom the articles will be dissected in accordance with G.R.O. Q.178/1942 and Administrative Instructions for Kit Stores, 1942. If the effects remain unidentifiable, the personal property therein will be stored by Aust Kit Store pending identification by description of contents, and the Army property therein dealt with as provided in G.R.O. 178/1942, para 5 (c)(ii). If ownership of the effects is established during dissection, then the effects will be sent to the appropriate Kit Store Section and the owner will be so notified.

2 Arms, ammunition, or equipment will not be deposited in cloakrooms other than those staffed by military personnel, nor will they be left unattended by military personnel in hotels, restaurants, cafes, or similar institutions.

POWERS OF SENTRIES AND GUARDS. G.R.O. A.662.

1. Regulation 8A of the National Security (General) Regulations (Statutory Rules 1942, No 374) provides that, without derogating from or restricting the existing powers or rights of sentries and guards, a military sentry or guard stationed or posted at, on, in, or in the neighbourhood or vicinity of, any prohibited place, protected area, controlled area, or any premises used by the Commonwealth, or used for defence purposes, or for essential services, or any vehicle, vessel or aircraft used by the Commonwealth, or any enclosed wharf or pick-up place, or any merchant vessel lying in port, or any road, pathway or waterway, specified in an order by the Minister, which passes through or near a prohibited place or work of defence, may be armed, and may -

- (i) use his weapons against, or otherwise attack, any person who, in disregard of a warning given by a sentry or guard, approaches, enters, leaves, or passes over or in the vicinity or neighbourhood of, or attempts to approach, enter, leave or pass over or in the vicinity or neighbourhood of, that place, area, premises, vehicle, vessel, aircraft, wharf, pick-up place, road, pathway, or waterway, or who, after being arrested for so doing, escapes;
- (ii) use his weapons against, or otherwise attack, any person attacking him or who is reasonably suspected of being about to attack him.

2. There are, however, certain principles which must guide all sentries and guards in the execution of their duty as such, and in the exercise of the right to resort to arms.

3. These principles are :-

- (a) Sentries and guards will be ordered to take any action required to ensure the safety of their posts or to defeat the activities of enemy, or suspected enemy agents.
- (b) If necessary, they will fire upon or otherwise attack any persons threatening the safety of their posts or engaging in hostile actions.
- (c) Before firing upon any person, the sentry or guard will, except in an urgent case of self-defence, challenge that person to "Halt". If that person does not halt, the sentry should challenge him again with "Halt or I fire". If he does not halt, and no other means are available for stopping him - as for example, by calling on the rest of the guard - it is the duty of the sentry to shoot.
- (d) The sentry will use his intelligence and sense of responsibility in choosing whether he will shoot or not, and he must be careful

EXTRACT FROM G.R.O. A.649. IDENTITY DISCS.

1. All ranks will be supplied with two identity discs which will be worn as shown below :-

(a) The No.1. disc (green) will be suspended round the neck beneath the uniform by 38 inches of cord, and the No.2. disc (red) will hang below the No.1 by the two being joined by 8 inches of cord.

(b) The following particulars must be stamped clearly and effectively on the discs as under :-

Front side.

- (i) Army number.
- (ii) Initials and name.
- (iii) Index letter(s) of religion.

Reverse side. - Blood group number (as shown inside back cover of Pay Book). The greatest care must be taken in stamping the group letters and figures on the discs, as an incorrect marking may lead to loss of a life which might otherwise have been saved.

(c) The index letters of the various religious denominations are :-

Church of England	C.E.	Congregational	C
Presbyterian	P.	Roman Catholic	R.C.
Methodist	M	Jewish	J.
Baptist	B	Salvation Army.	S.A.

(d) Discs that have been stamped with incorrect details are to be destroyed under supervision and any necessary replacements requisitioned for.

2. O.C.s Coys. will institute a check to ensure that every serving member of their Coys. is in possession of identity discs which are correctly marked.

4. Neglect to wear discs will be treated as a breach of discipline.

SALUTING. EXTRACT A.R.O. 7/43

- (a) The undermentioned extract from G.R.O. 3198/42 will be read on parades to all ranks, once per week -

W.Os, N.C.Os and private soldiers in uniform shall salute an Officer at all times, except when passing or being passed by him -


- (i) in a crowded thoroughfare or assembly; or
(ii) during an exercise in the field; or
(iii) when on parade under the immediate control of a superior; or
(iv) when precluded by the nature of their duties from so doing.

- (b) In view of the number of officers who have been recently commissioned, care is to be taken to ensure that they fully understand the implications of the provisions concerning saluting.

All officers are to salute their seniors before addressing them on duty or on parade. When not on duty or parade officers under field rank are to salute all officers of field rank and upwards. General officers and field officers are to salute their superiors in rank.

- (c) Officers are to salute officers in any of His Majesty's Naval or Air Forces and of the Allied Naval, Military or Air Forces, in accordance with sub para (b)

- (d) The instruction is applicable to all units, including H.Q., S.A. I of C. Area, the Services, Finance, Records and A.W.A.S. personnel. D.A.P.M. will instruct the Provost staff to check at different points at irregular intervals and bring breaches of this instruction to the notice of H.Q., S.A. I of C. Area, with a view to disciplinary action against offenders.

Members of the A.M.F. will not, unless authorised by the Commander-in-Chief, publish in any form whatever, or communicate, either directly or indirectly, to the press or radio any account of the escape of any person whatsoever from enemy or enemy-occupied territory or of the experiences of such person prior to repatriation.


2. Experience has shown that publicity of this character furnishes valuable information to the enemy and will jeopardize future escapes of Australian and Allied prisoners of war.

BROADCASTS OVER ENEMY WIRELESS BY AUSTRALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR. G.R.O. A.26

A member of the Military Forces who becomes a prisoner of war will not transmit messages over enemy wireless. The enemy's design, in arranging such broadcasts, is to enhance his own propaganda.

G.R.O. 0.36 CARE OF HAND TOOLS.

1. Demands for replacement of hand tools indicate that wastage is unduly high.
2. An acute shortage of these tools exists. Many types are not manufactured locally and have to be imported from overseas. It is essential, therefore, that all ranks be impressed with the necessity of ensuring that wastage is reduced to a minimum.
3. Care is to be taken that tools are used only for the purpose for which they are supplied.
4. Unit commanders and officers or other ranks in charge of workshops, etc., are to take all action necessary to ensure that these instructions are observed by personnel under their control, and that appropriate steps are taken to ensure the safe keeping of hand tools on issue.

Where a second figure is shown, it denotes the maximum permissible speed on bad surfaces.

(b) Army drivers are subject to the traffic regulations of the State authorities, and must observe all the rules of the road and obey orders and signals from traffic police and members of the Provost Corps.

2. Operational.

It is emphasised that the above speeds do not apply in operations against the enemy. When in or near contact with the enemy, vehicles will move at a speed dictated by the tactical situation.

3. CONVOYS.

Particular attention is directed to the calculation of time tables when preparing operation orders. It must be remembered that the average road speed is necessarily below the maximum permissible. (Reference F.S.R. & Military Training Pamphlet No. 47.)

4. General.

Armies, Corps and H.Q. L of C. Areas are responsible to ensure that traffic is properly policed in their areas and will instruct the Provost Corps to see that traffic laws, both Army and Civil, are observed.

The necessity for prompt disciplinary action in the case of breaches of this instruction is stressed.


