Appendix 2a1 - 3 Aug 44AIR CO-OPERATION1. SUPPLY DROPPING.

- (a) Four containers were dropped at 020930K and four containers at 021030K.
- (b) 100% recovery from all 8 containers.
- (c) Rations dropped consisted of fresh bread, lettuce, butter, potatoes, flour, tea, sugar, tinned beans, bully beef, cheese and dried fruit.
- (d) The first 6 containers dropped landed within 50 yards of the strips laid out, whilst the last two containers landed on the strips themselves.
- (e) All troops saw the dropping and now have complete confidence in supplies being dropped to them from the air.

2. GROUND TO AIR RT WIRELESS COMMUNICATION.

- (a) No trouble was experienced in establishing ground to air RT communication.
- (b) The maximum time from when aircraft was first seen until communication was established was less than three minutes.
- (c) Signals were so loud that the volume control had to be turned right down in order that the speech was not distorted.
- (d) Signal personnel now have confidence in establishing communication with aircraft.

3. TAC R.

- (a) 4 sorties were flown over the ~~xxxx~~ three days. One at 011030K, one at 021030K and the other two at 031030K and 031400K.
- (b) The first three sorties results were dropped on stationery HQs, whilst the last result was dropped to a Sqn HQ whilst on the move and no pin point reference could be given except the route the Sqn was taking. The pilot had no difficulty in locating the HQ.
- (c) All messages dropped landed within 10 yards of the strips laid out.
- (d) Information from the Tac R was checked by the troops and in all cases found to be most accurate and thus greatly impressed them, also they were amazed at how much could be seen from the air.
- (e) Troops are gaining more confidence in Air Co-Operation and with more practice will be quite confident of the use of Air for gaining information.

2/10 Aust Commando Sqn War DiaryAUG 44Pioneer Sec Training Report Aug 44

Sec commenced two weeks training with 2/2 Fd Coy, R.A.E. on 31 Jul 44. Training consisted of the following:- Mon, Tues, Wed; Demolitions, preparing and calculating charges, (cutting, Bore hole and Mine charges). Types and uses of explosives. The Sec did quite a lot of work in cutting down trees with both bore hole and cutting charges. On Wed 2 Aug we completely demolished a wooden bridge Blass, 4 in the trg area of the 2/2 Fd Coy.

3 Aug, 4 Aug and 5 Aug were taken up with mines and booby traps. On 4 Aug we saw a demonstration by a pl of 2/2 Fd Coy of a new drill they had worked out for lifting mines on jungle trails and in semi open country.

7 Aug 44 - Commenced work on a lawyer cane foot bridge to span a 60 ft gap. 8 Aug 44 Completed foot bridge. 9 Aug 44 commenced work on a wooden trestle bridge to carry 4 ton across a 40 ft gap. Bridge was constructed with all bush timber and a coil of wire. 10 Aug completed trestle bridge and tested it with a 3 ton truck. 11 Aug 44 the morning was devoted to tool maintenance and the afternoon to the construction of boats with 4 ground sheets for improvised river crossings. Boats were constructed out of bamboo and ground sheets. 12 Aug - tested boats and found that a boat constructed with 4 ground sheets would carry 3 men with equipment. Tested jeep trailer and found it would carry 750 lbs with 6 inches of free board.

Report on INTSEC Long Range Patrol 14-20 Aug 44.

Monday 14 Aug 44 :

Left WONDECLA Camp Area at 0820 hrs and arrived at NORTH JOHNSTONE RIVER, 595120, at 1700 hrs

Four days rations were carried, also two 108 sets complete with spare batteries.

Distance covered during day: 23 miles.

Tuesday 15 Aug 44 :

Left NORTH JOHNSTONE RIVER, 595120, at 0800 hrs and arrived at HOUSE, 676126, at 1030 hrs.

On arriving in the BARTLE FRERE area it was decided to alter base from BOONJEE, 691103, to HOUSE, 676126, and also to establish an OP on BARTLE FRERE NORTH PEAK, 772128, in lieu of BROKEN NOSE, 800077.

One 108 set was left at HOUSE (Base) and was manned by LCpl HOLBROOK, Tprs RICHARDSON AND ELPHICK. Tpr McLEAN of INTSEC also stayed at base.

INTSEC with three sigs, Tprs CLINTON, BAKER & WALSH and the remaining 108 set pushed on at 1230 hrs on a bearing of 90° with intention of reaching RUSSELL RIVER and from there climbing spur to NORTH PEAK.

The terrain covered in this stage was extremely difficult. Precipitous gorges made progress slow, laborious and dangerous, one member of the patrol having his hat knocked off by a rock weighing approx one Cwt dislodged some thirty feet above him. Marching on a compass bearing was impracticable owing to the rugged nature of the country and at 1700 hrs a halt was called, the sec bedded down for the night in a small clearing. Whilst the sec was bedding down, Lt BOW and Tpr DUNWOODIE carried out a recce with a view to determining a route for the following day. A network of timber tracks were found but none of them led in the desired direction. From a vantage point NORTH PEAK was observed through the tree tops, this was the first glimpse of the objective since leaving base

Contact was established by wireless to base at 1800 hrs. Bivouac area for night was 719125.

Distance covered during day: 12 miles.

Wednesday 16 Aug 44 :

The sec broke camp at 0800 hrs and moved out on a bearing of 90°. Once more extremely difficult country was encountered and after two hours marching, track running NORTH and SOUTH as shown on map was reached. As it was realised that the party was too large and was carrying too big a load to continue the cutting of spurs, a conference was called and it was decided to follow the track out to the clearing at 710150 with a view to making a fresh start. The edge of the clearing 714149 was reached at 1230 hrs. Wireless communication was established to base at 1245.

Tpr BAKER (Sigs) and Tpr WOODHOUSE (Int) returned to base.

Remainder of party left clearing edge 715155 at 1345 hrs and followed an old timber track in a general easterly direction to FALLS at 752162 which was reached at 1430 hrs. Recces were carried out along various recently made tracks with a view to finding an approach to a suitable spur. This occupied the remainder of the day. Party bedded down for the night in a deep gorge beside a swift flowing stream at 753160.

Lt BOW and Tpr DUNWOODIE carried out a recce and located a spur at 757166 which they considered would be suitable for the following day.

Distance covered during day: 15 miles.

Thursday 17 Aug 44 :

Party broke camp at 0730 and moved to spur 757166 blazing a track as they followed the spur.

Report on INTSEC Long Range Patrol 14-20 Aug 44.Thursday 17 Aug 44 (Cont):

After much hard climbing, a fair amount of which was through heavy Vine Forest, the top of NORTH PEAK was reached at 1200 hrs.

Tprs CLINTON and WALSH were rewarded for their efforts in carrying the 108 set by making contact with base at 1215 hrs, and passing what was probably the first message transmitted from the top of BARTLE FRERE.

The return journey to HOUSE base was commenced at 1330. Light rain commenced to fall at 1800 hrs. Base was eventually reached at 2130 hrs.

Mail, tobacco and rations delivered to base by jeep during the day were greatly appreciated.

Troops bedded down and spent miserable

night in rain.

Distance covered during day: 20 Miles.

Friday 18 Aug 44:

Entire patrol broke camp at 1000 hrs and reached bridge 563118 at 1315. Remainder of the day was spent in personal hygiene, drying of blankets etc. Weather had now cleared.

This rest, the first since leaving camp was greatly appreciated by the troops.

Distance covered during day: 9 Miles.

Saturday 19 Aug 44:

Broke camp 0800 hrs and returned to camp by same route. Reached Sqn lines at 1630 hrs.

Distance covered during day: 21 Miles.

Approx distance covered by patrol: 100 Miles.
Average weight on pack per man: 40 Lbs.

From a trg point of view the patrol was highly successful. Members of the sec gained valuable experience in:

Navigation in difficult country

Night navigation.

Map reading in General

Throughout the exercise physical fitness was of a high standard, since returning to camp no member of the patrol has required RAP treatment.

Tpr HARRIS handled the supplimentary rations extremely well, fresh milk and eggs being at all times available.

Because of the ground around the ablution benches becoming soggy and foul the area was cemented.

New type trough urinals have been erected.

Besides the improvements mentioned a fire stand has been erected outside the Sqn Q Store, stumps were cleared out of the tent lines and a bridge across the drain near the incinerator was erected.

Owing to the absence of Sjt Harrison, the Hygiene sjt attached to the Sqn, the work has been done by Tpr Burke and he is responsible for the above improvements.

IMPROVEMENTS DESIRED DURING MONTH OF SEPT.

Kitchen area be fenced off. In this manner the cooks will have a definite area and a much neater appearance should be obvious.

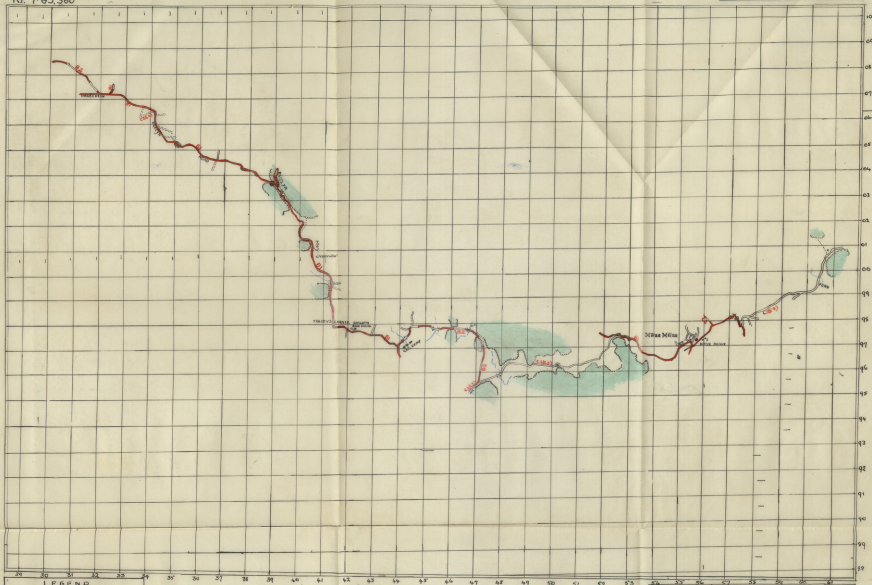

Appendix 3(c).....Hygiene Inspector's Report

ORIGINAL

HYGIENE REPORT

GENERAL HYGIENE:

During the month of August, constructional work, improvements and general maintenance covering all branches of camp hygiene have been carried out.

Mess huts have been gravelled both inside and outside. Seating accommodations have been greatly improved and an additional mess hut provided for 2/7 Squadron.

Showers were re-hashed and the area around each gravelled to reduce mud and fouled ground.

All latrines underwent thorough maintenance, including the gravelling of floors and ground around the structure.

Drainage system has been greatly improved and further extensions made to the drum-drain on which work started two months ago.

STANDARD OF HYGIENE:

Good generally and showing signs of improvement.

METHOD:

As an added incentive towards personal hygiene, improvements in the camp area have been effective. Furthermore, any tendency towards untidiness has been promptly checked and all ranks have taken pains to maintain the standard of hygiene.

EQUIPMENT OBTAINED:

During the month two sprays were obtained with which to initiate a campaign against fleas, a minor plague of which had commenced.

Timber for showers, old iron and U/S shower buckets were obtained from the Salvage unit and, after repair put into operation.

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

Although not essential the following would facilitate work done around the camp area:-

spirit levels, chisels wood, rules 2 ft.

2. WATER:

(a) Supply and Storage: Supply has been adequately maintained and ample storage facilities are installed throughout the camp.

(b) Disposal of Sullage Water: Water from showers and wash benches is strained through traps and then conveyed by open drain to the rear of 2/7 Sqn lines where it is turned off down the road. Sullage water under the new drainage system is not mixed with water flowing from grease traps from main kitchen drain.

(c) Drum Drain: This has been extended another 40 feet and further extensions will be made as additional supplies of drums become available.

3. KITCHENS:

(a) Disposal of Garbage: Satisfactory results have been achieved by the use of 44 gallon drum incinerators situated at each kitchen.

(b) Disposal of Sullage Water: From the grease traps, a separate drain now conveys this water away and after being filtered it is run into evaporation pits. Sludge is dried and dealt with as laid down. This method has been quite satisfactory.

100 yards of concrete drainage piping has been laid from the Serjeants' kitchen to avoid having an open drain right through the centre of the camp.

4. LINES:

(a) Dry Garbage: All dry refuse from lines is conveyed to drum incinerators and burned. However, there has not been sufficient care exercised in the destruction of letters, envelopes and official documents of a security nature which are still being found both in Squadron dumps and in the main dump. Hygiene duty men have been instructed not to remove any unburned papers and the presence of same is immediately notified to the Squadron concerned.

4. Lines: (Continued)

(b) Personal Hygiene: Standard was good throughout the Regiment but there is room for improvement.

(c) Facilities for Disposal of Refuse From Lines:

Drum incinerators have been in operation at the road end of Squadron lines and, when the rubbish is burned, hygiene duty men collect the remains from these incinerators. Hygiene duty truck collects rubbish and empties incinerators twice daily. Further instruction is necessary to ensure destruction of envelopes and office documents by fire.

5. PESTS:

(a) Flies: Some increase has been observed in the number of flies throughout the camp, due to some extent to the change to warmer weather. Steps have been taken to put into operation all fly traps and to locate the breeding grounds which have been cleared up.

(b) Fleas: A minor plague of fleas has infested the area during the latter part of the month. As stated previously, sprays were obtained and all tent floors, mess hut floors and floors of all buildings were thoroughly sprayed with disinfectant. Although spraying reduced the pest considerably, it is apparent that further counter measures will be necessary to eradicate the nuisance.

(c) Mosquitoes: No trouble has been experienced with these pests. A few do exist but not in any number warranting comment.
