Unit Orderly Officer will inform the paraph to a minimum, unit orderly utilized will injure himself of the whereabouts of every man not on parade. Those men detailed for duty in the lines will be issued with distinctive arm bands so that every man on duty in the lines can be easily checked. The bends will be withdrawn at 1650 hrs.

11. BOUNDS:

- (a) The following premises are out of bounds except to personnel on duty:-
 - (1) Engineers and Ordnance Depots;
 - (11) Gun and Motor Transport Parks; (iii) Officers' Lines:
 - (iv) Camp Hospital except during visiting hours; (v) Canteens and Barbor Shops, except at authorised hours;
 - (vi) Institute buts and tents during parade hours; (vii) Creeks, waterholes, vineyards, orchards and standing crops;
 - (viii) Properties belonging to Messrs McGirr and Buffier, (ix) Matropolitan Water Boards canal property. Washing or swimming in Board's Dams or canals is strictly forbidden. Any breach of this order will be reported to Bde H.Q. immediately.

(c) Where in the course of training, it is proposed to use private property, the Coad. of the Unit or sub-unit concerned will actify the occupier or occupiers of the property or properties concerned.

12. RITURNS:

See Appendix "A".

13, MAIL AND TELEPHONE:

(a) Mail:
Mail will be delivered to Units by 2 Div. Postal Units.
Outwards mail will be dealt with in accordance with A.F. C.1. No.7 (revised) and handed to Unit Postal Corporals who mill despatch through 2 Div. Postal Unit.

J.R.L.S. mail will be the subject of separate instructions.

(b) Telephones:

Public phones are installed. Army phones will only be used privately in cases of urgency. Such calls will be paid for by individuals.

14. MEDICAL:

Attention is drawn to E.C.R.O. 32/41 as amended, F.C. Circular 97176 of 30 Aug. 41 and E.C. 5716 of 2 Mar. 42.

(a) Admissions to Hospital - Disposal of Clothing and Equipment:

- (i) The arms, equipment, blankets, palliasses, etc., of members of the Units evacuated to Field Ambulance or Gesualty Clearing Station will be handed in to the Q.M. Store of their Unit.
- (ii) When members are evacuated beyond Camp hospitals, all equipment issued on A.A.F. F.12 should be withdrawn from the member's charge.
- [iii) All other articles on issue to them including their personal property will be transferred with them in their kit bags to hospital etc., to which they are wasuated. These will be returned to their unit on their discharges. Heabers marked "sick" are not to remain in Unit lines. If not evacuated they will be quartered in R.A.P.

(b) Ventilation of Huts and Tents:

Windows and doors are to be kept open during fine weather; if tents are used tent flaps will be kept open and walls of tents rolled up during the fine weather. Expectorating in huts is to be treated as an offence.

(c) Foot Inspections:

At the conclusion of each day's parade, all feet will be inspected by an officer and Condy's Fluid made available for the washing of feet. Any cases of blisters etc. will be sent to the R.M.O. for attention. Tinea powder will also be provided in all ablution hute.

15. CAMP HYGIENE:

(a) Grease Traps and Drains:

Particular care is to be taken of the cleanliness of grease traps and drains. No solids are to be placed therein and they are to be thoroughly cleaned at least once a day. Waste water will not be poured directly into a grease trap; it will be

placed in a gully trap. In the absence of gully traps, perforated tims will be used to receive the waste. The tin tray will be three quarters filled with straw. Dirty straw taken from grease traps will be burned.

(b) Manure, Garbage, Kitchen Refuse:

These will be disposed of under arrangements with the Camp Salvage Section as directed in Bde Routine Orders.

(c) Sanitation:

- (i) Unit Sanitary Duties will perform the following duties:-
 - (a) General cleanliness outside kitchens;
 - (b) The patrol of the latrines and washing areas and the prevention of nuisances.
 - (c) Burning of refuse in incinerators.
- (ii) No paper other than sanitary paper supplied will be used in latrines.
- (iii) Wash basins with nail brush and drip bottles containing 2% Lysol will be permanently placed in all kitchens. All kitchen staff must wash hands and arms every time they enter a kitchen to commence or return to duty and must use drip bottle on hands after visiting latrines.
 - (iv) Pioneer Sgts will keep a tally of the No. of sanitary pans changed each day and a return will be submitted by 1200 has each Saturday showing No. of pans changed each day.
- (d) Wash basins with nail brush and soap and drip bottle as above are to be placed at the exite to latrines and the latrine orderly will see that all members leaving latrines wash thoir hands and use drip bottle.

(e) Units will provide receptacles at ablution places for razor blades etc.

16. MECHANICAL VEHICLES:

(a) The provisions of Standing Orders for the Operation and Maintenance of Military Vehicles will be strictly adhered to.

- (b) Reporting of Accidents Reference is made to M.B.I. Q. 127 of 30 Sep. 41,
- (c) Departmental Vehicles, except C.O's and Staff Cars, will report to Camp Transport Officer when entering or leaving Camp,

17. OFFICERS' AND SERGEAMTS' MESSES:

All mess accounts are to be paid in full each pay day. All accounts must be belanged weekly. Unit Audit Board will examine them fortnightly.

18. RATION BOARD:

Mation Board consisting of Field Officer of Day, Orderly Medical Officer, and an A.S.C. Supply Officer will assemble daily.

19. ECONOMY:

Becommy in all forms will be exercised by all ranks particularly in stationery office equipment, electric light, petrol and water.

20. WATER!

The attention of all ranks is to be drawn to the necessity for rigid economy in the use of maters all Hawas, a DaB. Instructions in this regard will be strictly adhered to and observed. Unit Orderly Officers and NaCola will regularly imaged all fittings that their lines to ensure the tags after a top properly turned off. Any leaks ir waste of water will be reported immediately to FRA Hay.

21. CAMP SERVICES - FAILURE OF:

Any failure in electricity, water supply, sanitary, hot water, sullage or refrigeration services are to be reported immediately to the Area Commandant.

22. TREES IN CAMP AREA:

Troops will not in any way damage or destroy trees in camp area or training areas.

NOTE:- Appendices 'A' and 'B(4)' will be issued later.

DUTIES OF FIELD OFFICER OF THE DAY:

 The Field Officer will mount at Retreat on date notified in Bde R.Os, tour of duty will be three days.

6. He will be present at changing of duties "Retreat".

7. He will visit the Guard at least once, and if there are any soldiers in custody will ascertain whether medical attention is necessary in any case, and make what arrangements are required in this regard.

 θ_{\bullet} He will take command of the inlying picquets in case of fire, riot or alarm.

 He will, with respective Orderly Officers, visit the Messing huts of two Units at each meal to ascertain if the messing and rations are satisfactory.

10. He will, together with the Orderly Medical Officer and an ASS-C. Supply Officer form a Board to Inspect all supplies recoived daily at a time to be arranged by him. Results will be noted in a book to be provided for the purpose by the Supply Officer. The duties of the Board are as follows:-

It must not interfere with the Supply Officer. Quality not quantity is its responsibility. If necessary it should refer to specifications and samples, the Board may comment on specifications. The Board will state its report if supplies are in accordance with specification and fit for consumption or not. Reasons will be given for adverse comment or report. The Supply Officer may request assembly of Board to assist at Inspection of supplies on delivery.

ll. He will inspect the Camp in conjunction with the Orderly Medical Officer daily.

12. He will visit Unit petrol dumps and M.T. lines by night and ensure that picquets thereon are alert and cognisant of their duties.

13. When the <u>Guard</u> dismounts he will receive the Commander's report and together with his own, in which he will note any irregularity or unsmand occurence which came under his notice during his tour of duty, duly initialled by his successor will be handed into Headquarters by 2000 hrs delly.

14. He will visit the Canteen and Recreation Huts at least once during his tour of duty and ensure that men are not using those places during parade hours.

15. He should at all times assist in ensuring that Camp Standing Orders are being carried out.

16. He will remain at Camp H.Q. during his tour of duty, but will mess and sleep in his Unit Lines.

17. When all matters requiring his attention have been adjusted, he may with permission of the Bde Cook. (Obtained through the Staff Captain) leave the Ceap to visit the training area of his Unit. During his absence his duties will be performed by the Staff Captain.

At all times between REVEILLE and RETREAT Quards will turn out and pay specified compliments to -

> Governor General or the Governor of the State: General Officers in Uniform: Brigade Commanders (once per day).

7. The Guard will turn out at all times when as armed party approaches their post, To an Armed Corps they will present arms and to other Armed Parties they will stand with sloped or Rifles, or bearing side arms.

8. Compliments as in para. 6 above will be paid to Officers of his Majesty's Naval or Air Forces of equivalent ranks.

No unauthorised person will be allowed within the Camp, unless in the possession of:

(a) A Pass signed by the Bde Comd., B.M., Staff Captain, Area Comd. or C.O. of any Unit;

(b) Should a civilian seek admission to the Camp, the Sentry at the main entrance Gate to the Camp will call the Guard C.O. or Sgt of the Guard who will take particulars and ring the K-Q, of the Unit consermed for permission to easile the Visitor to enter the Camp. If permission is greated, the Unit conserned will send an Orderly to secort the Visitor to the Unit Lines and return with him to the Guard Room. A list of Civiliang admitted will be kept by the Guard Cond. On leaving the Camp, the Visitor's name will be marked off the list.

10. All cars and other vehicles entering the Casp H.Q. Area with the exception of Cars of General Officers, Ede Conds and Unit Conds are to be halted and directed to the Visitors' Park.

CARRYING AND CARE OF ARMS AND EQUIPMENT.

1. Although 9 Inf. Bde group has been withdrawn from the more forward coastal positions for a period of intensive training the necessity for rigid discipline in regard to the carrying and care of arms and equipment is as imperative now as hitherto. Consequently, the Bde Coud. desires the closest and fullest co-operation from C.0's and O's C. in administering the general instructions contained herein.

2. All Units and attached troops will observe the undermentioned discipline in respect to the carrying and care of arms and equipment. Arms and equipment include, inter alia, (and so far as issued) -

Rifles
Dayonets
Pistols
Respirators
Helmets, Steel
Water-bottles
Web Equipment - 1937.

3. Ares will be carried and equipment will be worn by all ranks when on duty. M.T. drivers and all working parties will conform. (Field Officers, etc., whose duties necessitate the wearing of F.S. dress will not wear equipment, but will ensure that both arms and equipment are carried in their vehicles).

4. Working parties in the field or camp area may remove equipment provided arms and equipment are placed under cover of view from air, in a handy position to the orrk being carried out and provided also that both arms and equipment are properly laid out for instant action.

5. When off duty, or in rest areas in the field, arms and equipment will be properly laid out conveniently to hand.

6. Helmets, steel (hessian camouflaged) will be carried at all times when on duty. They will be worn during all periods of training. Hats, felt, may be worn by working or fatigue parties, but helmets will be carried and placed in an orderly manner beside individual equipment. In this respect the dress of all personnel in any one fatigue party will be uniform.

7. Water bottles will be carried filled and the usual discipline regarding same will be enforced.

6. At all times arms will be kept scrupulously cleaned and ciled. Respirator face-pieces will be kept free of dust; personnel standing down from guard or sentry duties will clean and oil arms immediately after such tour of duty.

the foregoing instructions apply to all orderly room staffs, cook-house personnel, postal orderlies, M.T. drivers, etc.

10. 0.0's will easure that the arms and equipment of all personnel are inspected at least once a day, orderly officers should be instructed to crossee inspection of arms or personnel who are on leave and also of arms in one on the arms in pertonnel actionatic weapons in particular are to be the subject of rigid inspections.

Magazines of rifles of all guards and sentries will be charged, both by day and night, with 5 rounds of ball ammunition.
