
May I now venture to enquire if you are in a position to say when it will be convenient for you to forward the records to the Memorial?

Dear Sir,

The Australian War Memorial as you are doubtless aware, has been established by Act of Parliament of the Commonwealth as the national memorial to those Australians, who, while serving with the forces, fell or died during the Great War, or whose deaths since its termination have been due to the results of active service.

In the library of the War Hemorial there are preserved the written records. These, which include naval and New Guinea documents, the war-disries and official records of the A.I.F., and a large collectic of private diaries and letters, are now being studied by the official historiams, and will through the centuries be the main source of information for those dealing with Australia's war effort.

For this reason I as writing to enquire whether you can see your way to present to the Tar Remortal library now, or bequeath to it later, any such records, speers, letters, diaries, photographs, etc., that you may posservice presently those connected with your own and every can be added to the connected with your own and every case. In addition, unit and troopensh magazines, as well as books, pamphlets, or leaflets relating in any way to the war, would be erstafully received.

precious to to course recognised that these documents are very precious to you and that, if kept in your faulty, they will be treasured by future generations. On the other hand, it may perhaps be reasonably held that, if included in a library such as the one being formed by the Australian War Nemorial, they will be of even greater which to Australia as a whole and, in the long run, more tenderly and carefully preserved. In the came of letters, it is also realised that these must contain much of a private nature. The documents in the War Memorial Library, however, include many confidential State papers, and unready laid down.
