AUSTRALIAN FIGHTER PILOTS' PARALLEL CAREERS TO WIN D.F.C.

Two Australian fighter pilots who together enlisted, embarked and took part in the Salerno landing have won simultaneous D.F.Cs. The two — who, as far as is known have never met — are Filot Officer Lionel Charles Robert Morris, of Allors, Queensland, and Warrant Officer Robert Bunting, of Sandringham, Victoria.

Bunting destroyed five enemy aircraft within two months, recently. Morris has destroyed three.
