#### CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE.

(a) Date. 16.2.17.

(b) Place. Armentieres.

At about 5 a.m. of 16.2.17 an enemy party raided our lines at Armentieres, following up a heavy minonverfer beombrament. I was wounded in the head by a hand grounde and was pretty well laid out. While I lay helpless a party of Germans pounced upon me and half carried, half dragged me into their lines. So far as I know only one other men of ours had been captured. I was taken to hoppital at Lille where I was closely questioned. I next spent six weeks in hospital at boals. I was next sent to Port McDonald as a prisoner of respite for 12 or 18 days.
