FIGHT WITH SIX JU. 88's.

After a fight over the Bay of Biscay with six Ju. 881s, the crew of Royal Australian Air Force Sunderland of Coastal Command returned home right with three members injured.

During the combat, which lasted 20 minutes, two of the Ju's were to be giving off smoke as a result of fire from the Australians' aircrawas on an anti-U-beat patrol.

"We sighted the Ju. 88's six miles away from us on the starboard be in for a beam attack," one of the Sunderland crew mid. "First they att individually. Then four came at us on one side and two on the other. second attack one of the enemy was seen to break away with both engine, while snoke was also coming from one engine of another."
