



133. EGYPTIAN TEN PIASTRE NOTES:

The present issue of the above notes is being withdrawn, and replaced by notes of a similar design and colour. The distinguishing features between the two notes are that the new note bears a water-mark, and the reverse of the new note has a background of brown wavy lines. The old type notes will be valueless after the 31 Jan 42. The old note does not bear a water-mark of any pattern, and the background of the reverse side of the note is plain.

Old notes will no longer be issued and will cease to be accepted by A.I.F. Pay personnel after the 31 Dec 41.

A.I.F. personnel holding any such notes are advised to convert them immediately to other denominations of Egyptian Currency or where personnel are located in other countries, they should be converted into the currency of that country.

All ranks are warned against accepting old 10 piastre notes previously described, from any source, either military or civilian.

PREVENTION OF DAMAGE AND REDUCTION OF WASTE.

1. Notwithstanding the issue of numerous instructions regarding the conservation of our Military material resources and the prevention of avoidable damage to stores and accommodations, abundant evidence is provided daily of disregard of these instructions.
2. Instances of waste are, food and petrol being wasted, Mechanised vehicles making unnecessary or unauthorized journeys or being driven without care, causing avoidable wear and tear and reducing their value for future work, stores being indented for in unnecessarily large quantities, stores being carelessly and indiscriminately hoarded.
3. Avoidable damage done to accommodations, including tentage and buildings, through wantonness and negligence wastes valuable material and public monies. In all cases where avoidable damage occurs, it must be brought home to the individuals or units responsible.
4. The cumulative effect of the disregard of orders is assuming proportions which are viewed with grave concern, as the attitude of mind shown by many officers and other ranks towards their responsibility for Government stores with which they are entrusted suggests that there are some who do not realize the ultimate effect of waste on the national resources in a long drawn out war. It cannot be stressed too strongly that the Battle of the Atlantic is being fought in vain if the determination and resourcefulness of the Royal Navy and the Merchant Service on the High Seas is not also applied in kitchens, garages, stores, buildings and on the roads in this country. Every ton of material reaching these shores and converted into army stores and equipment must be employed and conserved with scrupulous economy and it must be realized by all ranks that waste of any description is definitely harmful to our war effort.
5. The responsibility for the education of their units in prevention of waste and damage in any form rests primarily with C.O's, but it is the duty of every Commander, no matter how subordinate, to insure that waste and damage do not occur and, where they do, that the matter is reported immediately.

Severe disciplinary action will be taken against individuals who, through negligence, non-compliance with instructions or any other cause, occasion waste or avoidable damage in any form. Charges will be so framed that offenders are made to pay for the loss or damage caused.





147. HITCH-HIKING.

A.I.F. (M.E.) Base Area R.O. 523 is repeated and will be observed by 9 Aust Div. --

148. SPEED LIMITS - ARMY VEHICLES.

The following is a table of speed limits for Aust Military vehicles in Palestine. C.O's of units will ensure that the speed limits for any particular type of vehicle are clearly shown on a notice pasted on the inside face of the wind-screen of that vehicle, in front of the drivers seat, positioned low down in such a way that it will not interfere with normal vision.

These speed limits will be rigidly observed by all ranks driving vehicles and any breaches thereof will be treated as an offence.

148. SPEED LIMITS - ARMY VEHICLES (cont'd)

Notwithstanding the speed limits set out in the above, the driver of an Aust Military Motor Vehicle will not, whilst driving within a town or camp, exceed the speed limits set out on Military Notice Boards erected near the boundaries of or within the town or camp, and no Aust Military Motor Vehicle will be driven on any roads :-

(a) recklessly or at a speed or in any manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the cases, including the nature, condition and use of the road and the amount of traffic which is actually at the time, or which might reasonably be expected to be, on the road, or

(b) without due care or attention or without reasonable consideration for other persons using the road.

149. TINS PETROL.

A.I.F. (M.E.) Base Area R.O. 530 is repeated :-

"Cases have occurred of tins marked petrol being found to contain M.B.O. and vice versa. Care should be exercised when opening tins to ensure that contents are as marked.

All W.D. petrol in tins is coloured red, except 67 Octane, which is green, and 70 CL which is colourless.

M.B.O. is colourless."







2. The attention of all ranks must be drawn to the fact that indiscreet conversations regarding methods of escape and assistance given by friendly nationals in enemy occupied territories may have grave consequences for those who are helping British soldiers to escape.

3. Such indiscreet talk will further imperil the lives of British soldiers who have escaped from PW camps and who are still being befriended in occupied territory.

Gifts of military property are not permitted and constitute an offence. Furthermore, it is a civil offence for civilians to be found in possession of military property. The practice will cease forthwith.

166. BOUNDS - GAZA TOWN.

GAZA TOWN is out of bounds to other rank personnel from all Camps except Kilo 89, GAZA RIDGE, MUSEIRAT and MUGHAZ

167. TRESPASS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

In future, personnel will NOT be permitted to proceed beyond the limits of Camp Areas except during training in prescribed training areas or when using main or subsidiary roads.

168. ROADS UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

Military vehicles will not travel in any circumstances, on roads or sections of roads under construction and protected by barriers.

169. DRESS.

It has been noticed that O.R's on leave and otherwise not on duty have been wearing incorrect dress e.g. shoes or desert boots - caps (in many cases officers pattern) - unauthorised shirts and trousers - unauthorised pockets and fittings on the garments.

All officers and N.C.O's will take steps to correct this and report cases noticed to the soldiers' units.

Officers will take particular care that they wear the correct dress.

Commanders will ensure that all leave parties are inspected when going on leave.
