

4. Five (5) men qualified for a full AAT G11 and 17 have been
granted Temporary Licenses pending their qualifying in the written
maintenance examination.

5. The new D & M School commenced 11 Oct '43 and will continue
until 22 Nov '43 This School will be conducted as per appendix "A"
to LHQ 35M3965. The intake to this course is 67. Those qualifying
will be issued with full drivers licenses vide 3 Aust Corps training
Instructions No 18;

6. Attention is drawn to the fact that six of the instructors
have qualified as such at LHQ school of Mechanisation.

7. These courses in conjunction with the output to M.T.T.D
Northam will complete the initial D & M Training for the 112
personnel transferred from 9 Aust. Aux. Horse Tpt.Coy., to 124
and 125 Aust.Gen.Tpt.Coy.,

Basic Infantry Training This course was from 13 Sep '43 to 9 Oct '43 70 personnel completing this training. T.O.E.T's for musketry and gas were carried out, all personnel qualifying Range Practice Table "A" Parts 1 and 2 were fired at the South Perth Range, 72 qualifying in Part 1 and 20 in Part 2.

2. 24 personnel from No 1 D & Course are now going through this training commencing 11 Oct '43 and will complete the course by 8 Nov '43.

3. This will complete recruit training for all personnel considered suitable for training, transferred from 9 Aust Aux Hqse Tpt.Coy

4. It is intended, subject to operations, to have one complete Platoon in training at all times, the Platoons working in rotation. This will serve to keep platoons up to the standard of efficiency necessary in a General Tpt.Coy.,
