Fire extinguishers will NOT under any circumstances be used for cleaning purposes or maintenance.

271. INCIDENTS AND PREVENTION OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS.

1. Recent inspections of workshops and motor transport records in commands and districts have revealed that, even though the number of army vehicles on the road has been reduced, the percentage of motor accidents involving army vehicles has greatly increased during the last six months.

2. These inspections also reveal that, although most of the serious accidents have been reported, many minor accidents, in the aggregate necessitating a large number of man hours for repairs, have not been reported. In addition, it is known that, in some cases, disciplinary action has not been taken where accidents have occurred as the result of negligent driving or speeding.

3. This high accident rate, combined with the general shortage of personnel, has placed so great a strain on repair facilities that it is barely possible to keep essential vehicles on the road.

4. It is known that comprehensive instructions exist in all formations and units to govern the use and maintenance of vehicles. It can only be assumed that responsible HQs are not adequately supervising the carrying out of these instructions.

5. It is the duty of every officer to report breaches of road discipline and careless driving, regardless of the formation or unit to which the vehicle or driver belongs.

6. Attention is directed to the provisions of MBE 51/1946 concerning "Maximum Speed of Vehicles"

7. Officers concerned are responsible that existing regulations and instructions are enforced and will therefore ensure -

- (1) that each driver receives adequate instruction in the civil traffic regulations applicable in the area in which the unit is operating before he is detailed for driving duty in that area.

2. that, before any driver is detailed to drive in an area where heavy road traffic can reasonably be anticipated, he has had adequate training for driving under such conditions, including experience under capable supervision;

3. that the closest surveillance is maintained at all times on the conduct of all drivers of motor transport, on speeds and on the general manner in which ~~these~~ vehicles are used, and that disciplinary action is taken against a driver exceeding the speed limit or driving in a dangerous manner or whilst under the influence of liquor;

4. that all accidents, even if of a minor nature, are reported in accordance with para 13 of "Standing Orders for Drivers of Mechanical Vehicles - 1945". Officers commanding workshops and light aid detachments will ensure that, when repair is necessitated through unfair wear, damage or lack of unit maintenance in any way, a report is submitted in accordance with GRO 207/1945.

8. From the date of issue of this instruction, offences against orders for the use of maintenance of mechanical vehicles will be considered "unusually prevalent" and will be treated as such by formation commanders, commanding officers and courts-martial (vide AMR & O 558(3)).

9. Para 8 above will not be cancelled until AHQ is satisfied that the vehicle accident figure is within reasonable bounds

277: SECOND SECURITY LOAN.

1. The Second "Security Loan" of £90,000,000 will open for subscription on 15th October 1946 and close not later than 15th Nov 46.

2. Arrangements have been made for paymasters and unit pay representatives to accept applications for Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the AMF who desire to invest their savings in the loan, or who desire to allot portion of their future daily rate of pay for investment in the Loan.

Particulars of Loan.

3. Loan applications may be made for an amount of £10 or a multiple of £10.

4. Treasury bonds are payable to bearer and are issued at par for £10, £50, £100, £500 and £1,000.

5. Inscribed stock may be purchased at par for amounts of £100 or multiples of £10 above £100.

6. Interest is payable at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum if invested for 12 years and at 2% per annum if invested for 3 years, and will be credited half yearly to a member's savings bank account or current account if desired.

7. Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but not to any income tax under the law of a State. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the pound on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.

8. Any bank nominated by a member will, if requested, hold the bonds in safe custody.

Procedure for lodging applications.

9. Application forms will be available from paymasters and unit pay representatives, and are required to be completed in duplicate. An applicant's signature will be witnessed by an officer.

10. Sufficient credit must be available in the member's pay book to cover the amount he or she desires to invest in the loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the pay book.

11. Cash may be accepted in payment of a loan subscription, in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the pay book to establish the necessary credit and a pay sergeant's or cash office receipt issued and pasted in the pay book.

12. Deposits on account of loan subscriptions will not be accepted.

13. The Commonwealth Bank will forward to a member an interim receipt for the amount subscribed.

14. Members who have funds to their credit held by Commonwealth or State Savings Banks may have such funds or any part of such funds invested in the Loan by the bank concerned. A special "Commonwealth Loan Withdrawal Form", which is acceptable to all Savings Banks, is available from paymasters and unit pay representatives. The form consists of two sections, of which the top section is a withdrawal authority and the lower section is an instruction to the bank concerned to enter a debit in the member's pay book and return it to the address or person designated by the depositor. In addition to the Withdrawal Form, the member must complete a Loan Application form in accordance with paragraph 9 above. The following action will then be taken:-

- (i) Where the passbook is held by the Serviceman, he may hand the withdrawal section, together with completed loan application forms, to the unit loan officer, or, alternatively, send them direct to the branch of the Savings Bank named in the passbook. In either event, the bottom portion of the form must be completed and despatched with the passbook to the bank for entry of the relevant transaction.
- (ii) Where the passbook is held by a relative or friend, ~~then~~ the procedure outlined above will apply to disposal of the signed withdrawal form and completed application, while the bottom section of the withdrawal form should be detached and forwarded by the serviceman to the person holding the passbook, with a request that they present both the form and the passbook to the Savings Bank branch named in the form.

It is imperative that the same Savings Bank branch shall be named both on the withdrawal authority and letter of advice.

15. Approval has been given for members of the AMF to subscribe to Commonwealth Loans by making an allotment of portion of their pay to the Commonwealth Bank. Amounts received by the bank under the allotment will be credited to a special account in the member's name and interest will be allowed thereon at the rate borne by the bonds selected for purchase by the member. As often as funds in the account accumulate to the extent of £10, the bank will purchase a £10 Commonwealth Treasury Bond on behalf of the member.

16. Bonds will be held by the Commonwealth Bank at the capital city of the member's state of enlistment for safe custody on behalf of the member.

17. Where a member is discharged or cancels his allotment, the special account will be closed and any balance remaining therein will be credited to the member's bank account, or paid to him, whichever he desires.

General.

18. Both Treasury Bonds and Inscribed Stock are readily realisable and may be sold at any time. Any bank or stockbroker will arrange this for a member, if desired.

19. Further information on the Loan may be obtained by members from the liaison officers who have been appointed in each unit and formation headquarters.

He will be responsible for the cleanliness of hut and layout of all gear and bedding. See that a nominal roll is placed at each end of the hut.

Be responsible for the vicinity of hut, see that windows are kept clean, weeds and grass kept down in gardens surrounding huts, fire buckets kept full of clean water, and used for no other purpose than fires. Have cards placed at the head of each bed bearing the Reg No Rank and Name of the occupant of each bed.

LAY OUT OF GEAR AND BEDDING AS DEMONSTRATED.

Beds will be made according to instructions issued and demonstrated by the C.S.M. Palliasses will be triple rolled.

Blankets will be triple folded, with the outer blanket used to wrap. Towel will be placed at foot of bed. Spire boots will be polished and placed at foot of bed.

Uniforms may be hung on clothes hangers. If not on hangers, uniforms will be neatly folded and placed on top of blankets.

Hats will be placed on top of blankets. Cases, Packs, Kitbags or surplus gear will be placed behind blankets. All ledges will be kept clear of gear. The only gear not put away will be messing gear, which will be placed neatly on top of box.

Under no circumstances will lines be allowed in huts.

NCO will report immediately any damage in his hut to his Platoon Officer or Coy HQ.

Electric fittings. Any person interfering with electric fittings will be severely dealt with.

280. TASK SYSTEM OF MAINTENANCE FOR ARMY VEHICLES (WHEELED)

1. The task system of maintenance for "B" vehicles and motor cycles will be introduced into the AMF on 1st Jan 1946. Details of the system are set out in MGO equipment Order No 213 dated 10th April 46.
2. To enable this system to be implemented on the prescribed date, units will immediately indent for the necessary stationary and publications in accordance with the scale of issue set out in para 5 of the above Equipment Order.
3. Current issue vehicle log books AAB 20B and AAB 20C will be modified in accordance with MGO Equipment Order No 213 and remain in use until existing stocks are exhausted.
4. COs will ensure that strict attention is paid to para 7 of MGO Equipment Order No 213 so as to ensure that all preliminary action and training has been completed prior to 1st January 1947.

316. TEMPORARY HOUSING FOR MARRIED MEN OF THE A.M.F

Following is an extract from HQ Southern Command memo 99098 of 3 Dec '46.

1. "With reference to the above, AHQ has directed that consideration be given to the question of providing temporary home for married members of the AMF, who may be living under undesirable conditions and for caretakers etc., at Camp Sites and other Army installations.

316 (contd)

2. Such provision can be considered to be a direct contribution to the general housing problem in each State, and to this extent does not conflict with the urgent priority for all building materials to be made available to the various State Housing authorities.
3. Commands and Units will please submit as early as possible for Ministerial consideration, any specific cases where AMF married personnel desire such conversion of Army buildings to be made. The cost of conversion of each flat is not to exceed £50, using secondhand material and unit labour to the fullest extent possible.
4. Each case will be dealt with on its merits and the following particulars are required.
 - (a) Name and location of Camp or Installation where quarters are proposed.
 - (b) Description of building for conversion, with sketch showing proposed layout of flat including arrangements for ablution and toilet. (Liaison will be established with C.E. Southern Command in this respect)
 - (c) Name and rank of proposed occupant.
 - (d) Whether he is to undertake the duties of caretaker, watchman etc., for the particular area, or other reasons for occupancy of quarters.
 - (e) Any conditions governing occupancy which it may be considered necessary to impose.
5. In submitting designs and estimates in accordance with para 4b, emphasis is to be placed on supplying the bare essentials, and items regarded as desirable must be eliminated if any cost is thereby involved. Consideration should be given also to the installation of communal facilities in respect of cooking, ablutions, toilet and washing, where two or more flats are to be centrally situated.
6. It should be clearly understood by prospective occupants, that such temporary quarters are solely in the nature of a sympathetic endeavour to help the married men who is unable to find a home in the vicinity, and that they do not conform to the standards of construction, convenience or environment which would govern the provision of official quarters in normal times. Each occupant will be required to sign a paper to the effect that he fully understands this aspect and is willing to occupy a flat as it stands and at the rental, if an, imposed.
7. Comds and units will please pay particular attention to para 6, and ensure that appropriate action is taken accordingly.
8. The information requested above will be submitted to this HQ as early as practicable, please."




