

In submitting these recommendations I have given much thought to the view expressed by the Prime Minister that he "would feel happier to see rather more recommendations for the senior Citizen Porces people".

You will remember from my letter of 27th June, 1960, in which I invited your attention to the inequitable distribution of swards as between the three Services, that this matter has also greatly concerned me. The fact is, however, that in determining this initial distribution between the Services, only one quarter of the strength of CMF officers eligible for each particular award is permitted to count towards the Army's allocation. for each particular shared as permitted to come towards the army's minostation by Bren so the policy of my Department, for some years push, has been to allot not less than 2% of each assert to sembers of the DMF, although on a statistical shart they would be entitled to less. In fact this percentage has been exceeded to date, in that approximately 3% of the higher saurie, 3% of the surriar for the DME and 3% of those for the MME have been nameded to members of the CMF.

This increased allocation has only been possible at the expense of the ARA and should be borne in mind when considering the recommendations for the higher awards in the Birthday Honours List. Although ARA officers have been recommended for these awards the allocation of 25% to the CMF will be maintained this year as Brigadier C.E. Chapman (OWF) was awarded a GBE in the recent New Year Honours List; also, next year, when it is expected that three higher awards will be allocated, Brigadier J.O. Weebery (OWF) will be recommended for a GBE for which award he is the reserve nomination in the current List.

I have dealt with this matter in detail because of the interest shown both by the Frise Minister and yourself. As it will be seen that the ARA is saking a considerable service in the interests of the GW I feel sure you will agree that to increase further the allocation to the OW would be to place sembers of the ARA in an even more disadvantageous position than they are now in relation to their regular counterparts in the RAN and RAAF.

Recume of his tact, understanding and courteous manner he has won the respect and confidence not only of the undergraduate numbers of the regiment but also of the University administrative staff with whom he has come in contact.

His contribution in this regard has done a great deal to promote cooperation and mutual understanding which at present exists between the University and the Army.

Time and again when called upon to perform tasks far beyond the normal course of duty he has proved his loyalty and selfleseness by the enthusiastic and cherrful manner in which he has approached such tasks. His example in this regard has been an inspiration to those, both senior and junior, serving with his.

Since his transfer to Third Eattalion Royal New South Wales Regiment in July 1960 he has maintained the same high standards during the particularly difficult period of Army reorganisation.

Sergeent HAIRY has been a Section Commander in the First Special Air Service Company since its formation in 1957. He calisted in the Australian Regular Army in 1951 and prior to this served in the Welsh Guards for three years.

The First Special Air Service Company carried out a vehicle mounted operation in the Horth-West Kimberleys from 11th April 1960 until 23rd June 1960, sined at establishing bases for subsequent use by the hestern Command Field Survey Section. Sergeant HAEY was appointed a Group Commander and was assigned the task of receiving an air drop of petrol, presenting a large helicopter ped, and recovering percenties.

Unsessonal rains greatly inidered mobility. Vehicles gained as little as 150 yards per day. In order to reach the selected dropping none and helloopter pad site, Sergeent Hills? Led a small party comprising a signallar, two aboriginals and a male on a dissounted trek of 100 miles through trackless desolate country of unter-logged savamah, rody outcrops and precipious slopes. During this march Sergeant Hills's ratio receiver became unserviceable, Nevertheless, he continued to brosicust regular estuation reports for five days until a replacement received was six-dropped to him.

The party resched the dropping some 1d days after setting out, arriving after the air drop had telem place. Sergeant HAEE directed the construction of the halicopter pad, checked and secured the stores and petrol, and recovered parachates before they were rendered unserviceable. By the use of his radio, firing shots and visual signals, he was able to assist a webdied nounted party to locate his position 9 days later. This enabled the recovery of his party and stores and the establishment of a track to the site for subsequent use.

The success of this operation is directly attributable to Sergeant HALEY's outstending military qualities and perseverance under trying conditions of terrain, distance and isolation.

Captain HUSSELL enlisted in the ranks of 2/26th Infentry Battalion in June 1940. He saw action against the Japanese at SEGAMUF in MAIATA, but was subsequently taken prisoner. He spent the remainder of the war working on the BURMA-SIAM Railway.

He later served with the 3rd Battalion Royal Australian Regiment in KOREA and wears the distinguished emblem of that unit.

After the Second World War, Captain HUNNEL joined the Royal Australian Army Ordnance Corps and became an Inspecting Ordnance Officer and Assumation Examiner. His duties include the destruction of, or remiering safe, unexploded projectiles, not only those of Army origin, but mines and large bombs of Haval and Air Force origin.

Because of the heavy concentrations of troops, both Australian and American, in QUENDIAID during World War II, the number of unexploided projectiles which have been and are still being discovered, is extraordinarily high. In 1960 alone 171 calls on Captain RUSSEL have been made.

Command has undoubtedly seved soores of persons particularly children, from losing life or limb. His calm courage and confidence in his extremely dangerous work was amply illustrated in CAIRSS in February 1960 when he rendered safe a 500 pound bomb in an extremely dangerous condition.

Throughout his entire career Captain HUSSELL has displayed personal courage of an exceptionally high order, and his apparent disregard for his own safety has won for him the admiration and respect of all who have been associated with him.
