MALAYA

Feb 1st.	Singapore	All vehicles working on transport.
" 2nd.	"	Empress of Asia bombed whilst laden with reinforcements. All available vehicles used in transporting survivors from Docks to Camp. Troops from other vessels in Convoy transported to Camps. Cpls Parish and White volunteered and took out life-boat to assist in rescue of troops from Empress of Asia. (English Troops)
" 3rd	"	All vehicles working overtime petrol, supplies and stores. Work continued under difficulties owing to bombing, machine gunning from the air and shell fire.
" 5th	"	Five vehicles lost owing to bombing on Dock area. Drivers Spiby and Harmer showed bravery and initiative in salvaging 15 trucks from burning Godowns; their effort inspired others who later joined in this rescue work.
" 6-9th	"	All vehicles working day and night on transporting troops, petrol, supplies and stores.
" 10th	"	Under orders from Malayan Command, Unit moves from Disposal area in Bona Vista Road to around junction of Tiong Bahru-Havelock Roads; all vehicles working.
" 11th	"	Working party returned to Bona Vista Road Camp to salvage supplies and tentage. Party fired on by enemy and two men wounded. All impressed vehicles lost to enemy. Owing to sever bombing and shelling, Unit forced to move from Tiong Bahru Road into Robinson Road, Singapore; troops billeted in buildings in Robinson Road near Alameda Street. Vehicles dispersed in city streets and Anson Road Camp area. Work continued under heavy bombings. 62 vehicles including all workshop equipment completely destroyed in two bombing attacks. Ten vehicles and large working parties, working all day in removing silver from Treasury. 12th and 19th Indian General Hospitals moved to Raffles



Feb. 11th Singapore, Institute.

" 12th " Vehicles doing a large amount of work salvaging petrol and supplies under shell fire and bombing attacks. 35 Vehicles used in moving 2/29th Batn. from forward position to Tanglin. Work on shifting silver from Treasury continued.

Several incidents of Unit being ordered by Malaya Command to salvage petrol and supplies from areas on fire or already in Japanese hands. Unit moves 10 A.M. from Oldham School to Cathay Building.

Feb. 13th " 30 vehicles used in moving 2/30th Batn from forward area to Tanglin. 30 vehicles destroyed by bombing attacks; remainder of vehicles working under continuous shelling and bombing. Capt. Walker with 24 M.C.O's and O/R's under instructions from H.Q. AIF embarked from Singapore.

Feb. 14th " Work continues under very heavy bombing and shelling; Combined and Indian Gen. Hospital moved to Raffles Institute.

Feb. 15th " Continuous shelling and dive bombing on our position in which Unit lost three Staff Cars and a number of other vehicles. Great difficulty experienced in keeping track of vehicles over last three days as same continually being stolen by drivers of other Units, - Indian, Malay and English. Continuous trouble over last few days by Indian, English and Australian troops deserting from front line and arriving at our Billets in Singapore, asking for meals and accommodation. As far as possible these were fed and transported by us to their respective Base Depots. All available vehicles continue working. 10 vehicles used to work in assisting to repair City waterlines and on island. Arms laid down at 2030 hours.



Feb. 16th. Singapore *JH* Vehicles continue working under orders from Malaya Command. Japanese patrols and troops enter City proper and take over control. Men and vehicles used to clear streets of wrecked vehicles.

Feb. 17th. " *JH* Orders from Japanese High Command that all P.O.W. move to Changi Military Barracks. Unit instructed to retain 50 vehicles which were used to transport all supplies and baggage of British troops to P.O.W. camp. Unit joins AIF for first time since arriving in Malaya Unit placed under administration of C.A.A.S.C.

Feb. 18th Changi *JH* Work commenced in cleaning up area and settling into allotted camp space. Vehicles continue to work in bringing in supplies and equipment from Singapore to Changi.

Feb. 19-20th " *JH* Settling in and work organisation continues. Vehicles continue to work under directions from Malaya Command.

Feb. 21st. " *JH* Total number of vehicles reduced to 30 and to be used for carting supplies and on Engineer's work under directions from Malaya Command.

Feb. 22-23rd. " *JH* Troops begin sanitation and Hygiene work and educational classes being formed. All vehicles working.

Feb. 24th " *JH* Tour of inspection by Commander of Imperial Japanese Army. All P.O.W. line roadway.

Feb. 25-28th " *JH* All vehicles working and troops continue Educational classes. Two Changi trailers built by Unit. Pumps rigged to assist in drawing water. Further repairs and clean-up of area.

*JH* Since beginning of August 1941 until capitulation Unit has been responsible for every troop movement from docks; same being carried out without a single accident or casualty. Over same period Unit transported all Stores, Ammunition and P.O.L. from Singapore docks.
