



If such an Armourer is not on the strength or attached to the unit, the services of a fully trained and experienced Armourer are to be requisitioned from Ordnance Workshop Services of the Command concerned.

Any adjustment necessary to the fore-sight for line and/or height, and then only if a good group is recorded is to be made by the Armourer. Under no circumstances are the personnel of a Unit to make any adjustment to the sights of any weapon.



3. RAAF STATIONS.

When it is desired to visit an RAAF establishment, application for a Pass should be made to HQ Central Area, RAAF, Point Piper.

4. POWER OF ATTORNEY- EXEMPTION FROM STAMP DUTY AND REGISTRATION

All states of the Commonwealth have now made provision that Powers of Attorney executed by members of the Defence Forces, continuously employed on War Service, whether abroad or in Australia, shall be exempt from payment of stamp duty.

In Victoria, New South Wales and Tasmania such powers of Attorney are also exempted from the payment of registration fees. Notice in regard to Other States in this respect will be promulgated when the information is available.

5. FREE LEGAL ADVICE FW LAW INSTITUTE OF VICTORIA (3 M.D. ONLY).

- (a) The Law Institute of Victoria has generously been giving, and will continue to give, free legal advice to:-
(i) Members of the A.I.F. and their dependants.
(ii) Members of full time duty in Australia and their dependants, and
(iii) Persons about to enlist in the A.I.F.
in respect of the adjustment of their private affairs consequent upon enlistment. This included advice respecting rights and liabilities in relation to contracts, property, rents, matrimonial problems, and the like, especially as affected by the Moratorium Regulations and Debtor's Relief Regulations.
- (b) In addition the Institute will draw up Wills, Powers of Attorney and other legal documents for members of the A.I.F.
- (c) The abovementioned services are not available to members of the Militia who are not included under sub-para(a) above, or Permanent Forces or to persons on part time military duty nor are they available for any person who can well afford to pay for legal services.
- (d) Members of the Forces concerned or their dependants may call at the Law Institute Cnr McKillop Street and Little Collins Streets, Melbourne, at any time between 9.45 am and 12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4.30 pm (Saturdays 9.30 am to 11.30 am.
- The Secretary of the Law Institute will then send the enquirer to a solicitor member of that Institute.
- Those who cannot conveniently call may write to the Secretary of the Law Institute,





4. SECURITY OF INFORMATION IN CORRESPONDENCE.

The practice of including in communications to members of the Forces serving overseas reference to past or impending embarkation of individuals, arrivals and departures of troopships etc., is to cease forthwith.

The majority of letters travel by air and as misfortune may easily deliver such into the hands of the enemy- even before ships referred to have cleared port- destruction of such vessels, together with personnel, may result from what is tantamount to criminal thoughtlessness.

Military personnel are instructed to impress these vital points upon civilians relatives and friends in order that that it may not become necessary, as the result of examination, to delay or withhold transmission of such communications.

5. FRESH MILK.

All milk delivered daily is to be consumed as part of the day's rations, and no carry-over of milk is to be permitted.

Milk will be conveyed to unit lines in commercial type milk cans, which must be returned without fail to Supply Depot on delivery of the following day's supply of milk. This provision is to ensure that milk cans are not held in unit lines, which would prevent continuity of supply.

When emptied, the cans are to be swilled out with cold water, preparatory to return to Supply Depot.

6. SYDNEY HARBOUR BRIDGE.

Drivers of Military lorries are instructed that when crossing Sydney Harbour Bridge they must use the extreme left hand line only, as the roofs of the Toll Collectors' Shelters in the centre of the Bridge do not permit a lorry to pass.

7. PLATES BAFFLE INLET MANIFOLD.

The COME is authorised by AHQ Memo 20118 to remove baffle plates from "B" vehicles when at Ord Wk'sps if so requested by COs.

Baffle plates will not be removed except under the above authority which will be granted only when Unit MT history and maintenance are considered satisfactory.

8. HEATING IN CAMPS.

All necessary heating in camps (huttet or tented) or schools will be carried out by stoves, fire places, etc., using coke, coal or wood.

All electric radiators at present on issue are to be returned to Ord and are not to be permitted to be in the precincts of any camp.

Private radiators may not be used in camps or schools.

9. ACCOMMODATION IN CAMPS.

Cases still continue of Officers and O.R. visiting camps and claiming travelling allowance instead of making application for quarters and rations as laid down in MFR & I 154&156.

The attention of personnel of formations and services is drawn to the above MFR & I.

In future, except with the authority of formation commanders, travelling allowance will not be claimed for any Officer under the rank of Lt-Col visiting camps.

Area commandants will make arrangements for accommodation for two officer or WOs to be always available in camps.



10. REPAIRS TO "A" & "B" VEHICLES IN COUNTRY CENTRES.MINOR REPAIRS.

- (i) The Commanding Officer is empowered by Standing Orders for the Operation and Maintenance of Mechanical Vehicles (Aust) 1940 para 114 to authorise expenditure for repairs if they are beyond the capacity of Unit tradesmen up to a maximum amount of £3 including the cost of any necessary material or spare parts.
- (ii) At least one (1) quotation will be obtained from a reputable garage, preferably an agent for the make of vehicle and if the CO is satisfied that it is reasonable, a written order will be lodged on the garage to have the repairs effected or the parts supplied.
- ~~(iii)~~ (iii) The form of order to be used is that referred to in Standing Orders for the Operation and Maintenance of Mechanical Vehicles 1940 Appendix 10, or alternatively AAF F59. This order will be issued in quadruplicate, one (1) copy (the original) being left with the garage, together with Claim Form TS4, the remaining three (3) copies will be held by the Unit pending completion of repairs, supply of parts, etc.
- (iv) When repairs or supply of spare parts have been completed the CO will ensure by inspection that the repairs, etc have been carried out satisfactorily and will endorse the following certificate in the body of the claim Form TS4.
- "I hereby certify that the abovementioned repairs (and/or supply of spare parts) were necessary and beyond the capability of Unit personnel and have been completed satisfactorily, and that the vehicle concerned Army No..... has been returned to this Unit"
- (v) The claim Form TS4, the original and two copies of order and the garage invoice all properly completed and with vehicle number quoted on each document, are then to be forwarded to the COME for approval. (The fourth copy of order form is filled in the Unit office for reference.

MAJOR REPAIRS.

- (i) When repairs costing more than £3 are required, the CO will cause three (3) quotations to be secured on form referred to in Appendix 9 of Standing Orders for Operation and Maintenance of Mechanical Vehicles, 1940. A Repair Requisition AAF F3 in triplicate with quotations attached will be forwarded to the COME E.C. together with the CO's recommendation as to acceptance.
- (ii) The COME will recommend the most suitable quotation to DADOS who will thereupon place the necessary order for the repairs to be carried out. If an Ordnance MF Inspector is available, inspection of the repaired vehicle will be conducted by him and in his absence, the CO will proceed as in part (a) para (iv) above.
- (iii) The Claim Form TS4, when completed with necessary certificate, will be forwarded to DADOS for payment, with original copy of order attached.
- (iv) Should repairs be urgent, the Unit may contact the COME by 'phone.

In all cases of repairs effected outside Ordnance Workshops, COs shall ensure that the Log Book (War) AAB20 is correctly posted with details of such repairs, including any parts supplied.

11. MAXIMUM PERMISSIBLE SPEEDS IN AUSTRALIA "A" & "B" MASC VEHICLES.

The unmentioned speeds are the maximum speeds at which mechanical vehicles are to be operated in Australia.

The attention of all concerned is directed to the unnecessary wear and accidents which result from excessive speed and careless operation of mechanical vehicles.

It is important that all ranks to be trained to conserve the available mechanical capabilities and mobility of mechanized equipment. Maximum speeds should only be employed on occasions when either in emergency or when it is necessary for the purpose of field training.
