

4. MAIN GUARD & PERSONNEL IN DETENTION - MEALS. (taken from Bde R/o 28 June 41)
As from and including the morning meal on 1 July meals for main guard and prisoners will be drawn by O.C. Guard from 4 Aux H.T. Coy in N Block.
Guards must draw from their units before taking up duty sufficient utensils for the carrying of the prepared food, from the kitchen to guardhouse.

3. DEFENCE FORCES - CONCESSION RATES OF POSTAGE.

It has been reported that a large number of letters posted, presumably by members of the Defence Forces, at various Post Offices, including Military Post Offices, and despatched to Sydney, is taxed daily at Head Office for the following reasons:-

- Postage to the value of 1d affixed but no impression of the official stamp adopted by Defence Authorities indicating that they are entitled to special rates.
- No postage affixed.

In order, to be entitled to the concession of penny postage all letters should be posted in the letter box provided at Coy HQ & letter boxes in the lines.

Letters addressed by relatives and friends of soldiers can still be posted for one penny provided the soldier's rank is shown in the address.

4. EDUCATION SERVICE.

The Commonwealth Government has approved of the provision of educational facilities along the following general lines, to all members of the Commonwealth Military Forces.

(1) Pastimes: These facilities are to be made available to troops attached to Coast Defence Units, Garrison Battalions, Camp Admn Staffs, (Including full time duty details attached to Camps) and Units s, of A.I.F. and A.M.F. at distant stations in and around Australia. Commanding Officers will be allotted 5/- per man per annum for the purchase of materials, tools and equipment, the money to be spent by the C.O. in consultant with his Education Officer. It is to be stressed that men should be given as much freedom as possible in selecting the pastimes and hobbies and other activities they wish to follow, but it must be remembered that the money is not merely for recreational purposes, nor is it for training. Examples of suitable hobbies are gardening and horticulture generally, woodwork leatherwork, drawing, sketching, line cutting, rugmaking, the collection of meteorological information, geological and biological specimens. Drawing boards and paper, pencils, charcoal, etc., music for orchestras and material for scenery for dramatic performances should also be included under this heading.

A sum of money will also be allotted to each Command and Military District to be spent in A.I.F. and A.M.F. Camps. The bases of calculation here has been 1/- per man per annum, and the money might be used for such activities as music for orchestras, material for dramatic purposes and so on.

EDUCATION SERVICE (CONTD).

- (ii) JOURNAL: A weekly journal is to be published and distributed to all Units wherever stationed. This will contain educational and general material, including articles by Australian authorities on, for example, hobbies or cultural subjects, or current events at home and abroad.
- (iii) PAMPHLETS AND BOOKLETS: These will be written by Australians or purchased either in Australia or abroad, and will be free issue. They will cover a wide variety of subjects, from hobbies and educational subjects to matters of general interest.
- (iv) LIBRARIES: Arrangements are being made for library facilities to be available to all troops wherever stationed. The Libraries will not include recreational literature as such, but will cover all subjects from travel, biography and literature generally to technical works of a textbook character. Major camps will probably be served by permanent libraries and outlying stations by a box system.
- (v) CINEMATOGRAPH AND SLIDE PROJECTORS: These are to be made available to project documentary and educational film as well as film and slide on subjects of general interest. The projectors will also be used for lectures, discussions and demonstrations.
- (vi) LECTURES: A panel of lectures is being formed that will contain many names well known to Australians. It is expected that Lectures will be available in all camps and stations on a wide variety of subjects. Indeed, it can safely be assumed that men can secure lectures on almost any subject or type of subject from competent authorities. Some of the subjects already assured are history, geography, economics, international affairs, Government, anthropology, psychology, literature, commercial subjects generally, elementary science, engineering of all kinds, art, music, the drama, social problems and so on.
- (vii) DISCUSSION GROUP MATERIAL: For outlying stations which cannot be visited frequently by lecturers, discussion group material is being prepared for circulation, and men on these stations will also be able to secure copies of lectures delivered elsewhere. Discussion Groups are, however, not exclusively for outlying stations, and the appropriate material will be made available wherever a demand exists.
- (viii) GENERAL: Arrangements will be made, as far as practicable, to permit permit men who, before enlistment had begun courses of study, including correspondence courses, to continue whilst in the Army. Details of this part of the scheme have not been finalised, but it will be possible at least to provide instructors or tutors to visit camps. Plans are also being prepared for vocational instruction of an elementary kind for troops in fixed stations.

4. SECURITY OF INFORMATION IN CORRESPONDENCE.-- Eastern Command Routine Order No. 42/41 (para 8) is repeated.

The practice of including in communications to members of the forces serving overseas, reference to past or pending embarkation of individuals, arrivals and departures of troopships etc., is to cease forthwith.

The majority of letters travel by air, and as misfortune may easily deliver such into the hands of the enemy - even before ships referred to have cleared port - destruction of such vessels, together with personnel, may result from what is tantamount to criminal thoughtlessness.

Military personnel are instructed to impress these vital points upon civilians, relatives and friends in order that it may not become necessary, as the result of examination, to delay or withhold transmission of such communications.

5. DRESS.-- During training periods and exercises the dress will be working dress trousers and jackets. Jerseys will not be worn over the jacket.
6. PREPAREDNESS.-- All sections must bring to finality at an early date all internal matters such as personal records and marking of equipment in conformity with A.I.F. Standing Orders and E.Comd Instructions.
- Punches, steel and stencils are available at the QM store for the marking of equipment.
7. SECURITY.-- A limited number of copies of a pamphlet "Why Help the Enemy" are available for sections for distribution to the troops therein.
- After reading same troops are to pass on to others who have not read the pamphlet and then forward as many home to relatives as possible.
8. COY PARADE.-- A company parade will be held on 26 Jun 41 at 0830 hrs. Section Comdrs will ensure that all ranks are on parade with the exception of cooks.
- Supply Section will commence supply duties after termination of the parade and P.T. instruction will commence immediately after and continue for the usual 30 minutes.

"Officers and soldiers are forbidden to use any method of obtaining redress of real or supposed grievances other than those prescribed by the A.M.R. or authorised by these orders. Anonymous complaints and complaints through the press are forbidden."



The accused pleaded not guilty.
