128 DISTRICT COURT MARTIAL

3 DGI convened by the Commander, 2 Aust. Div. was held at Claremont on 29 Sep. 1942 for the trial of NX48051 L/Sgt. John Patrick Henson, 18 Coy. AUSC, 8 Inf Ede 2 Aust. Div.

The accused was charged with; -

- 1 Disoboying a lawful command in such a mannor as to show wilful definee of authority 149/1 - Conduct to the projudice of good order and military discipline
- 14.40 .
- 3 Disoboying a lawful command AA9/2
- 4 Conduct to the projudice of good order and military discipline
- 5 Resisting on escort 1610/3

The accused pleaded NOT GUILTY to all charges. The Court found the accused not guilty of the second charge but guilty of all other charges.

The court sentenced the accused to 9 months detention.

The finding and sentence were confirmed on 3 Oct. 1942 by Commander 2 .lust. Div. The result of the trial was promulgated to the accused at Dotontion Barracks Fromantic.
