

Available to personnel on local leave, on production of Leave pass, as a temporary depository for kits, equipment, percels etc. whilst on leave. Kits and equipment extered for at LTD (in respect of personnel proceeding on interstate Leave) will NOT be accepted.

(d) All members of the Military Forces are invited to use these faulities, which are provided specially for their benefit, free of charge.

59. MEDICAL - CONTROL OF VINCENT'S ANGINA.

Vincent's Angina is an infectious disease generally carried from person to person on mess utensils, canteen glasses, etc.

There is at present an outbroak of Vincent's Angina in certain areas and it is essential that very strict attention be paid to el Anliness of all eating and drinking utentials.

All mess utenails will be storilised before and after meals by dipping in beiling water, and all glass in cantons ate will be storilised after each use by stemping in Condy's and rinsing in clean water. (wide 2 Div R/O Ser B para 160) 9

AI, DIRECTIONS FOR SENDING LETTERS AND POST CARDS TO AUSTRALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR IN GERMAN OR ITALIAN HANDS. (Prisoners of Wer Covers both members of the Forces, and intermed civilians).

- 1. Any person may send a letter or a plain post card to a prisoner of war, subject to these directions .
- 2. It is inadvisable to attempt to send more than one letter or post card a week.
- 3. Letters must consist of one sheet (only) of notenenar, size recommended not in excess of quarto (10) inches x of inches). Write on both sides. Do not use ai mail paper, which is too thin.
- 4. The address. Half of the front of the post card should be left entirely free of writing. Note that a letter card, picture or faristmas card is NOT a post card, and MITNOT ES SERT.
- 5. Only news of a strictly personal character, typed or clearly written in well spaced writing, may be given in a letter or post card.
- 6. The only permissable enclosure in a letter is an unmounted photograph of a personal nature, small in csize with a minimum of descriptive writing on the back.
- 7. As shown in the following sketch, the mane and address of the nrisoner; and also of the sender must be olearly written at the top of the letter or post eard, and the words "Air Mail" if dirmail transmission is desired.
