179. CONSERVATION OF RUBBER

In view of the urgent necessity of conserving rubber, this Coy's R/O 80/43 is reproduced hereunder for promulgation to all ranks :-

The supply situation in regard to rubber is now so serious as to make it imperative that every ounce of rubber in use by the Army should be conserved to the utmost. The use of vehicles is to be restricted to essential requirements. When vehicles are used the following six points are to be rigidly enforced.

- (i) Don't speed, avoid rapid acceleration, harsh braking and fast cornering.
- (ii) Check pressures daily with gauge to protect side walls and save tread wear.
- (iii) Keep brakes equalized, wheels true and watch for

misalignment.

- (iv) Interchange tyres at prescribed intervals to keep wear even.
- (v) Closely inspect tyres daily, remove any stones and repair minor cuts.
- (vi) Report defects immediately.

GREEN CIVILITES (12 WBOY8)

Green Envelopes are issued for the transmission of letters relating to "private and family" affairs only.

The certificate as to contents, printed on the face of the envelope, must be signed by the writer.

All ranks may use one green envelope per week. A soldier drawing an envelope he does not use cannot give it to someone else. In no case may a soldier use more than one in the course of a week.

The Censorship regulations apply to correspondence in green envelopes in just the same manner as to all other correspondence except that they are handled in sealed and are not franked in units. The Green Envelope must bear the imprint of the Censor Stamp. The Army Postal Service will NOT accept for despatch green envelopes, the certificates of which are signed by the writer, unless same bears the imprint of the Censor's Stamp.

Writers may enclose up to three of their own letters, each in a separate ordinary envelope, in one green envelope. These letters will be properly addressed and stamped (if to be sent by air mail) and will be unsealed. Green envelopes containing more than one letter will be addressed to the "Base Censor".

Green envelopes may be sent by air mail.

Green envelopes cannot be registered and should not be used to transmit money, valuables or photographs.

The ordinary rates of air or surface postage are payable on green envelopes to any destination.

The address will be written in the space provided, and the necessary postage stamps affixed in the right hand top corner.

The issue of green envelopes is a privilege liable to be withdrawn at any time.

Any misuse of green envelopes or infractions of the regulations as to their use will be regarded as serious offenses.

192 SECURITY OF DOCUMENTS IN OPERATIONAL AREAS

The loss to the enemy of documents containing details about our forces, movements and plans is always likely to have disastrous results, for experience on all fronts has shown that captured documents provide one of the most fruitful sources of information to the enemy. For example, some of our marked maps captured by the Japanese in New Guinea, and subsequently recaptured by us, show clearly the good use to which they were put by the enemy.

Every soldier should therefore be aware of the grave danger (to himself and to his comrades) of permitting documents to fall into enemy hands - a danger all the more acute in battle zones, or in any situation which may entail contact with the enemy, or when the possibility of attack by enemy exists.

The following documents which, if lost, will give away valuable info, are mentioned;:-

Operation and movement orders, secret correspondence, reports etc  
Code and cipher books.  
Maps, plans and sketches.  
Certain army books, (e.g. Vehicle Log Book (AAB 20) containing names and movements of units.  
Personal letters, diaries, notebooks, etc. carried by troops.

To guard against the danger of documents falling into enemy hands care will always be taken to:-

- (a) Refrain from carrying into or retaining in battle zones any document other than those indispensable for the commander in hand.
- (b) arrange for the destruction, at a moment's notice, in the event of emergency, of all documents necessarily retained in battle zones.

Before moving to any zone which may entail contact with the enemy:-

- (a) All documents mentioned in (a), except those necessarily retained for operational purposes, will be disposed of for safe keeping.
- (b) All AG posts will make adequate advance arrangements to destroy by the quickest possible means documents in danger of capture by the enemy.
- (c) Personal diaries and notebooks will be withdrawn from troops in accordance with HQ Field Censorship Instruction No. 4 para 8.
- (d) Such parts of other personal papers carried by troops as give the unit designation, will be destroyed or obliterated e.g., addressed envelopes or letters.

196 DISTRICT COURT MARTIAL

A DCM convened by the Comd. 2 Aust Div was held at GERALDTON on 26 Jun 43 for the trial of HQ138435 Dr FRED R. R., 18 Aust Coy A.M.S.C.

The accused was charged with :-

WAS WHEN A SOLDIER ACTING AS A SENTINEL SLEEPING ON HIS POST in that he, in the field on 25 Apr 43 at 0600 hrs when a sentry at entrance to 18 Aust Coy A.M.S.C. Area was asleep.

The accused pleaded NOT GUILTY. The Court found the accused GUILTY with the exception that "25 Apr should be 26 Apr".

The Court sentenced the accused to detention for 28 days.

Automatic consequential forfeitures of pay (not including financial penalties in sentence ); 30 days.

The finding and sentence were confirmed on 3 Jul 43 by Comd 2 Aust Div. The result of the trial was promulgated to the accused at 18 Aust Coy A.M.S.C. on 9 Jul 43.

197 REMISSIONS OF FINES AND FORFEITURES ON DISCHARGE.

It is reported that some personnel believe that fines and forfeitures of pay imposed on members of the Forces are remitted by discharge from the Army and that consequently fines and forfeitures need not be viewed seriously as penalties by members on whom they are imposed.

Such penalties are not remitted on discharge. This fact will be impressed on all ranks.

Although correspondence of that nature may seem innocuous, it will be readily apparent that this practice could constitute a fruitful source of info to an enemy agent.

All personnel are warned that correspondence of this nature will be treated in the same manner as correspondence intended for pen friends.

Airgraph letters will be censored under normal unit censorship arrangements, the following being observed :-

The Franking Officer's signature to appear in the lower left hand corner of the form (above the direction "This space should not be used"). The Coy censor stamp will be affixed in the space between the address panel and the single printed line directly thereunder; it will be placed as far to the left as practicable.

The name and the address of the addressee and of the sender must be clearly inserted on each form used, also the page number must be shown immediately above the written text of each form used.

The name and address of addressee will be written BY HAND in prominent BLOCK LETTERS (as large as possible) and must be wholly within the panel provided for the purpose.

The writing to be plain and - black ink, small writing is unsuitable, the use of pencil is not recommended, but if used it MUST be a "B" pencil. INDELEIBLE pencil will not be used.

The full address of the sender and date of writing must be written at top of the letter portion of the form and at the end of the text the senders FULL NAME in BLOCK letters and his SIGNATURE must be inserted.

Airgraph letter forms are to be handled carefully as creasing and other forms of disfigurement will spoil photographic reproduction.

Airgraph forms are obtainable at Field Post Offices and from Coy Postal Cpl.

209 PRIVATE COMMUNICATIONS CONCERNING CASUALTIES

Private cables and telegrams reporting battle or other casualties are prohibited. In letters, no reference is to be made to any such casualty until after a period of one month from the date of its occurrence.

The prohibition and restriction imposed by para 1 hereof are not applicable to communications sent by a member relative to a casualty sustained by himself.

This order has been dictated by motives of consideration for the feelings of the relatives of members of the Forces, who, in many instances have been caused unnecessary suffering and suspense through info contained in private correspondence from operation areas and which in some cases, has proved to be inaccurate.

210 CAMERAS AND PHOTOGRAPHY

All ranks who have cameras, may in future use them subject to the following :-

Lieut Bernasconi is appointed O i/c Photography, and Officers and Q/Rs are responsible for ensuring that cameras in their possession are registered with the O i/c Photography.

Cameras will be withdrawn, prior to departure from personnel if the Coy is about to proceed to an active theatre of operations. The O i/c may at any time order the withdrawal of cameras for security reasons.

The O i/c Photography, when the order for withdrawal has been given, will collect and forward cameras to :-

- (a) such persons as the possessors of cameras direct, at the expense of the possessors. Package containing cameras will be sent by registered post and registration receipt will be handed to the possessors in each case.
- (b) HQ L of C Area or
- (c) O i/c Base Depot.

The O i/c Photography will give a receipt for all cameras received whether for disposal by (a)(b) or (c).

Notwithstanding the provisions set out above, the CO may, if he thinks fit, approve of the retention of cameras by not more than

four members of the Coy provided they signify their agreement that such retention will be subject to the following terms:-

- (a) That the cameras so retained will be used only as directed by the O i/c Photography.
- (b) That the said cameras remain in the possession of the members concerned and will be at such member's risk.
- (c) That the OC may withdraw such approval at any time.

H. L. of C Areas will be responsible for ensuring that the cameras deposited for custody by a unit proceeding overseas are forwarded on the Unit's behalf to the base depot abroad.

Films of photographs taken by officers and ORs for non-official purposes will be forwarded to an approved photographer for processing. H. L. of C Area will arrange with approved parties that photographs convening the Control of Photography Order not be returned to the sender, but to H. L. of C Areas. Such photographs will be returned to OC Coy for necessary action.

Photographs other than those taken for official purposes, which if captured, would be of value to the enemy, are prohibited.

Contraventions of this order will be dealt with by disciplinary action, and/or by :-

- (a) Withdrawal, temporary or permanent, of cameras.
- (b) Destruction of films and prints.

#### FIELD CENSORSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

It is the duty of all ranks to familiarise themselves with the following excerpts from LHM, Field Censorship Instr No. 4 :-

Newspapers will not be sent through the post by members of AIF.

It is forbidden to write in such a way as to disclose either directly or indirectly any movement or removal of, or projected movement of any body of troops. This applies equally to operational and training areas.

A statement of any enclosures in letters (particularly money) must be shown on the top left hand corner of the first page; parcels and packets shall be left open and a declaration of contents shall be loosely attached to the outside cover and signed by the sender.

The soldier's official address must be shown at the head of every letter -
